
ROUND 8 PREVIEW



The queen's birthday weekend greets us with the Traditional Traralgon v Morwell clash with plenty to pay for. Both sides sit with two wins and five losses at eight and ninth respectively on the table. The 203rd instalment of the rivalry sees Traralgon going in fresh of their second win of the season. The Maroons have struggled to get the wins on the board early in 2019 but have won two of their last three and go into the clash as the form side. Traralgon have the fifth best percentage in the league at 99.12% showing that they haven't been far off in a lot of their games this year. Morwell started o the season on a high with wins over Wonthaggi and Maffra in the first four rounds however their form has dropped off and have lost their last three matches. Playing personnel has been a major issue for the Tigers with a handful of their talented Thirds featuring at senior level each week.

The Maroons midfield depth will be a challenge to the young Tigers line-up with Cameron

Thuring and Mark Collison in good form over the past few weeks. Anthony Rosato has being carrying midfield responsibilities without injured captain Ryan Tatterson. A positive for Morwell will be the rucks with Isaac Abas and Dan Musil forming a good partnership capable of giving first use to their midfield which has been a problem area for the Maroons all season. Traralgon have won the last two meetings against Morwell relatively comfortably although the last ten meetings have been split between the two sides with the Maroons claiming five wins and a draw with Morwell taking 4 wins and a draw. Traralgon will be expected to win at home and put themselves right back in the mix for season 2019. With Maffra away in week nine of the season the Maroons will see this as a must win. The match will be live streamed via AGA Gippsland League TV on the TRFM Gippsland League Facebook page from 2:20pm and will also be called by TRFM with coverage from 1pm.

Sale sit on top of the table after seven rounds with their only loss of the season coming against Maffra in round 3. The Magpies win over Leongatha in round seven is a massive result in the context for the year with an away win over the reigning premier setting the Magpies up for a run of games against Wonthaggi, Morwell and Warragul in June. The Power are coming off their third win for the year after getting the victory in the distance derby against Bairnsdale at home. The win kept them in touch of the five but they need to be able to win games on the road which has been the major issue of the season with the Power dropping every road game in 2019. The challenge this week will be to compete with Sale's star-studded midfield and get enough supply to their dangerous forwards.

The 50th meeting of the two sides has the ledger in the Powers favour with 29 wins to Sales 25. The Magpies have the current honours claiming the last three wins including a 100 point victory during their last meeting at Sale. Brad Dessent has hit form for the Magpies kicking 15 goals in his last three games with consecutive bags of five goals against quality top five opposition and will prove a handful for Wonthaggi's backline. Sale will be looking to put a big score on the board this week, all signs point to a Magpies win in this one and with their percentage a long way off Maffra's the Magpies will be hoping to win this one well. The Power will be trying to put in a better performance on the road. If all their stars align they could pull off the win but it will be a huge ask.

The Lions started off the season in a blaze of glory with four straight wins putting them top of the table. Three straight losses have followed and the reigning premiers await. Leongatha sit a four wins and three losses also on the season with losses to Wonthaggi, Sale and the famous Warragul match. They are still missing some key playing personnel which they will be hoping are back sooner rather than later. They have been around the mark all year with key wins but have

dropped a few games traditionally they would have marked in as wins. The last ten matches between the sides has been all Leongatha with 10 wins. The Parrots have a 17 match winning sequence against the Lions but today is perhaps Moe's best chance in the past decade to topple Leongatha. Dylan Farrell has been a star in the ruck for Moe and Joell Bragagnolo has also been in good form. For the Parrots Chris Verboon has been in vintage form down back. The Parrots will need goals from Chris Dunne and Jack Ginnane to win. Moe will go in as the slight favourites and if the services of Bernie Vince and Spencer White are available they will be expected to win at home.

The Hawks have been one of the surprise sides of 2019. They have been winning the games they should and snatching the odd game against the likes of Traralgon sees them sitting in the five. Today is perhaps their toughest challenge of the season so far with a Maffra side in top form. The Eagles ball movement has been great over the past few rounds and their intensity over the duration of the match will challenge Drouin. Eddie Morris and Harry Wans have been getting plenty of the football for Drouin but come up against Maffra's depth of ball winners. Maffra have been dominate in the past few years against Drouin but the Hawks are a new side this season. Maffra to win on form but the Hawks have the home ground advantage and have only lost to Leongatha at home this year.

The final match of the round is Bairnsdale at home to Warragul. The Red Legs will expect a big crowd over Queens Birthday Weekend in East Gippsland and welcome the last placed Gulls. Warragul missed an opportunity last week against the Maroons and go into the game needing to bounce back. A good performance could see Bairnsdale back in the five on Saturday night. Bairnsdale won both meetings last year and have improved. They will go in as favourites and the home crowd will expect them to get the win.

The AGA Gippsland League match of the round saw the Eagles keep hot on ladder leader Sale's heels with a crucial win over a Moe side looking to establish themselves in the premiership conversation. The Lions went into the match with four wins and two losses but were on a two match slide since starting the season with four straight wins. The Eagles are the premiership favourites still and the Lions were desperate to topple them at home and ignite their season again. The Eagles showed why they will be there in September. A competitive start which saw the Lions in front by a point at quarter time but the Eagles intensity and ball movement saw them pull away in the second quarter with four goals. James Huts was a star down back and helped restrict the Lions to only six goals for the game. The Eagles had match winners all over the ground with Dan Bedggood taking 11 marks for the day including 5

marks inside 50 nearly as many as the Lions side who finished on 7. Kade Renooy had 26 disposals with Sam Fleming also finishing with 25 disposals at 88% efficiency. Keiran Jones produced one of his best games for the year with 26 disposals and 45 hit outs in the ruck. It was a great battle between two of the best up and coming rucks in the League with Dylan Farrell also finishing with 45 hit outs and 18 disposals.

The tale of the match was the Eagles pressure and ability to repel the Lions with Moe producing one more inside 50 for the match but only managed to score 27% percent of the time they went inside the forward 50 arc. Maffra had more of the ball with 385 disposals to 345 and the Eagles went at 57% by foot in comparison to the Lions who managed to hit less than half of their targets. The Eagles also finished with 93 total tackles to Moe's 51 led by Alex Carr's 9.

Drouin secured a crucial win on the road over Morwell in round 7. The Hawks started off with five first quarter goals from their seven scoring shots in contrast to Morwell managing two from their eight attempts on target. The two sides were evenly matched throughout the day with Drouin proving slightly cleaner with the football which ended up showing on the scoreboard. The Tigers were within reach at three quarter time with the margin at 14 points but they couldn't bridge the gap in the final term with Drouin finishing three goals winners 13.15.93 to 10.15.75.

The Hawks had more match winners through the game and managed to get more supply from their midfield deep into the forward 50. The Hawks were in efficient when going inside 50 but the weight of numbers won out with Drouin putting the ball deep inside 50 27 times

to 19 creating a lot more quality scoring opportunities. Harry Wans and Eddie Morris were the two highest ball winners on the ground with 35 and 33 disposals respectively. Morris also laid 8 effective tackles and had 11 marks. Bob McCallum gave great supply in the ruck with 60 hit outs with Dan Musil battling effectively with 38 hit outs, McCallum also finished with five inside 50's. Kuiy Jiath had plenty off the ball for the Tigers with 32 disposals but only just over 50% of those hit the target. The Tigers won the contested football getting 16 more handball gets and seven more clearances led by Anthony Rostato's six clearances and nine tackles.
