

# ROUND 4 PREVIEW



It is an exciting time for the League with upsets and competitive matches across the board. After a few seasons where the results have been predictable around the grounds it now seems that all matches are up for grabs.

Moe go into round five undefeated but face perhaps their toughest challenge of the season away to Bairnsdale. The Red Legs are playing their second home game of the season and will be eager to chalk up win number two. The matches between these two sides over the past few seasons have been in Moe's favour with the Lions winning the last 5 games against the Red Legs. Bairnsdale have had a reasonable record at home winning 3 of the last 5. The Lions will go in as slight favourites but anything could happen on the road. Bernie Vince has been in exceptional form for the Lions over the first four rounds and if he plays will be vital to Lions chances. James Blaser, Joran Ceppi and Jacob Wood provide and exceptional midfield even without Vince and combined with Dylan Farrells dominance in the ruck they have been winning the majority

of clearances so far in 2019. For the Red Leg's Russell Cowan was back in form last week while Brayden McCarrey leads the League goalkicking with 17 goals in his first four matches.

Sale and Drouin occupy second and third place respectively on the table. The Hawks have been getting the wins on the board early in 2019 and sit with three wins after defeating Traralgon, Warragul and Bairnsdale. A big loss to Moe has put a dent in the Hawks percentage which sits at 86% despite their three wins. Sale have dominated the Hawks over the past five seasons winning nine of the ten matches with Drouin's only win coming in 2016 at Sale. The match will be won and lost in the midfield with McCallum and Lipman a crucial battle in the ruck with Dessent, Martin, Hams and Dowse facing off against the Beck brothers, Tom Barr and Eddie Morris. The Magpies will have pencilled this in as a must win at the start of 2019 but after Drouin's start to the season both sides will come in believing they can win. Tom Hams sits on top of the MVP leader board after polling in three of his first four

outings. Barring the Maffra match the Magpies haven't had a consistent avenue to goal this year rather have shared the load through multiple avenues to goal. This holds them in good stead moving forward with defences unable just to lock down on the likes of Brad Dessent and John Gooch. Or Drouin Bailey Beck's early season form has been outstanding and has seen him enter the Interleague squad. The Magpies are the favourites and should get the job done but in a season full of surprises do not count out Drouin.

Warragul head to Maffra after their first win of 2019. The Gulls haven't had much success in East Gippsland but have had a good record against Maffra at home in the past few seasons. Despite the win Warragul still sit second last on the table and have their problems with depth and experience. Losing top end talent over the past few seasons through the midfield leaves the Gulls vulnerable against the Eagles star midfield. Warragul won the last meeting of the two sides but there has been several playing personnel changes since then for both teams. John Butcher kicked three goals in his second match for the Eagles. The Gulls have Nick Stevenson down back who is most likely to get the important job. Sam Whibley has been in good form in the ruck and his battle with Keiran Jones will be vital to the outcome of the match. For Warragul the avenue to goal will be important with Maffra having plenty of options to line-up on Ben Hughes it is important that the Gulls small forwards hit the scoreboard. As we said last week the Eagles will go in as hot favourites but after last week you have to give the Gulls a small chance.

Few would have expected before the season that the round 5 Morwell and Leongatha clash would be the match of the round. Leongatha's back to back defeats against Wonthaggi and Warragul have put the Parrots in unfamiliar territory at two wins and two losses. Morwell also sit with two wins and two losses on the season after wins over Wonthaggi and Maffra. The Tigers have been impressive in their matches with a predominately young in experienced side they have been competitive in both of their losses to go with the

wins. Leongatha have won their last 8 matches against Morwell including a 123 point victory in 2018 keeping Morwell to only 1 goal. Leongatha will be hoping to get their top talent back to full fitness and form soon to arrest this losing streak. Morwell will be looking to replicate what they did last week and keep the Leongatha side under pressure all match long. Anthony Rosato and Kuiji Jath have been stars over the first few rounds for the Tigers. Along with Isaac Abas in the ruck the Tigers mids have been performing so far in 2019. For the Parrots Verboon has been a star down back with Josh Hopkins in career best form. Chris Dunne is still kicking goals but will be hoping for more chances this week. This game has turned into a hard match to predict. On form you would say the Tigers are probably slight favourites but depending on Thursday night selections the tables could turn for the Parrots.

Many thought that Traralgon would but contenders in 2019 after finishing 2018 in the Preliminary Final and falling agonisingly short of beating Maffra in that match. The Maroons sit at zero wins and four losses after the first four rounds of 2019 and are on the bottom of the ladder for only the twelfth time in the League's history. Wonthaggi in contrast have had a solid start to the season despite posting just the two wins. The Power weren't at their best in both losses on the road and will be looking to amend this against Traralgon this weekend. The game is a must win for the Maroons and history at Traralgon is on their side with the Power going winless there in the past 5 seasons. The honours between the two sides were split in 2018 and the Power have greatly improved since then. Jordan Staley looks to be hitting his straps for the Power and Troy Harley and Mitch Betson combined for 9 contested marks last week against Moe. For the Maroons it has been a tale of turnovers in the past few games where they have played well in patches, but poor ball use overall has been an issue. Dylan Loprese has been good up forward and Lee Stockdale has been getting his hands on the footy. They need more out of their entire 22 if they are going to record their first win of 2019.

To say there was a few surprise results in round four would be an understatement with two of the upsets of the season occurring last week. Warragul went into round 4 at the bottom of the ladders, winless in 2019. After suffering a 100+ point defeat against Leongatha at the Avery last year their form line and all signs pointed to a Leongatha win. The two sides went neck and neck in the first half with Warragul going in holding a two not lead at the main change. Four third quarter goals to the Gulls saw them take a 17-point lead into the final change. The Parrots would finish the strongest with nine scoring shots to three in the final term, but inaccuracy cost the Parrots falling short by 1 point. Warragul claiming a famous one-point win against the reigning premiers 11.7-73 to 10.12-72. Matt Ross kicked five goals for the Gulls and was named best. Sam Whibley was again in the best for Warragul continuing his rich vein of form. Chris Verboon was best for the Parrots and now moves to the top of the MVP leader board with his two votes for the match. Josh Hopkins kicked three also for the Parrots. The Gulls move off the bottom of the ladder with their first win of 2019.

The other surprise of the round was Morwell defeating premierships fancies Maffra in a low scoring affair. The Eagles had won the last seven clashes against the tigers and went in heavy favourites. After a three goal to none first quarter all things pointed to the Eagles having a productive afternoon. Morwell had only kicked two goals up until three quarter time and went in 23 points down. The last quarter turned into something out of the blue with Maffra going scoreless while Morwell piled on four goals with Kuivi Jathi managing to rove a hit out from Isaac Abas and run through into goals to kick the match winner. Alarmingly for the Eagles they had a close to full strength side on the park and a lot of their top players were among their best. Before the match John Butcher presented a matchup nightmare for the Tigers after losing key defenders Ryan Hearn & Taylor Weatherall and managed to kick three on the day. Daniel Siddle and Daniel Musil were both among the Tigers best playing key roles in a defence that kept the Eagles scoreless in a quarter for the first time since 2003.

In our TRFM match of the round Sale managed to continue their good start to 2019 and pour more pain onto Traralgon with a comprehensive 50-point win. Jordan Dessent and Kane Martin were back for the Magpies and made a huge difference to the midfield with Martin finishing with 18 kicks and 7 handballs including 7 inside 50s while Dessent finished with 23 disposals including 14 contested possessions. Jack Lipman finished the day with 53 hit outs and 19 disposals while MVP leader Tom Hams had 19 disposals and went at 79% efficiency being named

second best for Sale. The game was set up by the Magpies in the second term with six unanswered goals. For the Maroons turnovers were an issue; Connor Ambler was the leading possession getter with 27 disposals but went at less than 40%, Mark Collison and Lee Stockdale both finished with 25 & 24 disposals respectively but went at under 50% by hand and foot. The loss leaves Traralgon on the bottom of the TRFM Gippsland League ladder or only the 12th time in the club's history and the first time since round 1 in 2012. The Maroons have only occupied the last spot on the ladder at the end of a round in five separate seasons since the LVFL league started in 1954. In contrast Sale now sit with three wins imbedded in the top 5.

The AGA match of the week was Moe hosing Wonthaggi at Ted Summerton Reserve. The Lions came into the match on top of the table and that form would continue. The final margin was only 27 points, but it doesn't tell the tale of the Lions dominance. The Power started well and took a lead into quarter time. Finishing with three goals straight to Moe's six behinds at the first change. Moe finished with 359 disposals for the game 60 ahead of the Power. The Lions had 64 inside 50's to the Powers 33 with Dylan Farrell dominating in the ruck having 37 of Moe's 52 hit outs doubling Wonthaggi's tally of 24 which led the Lions finishing plus 12 in the clearances. James Blaser was back to form with 22 kicks and 9 clearances. Bernie Vince finished with 17 kicks and 25 disposals while Tom Long finished with 19 kicks and 7 marks. Farrell continued his great season with 37 hit outs, 2 contested marks and 15 disposals at 93% efficiency. The Power only had two players above 20 disposals with Mitch Hayes finishing on 20 and Jordan Staley having 23 disposal & 10 marks in defence. Mitch Betson provided a good target taking 5 contested marks out of his 9 grabs finishing with 17 disposals and 2 goals. Troy Harley was named the Power's best taking 6 contested marks with 2 goals.

In the final match of the round Drouin claimed their third win of the season over Bairnsdale. After the 2018 draw the teams again played out a tight one with the margin getting to 8 points in the final term before Bailey Beck kicked two goals in 8 minutes to seal the win. Brayden McCarrey's fifth goal for the day reduced the final margin to 9 points in the Hawks favour. McCarrey leads the J.G. Lawless award with 17 goals in his first our games. James Ferguson was named best for the Hawks with Bob McCallum, To Barr and Bailey Beck among the best for the winners. Drouin sit in third place on the ladder after the first four rounds a game clear on Maffra, Leongatha, Morwell and Wonthaggi.

## NETBALL REPORT



Three teams sit clear on top of the TRFM Gippsland League A Grade ladder after four rounds of the season. Morwell lead the pack with a superior percentage after their win over Maffra in round four. It was the Tigers toughest match of the season with the young Eagles side keeping within reach for most of the game. The lead grew marginally at every change with Morwell maintaining top spot on the table with a 37 to 28 goal win. Daisy Hill shot 22 for Morwell with Claire Allison making the other 15. Courtney Garth continued her great season and was named best on court. Garth's performance has also seen her move to the top of the list in the Gippsland Cosmetic Laser Clinic MVP race. Or Maffra Abbey Pleydell did the bulk of the scoring with 14 while Montana Holmes was again the Eagles best.

Warragul maintained their hold on second place with a narrow two goal victory over Leongatha. 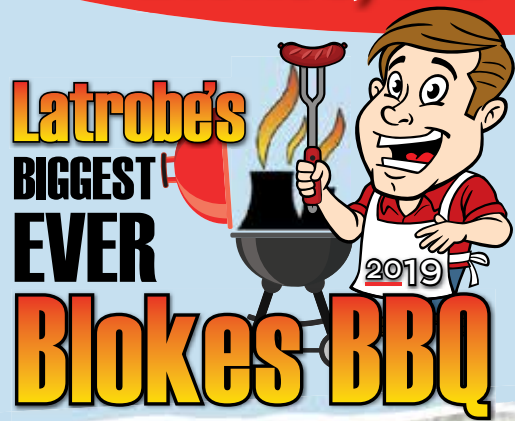

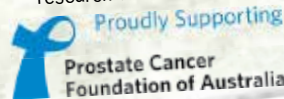
