Sale march over the hill to the Avery on top of the table and with a good run of form. They have matches against Wonthaggi and Morwell coming up which means a victory here could se them sit on top of the table at the halfway point of the season. Leongatha's form has been patchy to say the least for their lofty standards. The playing personnel they have are a very different mix to the 2017 & 2018 premiership sides and this is showing in the results. They have got the job done on the road in the past two matches and will enjoy being back at home for this big clash. The Parrots have dominated Sale over the past four seasons but this is a very different match. Chris Verboon and Sean Westaway will need to be at their best with Brad Dessent hitting form in the past few weeks. Brother Jordan has been vital around the ball and the midfielder is fast turning himself into the most vital player in the competition. The Magpies won without K-Mart last week and if he is back it will only add more depth to a strong midfield. Sale would go in as slight favourites however you would expect Leongatha still to be able to get the job done at home.

Maffra are chomping at the heels of Sale in second place and still with the best percentage in the League. Since their dominate performance over the Magpies the Eagles have been ticking of the wins but not blowing out the opposition. It is hard to believe that the Eagles have won the last 15 matches against the Lions in what would be one of the biggest winning streaks in the competition. The Lions have pushed the Eagles over the past few season with most games being up for grabs in the second half. The Lions have suffered back to back defeats without Bernie Vince and would dearly love his services against all of the Maffra ex VFL talent. The Eagles will like their chances

in this match at home and on form. If other results go their way they could be back on top of the table come Saturday night.

The first instalment of the distance derby is on for 2019. It actually promises to be one of the matches of the round with Wonthaggi being a tough unit to beat at home and the Red Legs coming of two big wins that has put them back in the five. The Power probably go in as favourites and if their tall timber can mark the football it could be a tough ask for the Red Legs. Bairnsdale were ultra impressive at Wonthaggi last year but they will come up against a different Power outfit this time around. Keenan Hynes and Kieran Vickery have been vital to Bairnsdale over the past few weeks and will hope that these two can get enough of the ball forward to kick a winning total.

The final game of the round has plenty to play for with Morwell taking on Drouin. The Hawks will be desperate to get the win and continue their great season and despite playing away from home they would fancy their chances. Moe and Sale faced off in the top of the table clash to head round 6. The Lions went into the match fresh of their first defeat for the season while in contrast Sale have come off victories against Drouin and Traralgon. The Lions were back at home after the long trip to Bairnsdale and came out the better of the two sides piling on the goals in the first term while limiting Sale to just the one scoring shot. Sale fought back in the second term to go in only eight points down at the half after trailing by 20 at quarter time. The half time break did no favours for the home side with the Magpies dominating the last half with nine goals to the Lions three setting up the 30 point win.

The stats that stood out were the Magpies efficiency from their forward 50 entries exposing the Moe backline. The Magpies went inside 46 times to the Lions 39 with Sale taking fifteen

inside 50 marks kicking 50 points from their marks inside 50. In contrast the Lions only returned 21 points with only 8 marks inside 50. Sale's stars stood out with Interleague captain Jordy Dessent best on ground with 28 disposals including 13 contested. His strength and clean hands around the clearances are vital to the Magpies gameplay. Shane Fyfe was in vintage form down back with 25 kicks and 10 handballs. Brad Dessent kicked five goals from his 11 marks including seven contested grabs. James Blaser led the stats for Moe with 28 disposals six tackles, nine inside 50s and five clearances. Mitch Stanlake had 28 disposals down back while Jordan Ceppi finished with 24 disposals. Dylan Farrell pushed Jack Lipman in the ruck recording 32 hit-outs and collecting 21 disposals around the ground at 80% efficiency.

Inaccuracy in front of goals nearly cost the Red Legs the match finishing with two goals and ten behinds in their last quarter comeback. Bairnsdale took a three goal lead into half time and looked like they would run away with the match at home but five spirited third quarter goals to the Maroons saw the whole match shift. The Red Legs were kept goal less in the third and despite only scoring two goals in the last half it was enough to come away with a win that now puts

them at .500 for the season with three wins and three losses.


