Treasurer's Report

It is with pleasure that I present my first treasurer's report covering season 2018.

Again, another successful season in making the Grand Final, not only in the seniors, but also the Development Squad, or Reserves as we have always known it. Albeit not coming home with the prize we all wanted I extend my congratulations to Luke, Dano and all the players and coaching staff on their efforts. To have success in the "merged" U19's side and our senior netball team, as well as fielding our women's team for the first time, it made for a very enjoyable first season for myself (somewhat stressful at times).

This season we started with \$25k cash in the bank and debt free.

The season, although fruitful off the field, was somewhat more of a struggle off the field financially with a \$15k deficit. This has occurred due to an overall 3% drop in turnover combined with a 3% increase in costs. This means after last season's 12.5k surplus saw us produce a \$27k reversal. There are many contributing factors to this result.

There are some sub departments that may seem at odds with previous reports and that is due to my interpretation and where I have placed income and expenditure. It is the overall figures in each revenue and cost categories that need to be looked at.

Football Department: Another increase in player, coach and associated costs of 9% (after a 29.7% increase in 2017 from 2016), however, with the reduced salary cap for 2019, I am hopeful that we will be able to keep this in check for 2019 while still pushing hard for the right player mix to reach the ultimate goal in what will now be Premier Division. Trainers were down a touch but medical spend (strapping etc.) was up 64% on last season and in my figures was uniform/equipment that may have been coded to merchandise in previous reports.

Bar: I would like to thank Billy for his efforts in running the mad house that is the bar. We are working on systems to make both our lives easier. Our (overall) takings were 10% down. Game day take was down and a lot of this is due to the ANZAC day game which was our turn to be away and I feel a tighter control on policing, where people are not drinking as much. Mind you we were coming off a record high season that was 2017! We get the ANZAC game back in 2019 and as a standalone game on Thursday, so this could be a good financial day for the club. Margin was about the same as 2016 but down a little on 2017, this could also be attributable to allocation of costs to other departments which I am just coming to terms with. For 2019 I plan a better system which will allow me to get a better understanding of cost placement in this department. Again, Billy received wonderful support from Kathy Reed who did a great job with game day raffles (income in Social department) and the other tireless helpers in Damo, Vince, JD, Bryan, Steve, Terry, Dave, Phil and many others.

Canteen: The results for the canteen were down about 3%, with margin down about 3%. Again this could be due to cost centre allocations with vouchers etc. that I'm reviewing how I account for all the "bits" of paper strewn at me (it's about me putting in place a system that I can control better). BBQ took a bit of a hit with no U19's (as too did the coffee due to not many early games). This will be rectified next season as we will have a full complement and BBQ will keep Damo flat out. Thursday nights were not much different to last year and actual game day canteen was up. Big thanks to Karen Cali and Karen "Canteen" Coleman and all the helpers for Thursday night and game day canteen, an integral part of our income stream.

Social Functions: Overall social income was about the same as 2017 but in different areas! The 50 year Gala Ball was double last year's Gala Ball, but that was to be expected. Presidents lunches were significantly down but Race Day was up on last year and due to the popularity of the day I expect the same in 2019. Raffle income was included in Social which counteracted "kick for cash" and "dogtoberfest" which were not run this year and bolstered this department. Presentation Night was down (which surprised me) but maybe due to the late date. We might need to get more happening game day to create more revenue or put a different look to the game day scenario.

Memberships: As Peter said last year "another fantastic year for the Kennel club". Excellent effort from Paul McConnell in again achieving a profit of over \$25k (this could be more as I try to pick up on KC income allocation). The success of this group is critical for the club and we all need to support it and push for growth as we are already the "membership" envy of all EFL clubs and need to maintain our number one status! Memberships, in terms of players, were about the same despite having an extra netball team and the wonderful addition of our women's teams, but due to merged Colts we remained the same.

Revenue: It is always said, but truly, we are indebted to our wonderful sponsors – Effective Freight Management, Max Brown Real Estate, Archestral Designs, Vision Corporate Interiors, Waverley Fork Lifts, Think Printing, Jackaroo Timber, Bendigo Bank, and all the other sponsors for their continued and fantastic support. I would like to personally thank them all (and especially Damian Degenhardt for his ongoing support) on behalf of the club, we cannot achieve what we do without you all. We are also indebted to the playing group led by Dano and the leadership group for player sponsorships, although down a little on last year, it is still a significant part of our revenue raising and I look forward to it again being big next year. Big thanks to Dean McKellar for stepping into the role this season and I know you will still have valuable input for 2019 with some great ideas we need "think tank" on!

Merchandise: This area was down on last year (might have to do with how I allocate Sales, i.e. uniforms etc.) but it was coming from such a high base being the Premiership Season (let's win another). Also, new merchandise came in a bit late and that made it difficult to bolster the sales. We will also have more of the new jackets with the limited stock we received selling out very quickly.

Mudlarks: Thanks to 'Tubby', Ian, Peter and John for all their efforts. Again they provide the club with an invaluable income stream that contributes nearly 10% of turnover. Especially thanks to Tubby, the founding father of the Mudlarks, who alas, is stepping down. Tubby, words cannot express the gratitude that the club owes you for what you have grown from an idea. This Coterie Group grows stronger each year and the season luncheon is a must on everyone's calendar. If you have not attended one, then I suggest you do!

NEXT SEASON: A concerted effort is required in 2019 to ensure we do not sustain another deficit. As a committee I know we all plan on working hard to be creative in raising the revenue that it takes to run this "small business" we lovingly call our Football Club.

Thanks to Cathy and everyone on the committee for your help in my first year, it has been interesting to say the least and I do look forward to Season 2019 where will again be a successful "Premier Division" EFL club.

Senior Coach's Report

Driving towards Bayswater Oval on Grand Final morning, it was amazing to see the line of South Croydon supporters marching to the ground. A very special sight. Both Seniors and Reserves (following our U19's and netball GF wins) into the Grand Final shows the quality of not only our playing group, but of our whole club and what a great season we have had.

2018 was successful, yet ultimately disappointing due to the GF result. Whilst we created a lot of history through the year with many 'firsts' in division one, we gave ourselves the opportunity to do the incredible and go back to back, but unfortunately could not get the job done on the last day. To Vermont's credit, they were very good in the first half, but we could have been better. I was extremely proud of the players who showed resilience to outscore Vermont in the 2nd half and not throw in the towel. No doubt the experience of this day will make us more determined to go one better in 2019. Leading into the Finals, we spoke about there being No Excuses. That the outcome we wanted could be ours – it was up to us. We had the players and the game style that could stand up in big games – when the intensity really lifts. We certainly earned our spot in the grand Final, some may say we did it the hard way. If anything, we made it interesting for our supporters.

A theme throughout the year was *'Success doesn't come from what you do occasionally, it comes from what you do consistently'*. We won 16 games and lost 6. 5 of those wins by under 10 points (including the 2 finals wins) and 2 of the 5 losses were by under 10 points. 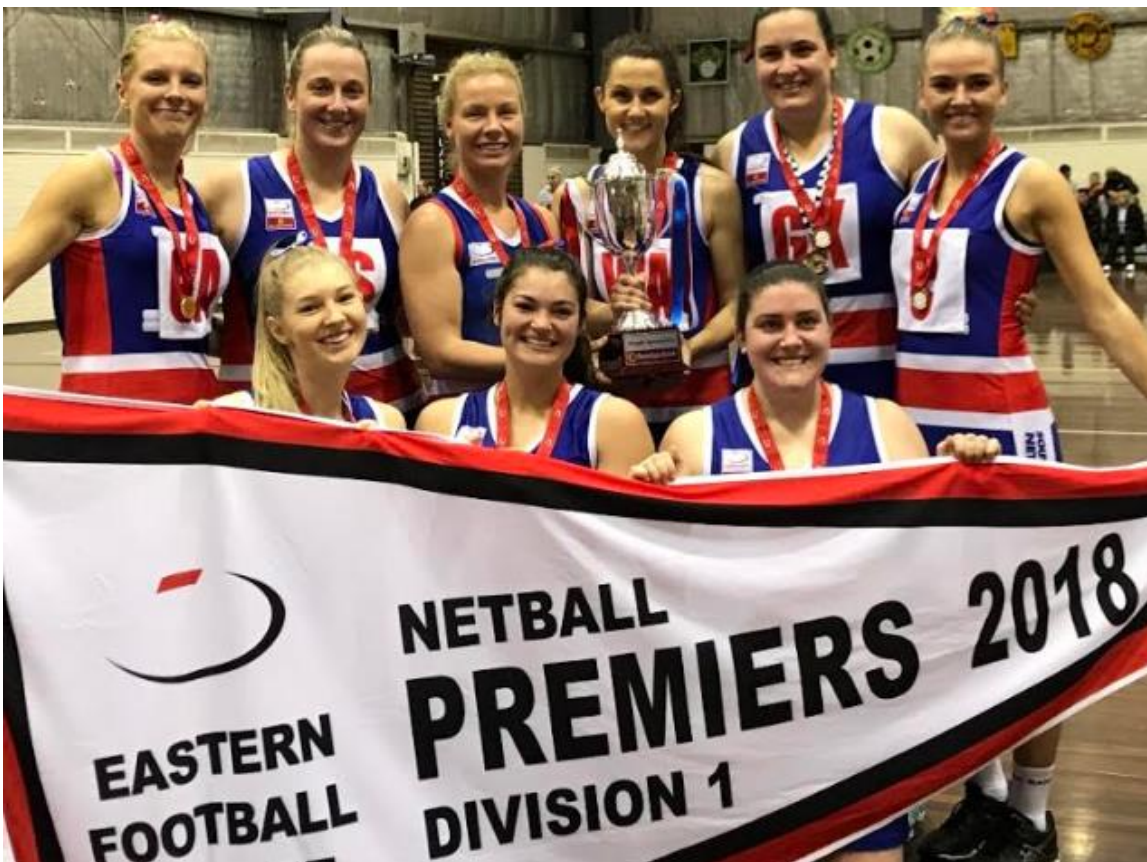
Our South Croydon blue team once again took the court for the 3rd season running, with many of the girls original members from the first ever EFL season.
