

ROUND 4 PREVIEW



Sale and Traralgon kick-off round 4 with both sides coming in after losses. The fixture will take place for the Peter Hug Memorial Cup which is played for by Sale and Traralgon after 20 years ago Sale's Peter Hug passed away during a match between the two sides.

Sale come into the match with two wins and a sole loss against premiership fancy Maffra from their Good Friday match. The Magpies will be looking to bounce back and prove that they are one of the contenders in 2019. Kane Martin and Jordy Dessent were missing against Maffra which didn't help the side through the midfield the side needs to continue to find away to goal against the top sides. Tom Hams has been on fire early for the Magpies and his form has seen him move into the Interleague squad. The Maroons have had a tough start to the year with their first two matches being on the road due to ground works and then running into Moe in top form in round 3. It is unfamiliar territory for Traralgon to be winless after the first month of

football so a win this week would help get their season back on track. After their 3 point loss to Traralgon the Maroons put the score on the board early last week but couldn't contain Moe in the final term as they went scoreless going down by 7 points. Tight defeats still don't get four points on the board and they sit ninth on the table. Jackson Hall has been solid down back with 28 disposals and 8 marks against Moe going at 78% efficiency. Dylan Loprese has provided a target up forward but needs help. Loprese took our contested marks last week and leads the Maroons goalkicking with 8 sitting third in the League.

Sale will go in as favourites but the Maroons are every chance to cause an upset. The Lipman v Dunn battle in the ruck will be crucial with both sides strengths through the midfield. If Brad Dessent and co can fire up forward the Magpies will be hard to beat.

The AGA Gippsland League TV match of the week will take place at Ted Summerton Reserve with Moe hosting Wonthaggi. The Lions are sitting on top of the table and with a percentage of 200 they have both the most points for and the least points against so far in 2019. The Power are sitting fourth on the table and are one of the most improved sides so far. The Power have had a reasonable record at Moe over the past few years however they haven't beaten the Lions since 2016. The Power have some big bodies and will rely on winning the ball around the contest and their key forwards hitting the scoreboard. The Lions will be tough to beat at home and their recruits are proving great investments so far. Bernie Vince finished last week with 34 disposals including 19 contested possessions and 10 clearances. Fellow recruit Jordan Ceppi also finished with 24 touches last week and 7 clearances against the Maroons. While up forward Ash Dugan has been back to form after his injury riddled 2018. The Lions will be tough to keep to a beatable score especially at Ted Summerton Reserve. The Power will need to put some goals on the board early to beat the impressive Lions outfit.

The Parrots were surprise losers last week against the Power but are still looking like one of the sides to beat in 2019. It looks like an uphill battle for the bottom of the table Warragul. The Gulls had 52 inside 50s against Drouin but only returned 8 goals for all their efforts. They need to find a second target to Ben Hughes especially with the likes of Verboon and Westaway patrolling defence for Leongatha. Leongatha have won their last 11 matches against the Gulls including a 103 point victory on Warragul's last trip to the Avery. Kim Drew has been a shining light for Warragul and managed 33 disposals last week against Drouin including 11 clearances and 6 inside 50. It would be the surprise of the season if the Gulls managed to record their first win against the reigning premiers.

Maffra showed in Round 3 that they will again be one of the teams to beat disposing of the previously unbeaten Magpies by 74 points in the Battle of the Birds. Morwell have been one of the surprises in 2019 with a young inexperienced side they have managed to put in competitive performances and sit with 1 win and 2 losses after three rounds. The Eagles have won the last 7 clashes against Morwell and the Tigers have found it tough to score against the Eagles elite defence. Sam Fleming was in top form against Bairnsdale in Round 2 with 28 disposals, Ed Carr and Jack Johnstone have been crucial for the Eagles so far in 2019 and Hudson Holmes has taken his game to the next level. Isaac Abas has been solid for Morwell and Kuiy Jiath has become a consistent performer through the midfield. The Eagles should get the points but Morwell have the ability to pressure the ball and could cause an upset on their day although they will be long odds coming into round 4.

The final match of the round pits Drouin against Bairnsdale. The Red Legs are coming off their first win of the year but face one of the biggest trips in the League. Results have been split at Drouin over the past five seasons with each side having two wins and the draw from last season. The 2018 draw was the lowest aggregate score in a game between the two sides with just 90 points scored on the day. The Red Legs through Brayden McCarrey and Ethan East have been able to kick goals this season where the Hawks have struggled in this area with only Warragul scoring less points in 2019. Drouin had only 38 inside 50s last week but returned 20 scoring shots. Bailey Beck has become one of the young stars of the competition and finds himself included into the Interleague squad after his 30 disposals and 9 marks against Warragul. Ed Morris also returned 29 disposals and 9 tackles and would be high on the Hawks best and fairest leader board so far. This is a 50/50 match with Drouin probably going in as the favourites just due to the home ground advantage but it could go either way.

Two weeks of football action over 10 days spanning from Good Friday to the following Sunday made up round three with the split round taking place over Easter and the ANZAC day weekend in perhaps one of the longest rounds of football we have seen in the league. On Good Friday there were two marquee matches with Wonthaggi defeating the top of the table Leongatha and Maffra knocking off Sale at home.

The Power produced their best performance of the season finishing with three final quarter goals to get the 14 point win over the previously undefeated Leongatha side. Despite being at home the Power went in as underdogs but came out sitting fourths on the ladder. For Wonthaggi Mitch Hayes racked up the disposals through the middle and Toma Huther provided the best avenue to goals kicking three. Dunne kicked three for Leongatha with Chris Verboon named best.

In the other Good Friday game the Eagles showed that they will again be one of the teams to beat disposing of rivals Sale by 74 points. Maffra welcomed back John Butcher for the match, returning to the Eagles after many years of AFL and SANFL football. Mitch Bennett was back on target up forward kicking three with James Read being named best. The Eagles top talent were all back in form with Johnstone, Danny Butcher, Fleming and Eddie Carr among the best. For the Magpies they only kicked two goals after quarter time finishing with four for the game.

Bairnsdale and Morwell kicked off week two with the Red Leg's chasing their first win for the season. They started on fire kicking six goals to Morwell's one in the first term. The young tigers bounced back in the second term kicking five goals to two. The final term was a struggle for both sides with the experience of the Red Leg's getting them over the line by 32 points. Brayden

McCarrey kicked another three from his limited opportunities with Shaun Wyatt also kicking three. Kuivi Jiath was named best for the Tigers continuing on his great season. Bairnsdale now sit at one win and two losses with their percentage over 100.

On Saturday night the Lions featured in a night match away to Traralgon. Moe went into the game undefeated however leading goalkicker Spencer White would miss with injury. The Maroons were still looking for their first win in 2019 and after slotting five first quarter goals to Moe's one signs were looking up. Traralgon managed to head into the final change with an 18-point lead but it was the Bernie Vince led Lions that finished the strongest kicking four final term goals while keeping Traralgon scoreless. Ash Dugan and James Blaser both kicked two for Moe while Vince with 34 disposals including 10 clearances was named best.

In the final match of the round, the western derby took place on Sunday where the Gulls and Hawks met in an important clash for both sides. Warragul at home for the second match in a row started slowly and it proved the difference. Drouin started with four first quarter goals to none taking a 25-point lead into the first break. Warragul would fight back in the third quarter with four goals they couldn't bridge the gap at the final siren with the Hawks finishing 10.10-70 to 8-9.57 to record their second win for the season. Tom Barr finished with 24 disposals with 7 inside 50s and Bailey Beck with 30 disposals and 9 marks were the two best for Drouin while Kim Drew has 33 disposals and 11 clearances and Sam Whibley continued his good season for Warragul with 15 disposals and 29 hitouts being named best while coach Ben Hughes was the only multiple goal-scorer with two.

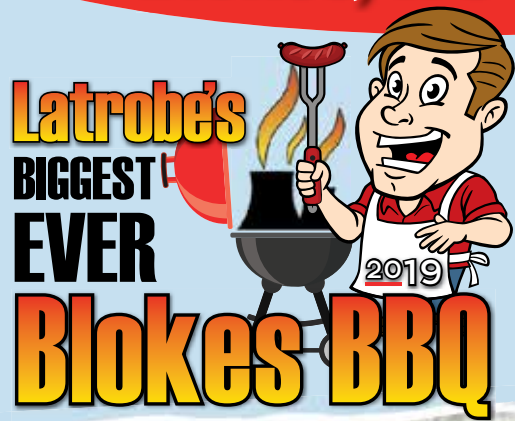

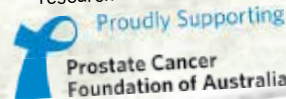

IN MEMORY OF PETER HUG 1975-1999

The memory of the tragic accident at Traralgon on May 1st 1999 when Sale lost 23-year-old Peter Hug will remain vivid in the minds of all those who were there for the rest of their lives. It was only Peter's third senior game. The game was the usual high standard Traralgon/Sale clash – good football, hard and fast, but played in true spirit. The Maroons were leading by 23 points at the 15 minute mark of the third quarter when a clash of bodies took place. Peter Hug fell to the ground and was immediately in the hands of the trainers and ambulance staff. The match was stopped and players were in shock as they walked from the field. In the change room players were breaking down everywhere. The Sale players huddled together in the change room praying for the best and Traralgon coach Tony Lane asked his players to do the same. Then came the news that nobody wanted to hear. Officials and players from both clubs were counselled on Saturday night, and then on Sunday the Traralgon players and league officials visited Sale to have lunch with the Sale players and officials. Ernie Hug - Peter's brother, spoke to a large gathering about the wonderful support the Hug family were getting from all involved and who knew Peter. A bond then developed between the clubs and players who were part of that tragic match at Traralgon. Current Sale coach Shane Fyfe began his career with Sale in the same season. On the first anniversary of this death,



head trainers Stu Thomas (Sale) and Johnny Coolen (Traralgon) headed a group of trainers to pay their respects to Peter on the spot where he lost his life on the Traralgon ground.

Like many other Sale players, Peter played his early football at Sale Catholic College, then at age 17 he played in Sale's 1993 Thirds premiership team under coach Bill Lynch. From there he left the club until 1999 when he returned to play at Sale with brother Ernie, a career which tragically was to be short lived. In 2000, Sale Football Club put the Magpies number 3 guernsey in recess until 2009 – 10 years after Peter's death. As a mark of respect, a Peter Hug Memorial Trophy is now contested in all games between Sale and Traralgon senior teams.
