

ROUND 14 PREVIEW



Maffra sit on top of the table after 13 rounds after the events of round 13. Their annual trip to Warragul in the past few years has presented plenty of problems for the Eagles. This match shapes up as crucial for a Maffra side that despite sitting on top of the table have not hit their full stride yet for most of the year. The Tigers kept the Eagles goalless for half of the match last week but couldn't finish the job after multiple injuries. Ed Carr and Jack Johnstone were superb in the last quarter to help secure the four points for the Eagles. The Gulls go into the game off a bye after their win over the Hawks in round 12 and should be full of confidence especially with their recent record at home. Maffra have wrestled back their position at the top of the League after Sale's recent

slip up and will not be in the mood to drop points against a bottom five opponent.

Bairnsdale managed to get back one of the games they need against Drouin at home last week. The RedLegs have not won on the road yet in 2019 and it doesn't get any easier with the second place Lions waiting for them at home. This was one of the matches that Moe have dropped this season after their red hot start they slipped up against Bairnsdale away by 8 points. A fully fit Shaun Wyatt is gaining more and more by the week and capped it off with 5 goals

in the RedLeg's win over Drouin in round 13. It is do or die every week for Bairnsdale with them still needing to make up games on Drouin. The Hawks have a tough run in the next few weeks and if Bairnsdale can win on the road they can begin to bridge the gap. Moe must keep winning and despite sitting in second they will have one eye on the Sale, Maffra and Leongatha run they have in the next month.

Sale have relinquished top spot on the table after their loss to Traralgon last week. The Magpies were undone by a Traralgon side desperate to starve them of possession and made it count on the scoreboard only kicking one behind for the day from their 13 attempts on goal. This week they have a Drouin side that will be keen to stop the recent slide where they lost games to Warragul and Bairnsdale. Sale have traditionally been dominant over Drouin especially in recent years. The first meeting in 2019 saw a 24 point win to the Magpies but they had 30 scoring shots to 16. The Hawks need another win or two to secure a finals position but the Magpies present a tough challenge. They will take plenty of positives after already beating the top of the table Maffra side at home already in 2019. If the Hawks win then it could severely dent Sale's chances of the minor premiership hopes with Moe and Leongatha to follow for the black and white.

Leongatha have started to find form with three consecutive wins leading into their bye last week. They should be well rested

to meet a Tiger's side that is anything but. Morwell have again been hit hard with injuries and illnesses. Credit to their current crop of players and coaches as they have still remained competitive on the field and managed to take it up to Maffra for a half last week. The Parrots present a big challenge for them with nine consecutive victories under their belt and more experience and depth on paper, it doesn't look like another upset is on the cards.

It is the 150th meeting between the two sides and Leongatha will be odds on favourites to claim their 84th victory over the Tigers. Morwell will look to stay competitive for as long as possible but coming off the bye expect Leongatha to be raring to go and keep their chances off a top three finish alive.

The final match of the round features Traralgon and Wonthaggi with the two sides languishing in the bottom four. Traralgon claimed a scalp that could shape the finals last week accounting for Sale at home. The Maroons starved the Magpies of the football and capped it off on the scoreboard kicking an incredible 12 goals and only one behind in the win. Traralgon look the stronger side on recent form with their key players performing well. Wonthaggi play better at home but haven't tasted victory for a long time.

Traralgon need to effectively win every game and hope results go their way in other matches. The Maroons to this round win and keep their slim finals chances alive.

ROUND 13 SUMMARY

Bairnsdale managed to keep their slim finals hopes alive with victory over the side they are chasing in Drouin. The Red Legs are a different side at home this year and showed it. Their tackling was a feature of the game recording 64 led by Ben McKinnon's 12. Most of the key stats were evenly matched with both sides getting enough of the football and creating inside 50 chances. Bairnsdale simply had more winners on the ground and converted their opportunities. Shaun Wyatt proved a difference kicking five goals from his 11 kicks. Russell Cowan has been a consistent performer this year and Keenan Hynes has joined him through the middle helping give the Red Legs plenty of supply.

Jackson Hall (48 disposals) and Mark Collison (40 disposals) played kick to kick down back finishing with 28 marks between them. While it didn't quite resemble the Joel and Patrick Bowden performance of the mid 2000's they helped keep the ball out of Sale's hands and ensure the match was played at the Maroon's tempo. Overall the Maroons recorded 152 marks for the day with Josh Twite (14), Adam Jaensch (14) and Ben Johnson (13) the others to reach double digits too. For Sale Will Leslie and Jordan Dessent won plenty of the ball through the middle. Lipman finished with 20 disposals and 7 clearances to go with his hit-out tally.

Bob McCallum had one of his best games for the year. The superstar finished with a vintage stat line which included 46 hit outs, 5 clearances, 6 inside 50's, 5 contested marks and 6 scoring shots. Harry Wans continued to get plenty of the ball finishing with 31 disposals with Todd Beck and Tom Barr also picking up over 20 touches each. The main issue for the Haws is depth with over half of the side (12 players) only recording single digits in possessions. A great win for the Red Legs but at a cost to them with young talent and Gippsland League Under 18s representative player Byron Vickery suffering what looks to be a long term injury.

When the Wonthaggi Blues first entered this competition in 1995 they "won" the spoon in their settling in period, then again last year, but there has been plenty for Power supporters to celebrate in between. For Traralgon their only last place finish was in their final year of the old Gippsland Football League in 1935. In that year the Maroons lost all 15 home and away rounds, then transferred across to the Central Gippsland league in 1936. Today's game will be quite spirited, given that the loser may well be left with the dreaded spoon at season's end.

Leongatha is building towards the upcoming finals series and will be favoured to win, but Morwell will take a lot of shaking off.
