Round 1 has come and gone and the season started off with a bang. Upsets, quality football and new hope was the theme with Wonthaggi and Drouin among the winners. The Hawks hosted Traralgon to kick off season 2019. Both sides had a number of new faces on the park and after a tight first half, Drouin managed a three goal to one third term which proved to be the difference in the end. Joe Collins was named best while Rhys Salter kicked three goals for the Hawks. Defenders Jackson Hall and Bailey Camron were the best for the Maroons while Dylan Loprese kicked three goals.

After winning just two games in 2018 the Power started their season off the best way possible with a 39 point win over Warragul. A host of new names featured in the Power side with recruits Mitch Betson and Mitch Hayes among the goals. The Power featured a number of new players returning to football and were impressive in their first match for 2019. 2018 best and fairest Aiden Lindsay started where he left of last year with a best on field performance. For the Gull's coach Ben Hughes kicked three goals in a losing side.

In the TRFM Match of the round the undermanned Parrots got off to a fast start against Maffra. Leongatha scoring three early goals while the Eagles went goal-less in the first term. Maffra answered early in the second term with three quick goals to start the quarter. The Parrots answered with two late goals to maintain their lead at the main break. Despite a three goal to one last term in favour of Maffra, Leongatha

would not relinquish the lead to run out 12 point winners. James Lloyd kicked three for Leongatha while Cade Maskell and Josh Hopkins dominated with three goals and over 50 disposals between them. For the Eagles Kade Renooy was named best while Jack Johnstone kicked two.
