in the RedLeg's win over Drouin in round 13. It is do or die every week for Bairnsdale with them still needing to make up games on Drouin. Moe must keep winning and despite sitting in second they will have one eye on the Sale, Maffra and Leongatha run they have in the next month.

Bairnsdale managed to keep their slim finals hopes alive with victory over the side they are chasing in Drouin. The Red Legs are a different side at home this year and showed it. Their tackling was a feature of the game recording 64 led by Ben McKinnon's 12. Most of the key stats were evenly matched with both sides getting enough of the football and creating inside 50 chances. 
