Well here we are our first home game and the club has had some massive changes with new people coming on committee and along with some departures we still have the foundation of a strong team running the club.



Going in to quarter time only a couple of goals down and we were pretty happy with our efforts. The second quarter we came out hard, putting the pressure on and showing glimpses of our new game style, which was encouraging.
