# ROUND 7 PREVIEW

A massive week of matches greets TRFM Gippsland League players and fans. The top four face off in matches while Warragul and Traralgon battle it out at the bottom of the ladder. Up the top and Sale have a huge opportunity to push clear on top of the ladder when they face Leongatha while second placed Maffra take on third placed Moe. For the Maroons it is a must win match or else they face the very real prospect of being two games back from ninth place on the table going into the Queens Birthday clash with arch rivals Morwell.

Alarm bells will be ringing for the Maroons on Saturday as they faceoff against Warragul at Western Park. The Gulls win last week moved them a game clear of the bottom of the ladder and now have the opportunity to move two games clear of last placed Traralgon. Signs are not good if you are a Maroons fan

with the Gulls taking both meetings between the sides in 2018. Traralgon's best players are playing well with their top stars such as Collison, Stockdale, Hector and Thuring all getting plenty of the ball. Their struggles have been with efficiency by foot and last quarter fadeaways having led both Moe and Bairnsdale at three quarter time only to suffer defeats. Warragul have been getting back on track after a slow start to the season they have pulled out wins over Leongatha and Morwell to put them back in with a chance to push for the five. It is an impossible game to pick, on one hand the Gulls would be favourites however the Maroons have the star quality to produce the win. Expect Traralgon to give a good account of themselves as it is possibly their final chance already in season 2019 to stay in touch with the five.

Sale march over the hill to the Avery on top of the table and with a good run of form. They have matches against Wonthaggi and Morwell coming up which means a victory here could see them sit on top of the table at the halfway point of the season. Leongatha's form has been patchy to say the least for their lofty standards. The playing personnel they have are a very different mix to the 2017 & 2018 premierships sides and this is showing in the results. They have got the job done on the road in the past two matches and will enjoy being back at home for this big clash. The Parrots have dominated Sale over the past four seasons but this is a very different match. Chris Verboon and Sean Westaway will need to be at their best with Brad Dessent hitting form in the past few weeks. Brother Jordan has been vital around the ball and the midfielder is fast turning himself into the most vital player in the competition. The Magpies won without K-Mart last week and if he is back it will only add more depth to a strong midfield. Sale would go in as slight favourites however you would expect Leongatha still to be able to get the job done at home.

Maffra are chomping at the heels of Sale in second place and still with the best percentage in the League. Since their dominate performance over the Magpies the Eagles have been ticking of the wins but not blowing out the opposition. It is hard to believe that the Eagles have won the last 15 matches against the Lions in what would be one of the biggest winning streaks in the competition. The Lions have pushed the Eagles over the past few seasons with most games being up for grabs in the second half. The Lions have suffered back to back defeats without Bernie Vince and would dearly love his services against all of the Maffra ex VFL talent. The Eagles will like their chances

in this match at home and on form. If other results go their way they could be back on top of the table come Saturday night.

The first instalment of the distance derby is on for 2019. It actually promises to be one of the matches of the round with Wonthaggi being a tough unit to beat at home and the Red Legs coming of two big wins that has put them back in the five. The Power probably go in as favourites and if their tall timber can mark the football it could be a tough ask for the Red Legs. Bairnsdale were ultra impressive at Wonthaggi last year but they will come up against a different Power outfit this time around. Keenan Hynes and Kieran Vickery have been vital to Bairnsdale over the past few weeks and will hope that these two can get enough of the ball forward to kick a winning total.

The final game of the round has plenty to play for with Morwell taking on Drouin. The Hawks will be desperate to get the win and continue their great season and despite playing away from home they would fancy their chances. Victory could see them in the five on Saturday night nearing the half way point of the year. Morwell's form has been hard to read with some good wins but a lot more admirable losses. The club would be happy with how the side has performed so far this year but their competitive losses are still defeats and games like this against similar ranked opposition need to be won if they are any chance of making a run for the five. Anthony Rosato continues to battle through the middle but without injured captain Ryan Tattersson and star defender Ryan Hearn the Tigers need players to step up. A 50/50 game where either side could win. If Morwell are in the hunt at half time expect them to be there at the end and possibly with the four points.

## TRFM Gippsland League AGA Rookie of the Year Award

### Award Criteria:

The Rookie will be selected using the following criteria:

- Playing performance in current TRFM Gippsland Football Netball League season
- Performance in League awards for the senior grades (MVP, goal scoring, best and fairests)
- Performance in interleague (both AFL Victoria and Local), association/state netball competitions (EZPNC, Interleague and Association Championships)
- Selection in state and national sides for football or netball (State under 19's etc.)
