## 1. ADMINISTRATION

Tournament HQ will be based upstairs at Traralgon West (Day 1 & 2) and in the secretary's office at Yinnar (Day 2). Each ground will have an AFL Gippsland staff member that will collect your results after the match (team sheets and goal umpire cards must be handed to staff member)

All teams are required to collect their team sheets at the start of the day from your venue representative and are required to submit them after each game with the correct goalkickers and 1-6 best players marked.

Tournament HQ will upload the results online.

## 2. MATCH FORMAT

Day one Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> July and Day two Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2019

U/12	4 x 10 Minute quarters
U/14	4 x 10 Minute quarters
Youth Girls	4 x 12 Minute quarters
U/16	2 x 20 Minute halves
U/18	2 x 20 Minute halves

Breaks of 6 minutes half time and 3 minutes for quarters respectively, no time on.

### Awards and Trophies:

#### Best Player of the Carnival:

Umpires will give 3-2-1 votes of each game. The player who collects the most votes on the day will be presented with the Best Player of the Carnival for the **respective age group**.

#### Carnival Champions:

The league that is deemed the champion league for each age group will be presented with the Gumbuya World Cup and the players & coach will receive a medallion.

## 3. GRAND FINALS MATCH TIMING

Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2019 at Traralgon Recreation Reserve

The two top teams in each age group & Youth Girls play off in the GRAND FINALS.

Youth Girls	4 x 15-minute quarters
U/12	4 x 12 minute quarters
U/14	4 x 15-minute quarters

Breaks of 5, 7 and 5 minutes respectively, no time on

In the event of a draw at full time, a one-minute break then 2 x 5-minute halves

Immediate change over between halves, no breaks. If the scores are tied after that period teams will remain at the current ends and play golden point. The ball will be taken back to the centre and bounced after the siren.

Presentation of Medals to the winning teams and best on ground Medal will be made after each game. Best & Fairest presentations to each player in each age group over the Carnival's Round Robin will be made after each grand final age group. Umpire's will place votes in each game and the Code of Conduct votes will be awarded after each game.

## 4. GUIDELINES

In the event of a serious injury, injured players will be given appropriate treatment on the ground, and not stretchered off whilst ambulance is called. If there is a qualified first aid /or trainer in attendance, then the player may be moved if it is safe to do so.

Necessary time can be added to the end of each game if required.

## 5. RULES

### AFL COUNTRY VIC

Standard rules apply including

- U12's not allowed to kick off the ground.
- U12's allowed a maximum of 2 bounces
- Centre square rule does apply
- No sling tackles
- Play on rule applies from a point
- U-12 footballs will be all weather condition type dimple ball size No 4
- U-14 footballs will be full size leather ball
- Youth Girls will be Size 4 all-weather condition type dimple ball.
- U-12 to U 14& Youth Girls Wearing of helmets is permitted

- Rules and regulations will be the same as in the modified match rules they play in their H/A games. The only alteration is that they will play the same as the male players of 18 on the field and 6 on the interchange with a squad of 26 players
- Density rule will apply to all U-14 games. Document to be sent by Adrian Bromage explaining this.

### **PLAYER / SUPPORTER and COACH CODE OF CONDUCT APPLY.**

#### **6. REPORTED PLAYERS**

Players reported during the championships shall have their case adjudicated by individual delegates. Set penalties and reprimands as stated in rule 12.0 AFL Vic country hand book will apply to this Carnival. If a player is reported in his last game and subsequently found guilty, the offence and penalty shall be referred to his own league.

#### **7. SQUADS – Under 16s and Under 18s**

Teams to consist of 24 players, no more than 18 players can be on the ground at any one time. Prior to the commencement of each game, both sides will line up to shake hands with the umpires and opposition team as a show of goodwill and sportsmanship.

A player must be Under 16 and Under 18 as of the 1<sup>st</sup> of January 2019 to be eligible to play in the relevant age group at the carnival. If a player has played more than 3 games with Gippsland Power, he will be ineligible.

#### **8. SQUADS – Under 12s,14s and YG**

- Each team to consist of a maximum of 24 players per team with a squad of 26 permitted in the case that an injured player may have to be replaced. This also applies to the Youth Girls teams. Games shall be played with a maximum team list of 24 Participants (18 on the field 6 on the interchange).
- All listed players must participate in at least 3 games U/12's & U/14's. Youth Girls games must play 1 game to be eligible to play the Grand Finals.
- If a player has replaced an injured player during the carnival that replacement player will be eligible to play in the grand finals even though he/she may not have played 3 or 1 games during the carnival.
- It is the Leagues responsibility to place the players on a permit to the AFL Vic Country Rep side.
- No 2 local interchange type permit is to be used for the duration of the Carnival. (It would be better to place all 26 players on the team sheet if you have them in your squad and cross out the 2 that do not play)
- Then the players will be transferred to a team sheet which the leagues will copy four copies for each game. 1 copy to the Umpires, 1 copy to the Carnival Secretary, 1 copy for your own records and 1 copy as a spare. Best players and goal kickers will need to be entered on the team sheet before it is given to the Carnival Secretary.

#### **9. PLAYER ELIGIBILITY – Under 12s,14s and YG**

- Players must be under the age of 12 and 14 as of January 1, 2019 to participate in relevant age groups. Players who can play in the U-10 Grade are not eligible to play U-12's.
- Youth Girls age range 12 to 17 years old as at 1<sup>st</sup> Jan 2019.
- All players must be registered with the Association or League that they represent.
- The rule does not apply to any player who is eligible to play U/14's in the carnival. Those players will be eligible to play in the carnival no matter how many times they have been permitted to play Gippsland League U/16's
- Omeo & DFL will field U-14's and U-12's with Bairnsdale in this carnival.

#### 10. **GATES – Under 12s,14s and YG at Traralgon Rec Reserve**

- The Grand Final will be a gated event, all other matches will be free to attend
- Entry fee will be \$5 per adult
- All gate proceeds go to covering the expenses of the carnival.

#### **GATES – Under 16s and 18s at Yinnar**

- Entry fee will be \$5 per adult
- All gate proceeds go to covering the expenses of the carnival.

#### 11. **CATERING**

The event will try and arrange a canteen at each ground for the players and general public. Any other arrangements are to be made by teams direct with suppliers.

#### 12. **UMPIRES – Under 12s,14s and YG**

Sale Umpires Association to co-ordinate umpires for the carnival as follows

- Field and boundary umpires for round robin matches (day 1 and day 2)
- Fields, boundary and goal umpires for finals
- Leagues to arrange goal umpires for round robin
- Leagues to supply own goal flags

#### **Under 16s & 18s**

- SUA, LVUA, GUA & SGUA umpires to be used. Event will attempt to field a full compliment however Leagues please have goal umpires on standby should they be required.

ORDER OFF RULE – indicated by the Umpire throughout the game to the player and Officials by displaying a **red or yellow** card. A penalty report will be completed by the Umpire for attracting a RED CARD. The player will have the right to appeal to the tribunal.

**YELLOW CARD** – A player ordered off will remain off the ground for 15 minutes of the game. This player cannot be replaced

Following two Order Offs the player will receive a **whole of Carnival** suspension

**RED CARD**- player is off the ground for whole of game. The player may be replaced after 20 minutes (Not the same player) This player will also be reported.

Vote & Code of Conduct and Team sheets (Both League Teams) will be handed to the Umpires prior to each game start. These forms will be in your League pack and the first named team is responsible for this and the pickup of sheets after the game. Umpires will place the sheets into an envelope that will also be supplied.

#### 13. **TIME KEEPERS**

Leagues to supply timekeepers for all round robin games and finals. Leagues will have to check with the ground officials of location of time box and siren. All cards will be supplied.

#### 14. **TRAINERS**

Leagues to provide their own trainers and ice. Leagues will be responsible for their own first aid and bringing first aid kits.

#### 15. **COACHES**

Must be level one qualified. Coaches and trainers and officials to have Working with Children Certificate. Coaches and staff must operate from the coach's box provided at each ground.
