





Senior Section Life Membership

a) Qualification

To qualify for nomination for Life Membership the following shall be met:

- Minimum of ten (10) years consecutive Board of Management, Executive Committee or Senior Sub Committee service or minimum of fifteen (15) years combined service to The Club in a playing or service capacity;
- Nominee to have demonstrated, instigated or physically contributed to the preservation and promotion of The Club in some recognisable significance other than just time served and performed their functions above and beyond the usual duties of any position of office or other official duties to The Club; and
- Nominee to have not only serviced The Club as a member but represented themselves and The Club over this period of time in a dignified and respectful manner an upstanding member of The Club;
- **b)** Nomination
- Any member may nominate a person for Life Membership;
- Nomination shall be signed by an existing Life Member; and
- Nominations must be made in writing, stating eligibility and any other relevant information to support the nomination including evidence of the contribution made.

Nominations for Life Membership shall be considered by the Senior Sub Committee Executive and up to five (5) Senior Section Life Members. The assessment criteria for nominations, shall be the qualifications listed in a) above.

Outstanding Services Medal

GUIDELINES FOR NOMINATION:

The Outstanding Services Medal was instigated in the Year 2001 as a means of acknowledging an individual achievement, contribution or service over and above the general commitment given by an individual.

It is not necessarily governed or measured as years of service, but more the quality of the individual's contribution and the effect it has had on the development and promotion of the Upper Ferntree Gully Football Club.

It would be considered appropriate that a minimum 8 years service be given before nomination, however this is not mandatory and MAY be waived in exceptional circumstances at the committee's discretion.

ELIGIBILTY:

Any player, committee person or financial member may be nominated for consideration.

Any player, committee person or financial member may nominate.

Any nomination must be in writing detailing years/level of service and service/s or contribution provided. Nominations must be seconded by another member and presented via the Secretary to be tabled and discussed by the current committee.

The current committee reserves the right to appoint a sub committee to verify/investigate the authenticity of any submission. It is NOT an automatic award.

The committee shall, upon investigation and discussion of the nomination, vote as to the awarding of the Medal.

Dennis Callahan Award (Best Under 21)

This award was initiated and established in 1995 in memory of Dennis Callahan who started playing for Upper Gully in the Under 16's at 12 years of age becoming captain in 1963. 1964 saw the start of his senior career that continued until 1980 after nearly 300 games including the 1974 premiership.

During this time he was awarded the 1965 Reserves Best and Fairest, the Best Under 21 player in 1967, and he was Runner Up in the Senior Best and Fairest in 1970. In 1971 Dennis was the senior captain. He also coached the Reserves to the 1979 premiership. Dennis was President in 1981 and went on to fulfil many other roles at the club including Under 18 Coach, Trainer, Team Manager, Tribunal Advocate, Selection Committee, General Committee and is a Life Member of the club. Unfortunately, Dennis' life was cut tragically short in 1995 as a result of cancer. The club introduced this award to honor and recognize Dennis' contribution, commitment, passion and loyalty to the club and his dedication to developing junior players.

The award is intended to acknowledge the future talent of the Upper Ferntree Gully Football Club and Dennis' passion for the development of up and coming players. It was deemed by the then committee to be incorporated with the previous "Best Clubman" award, to recognize Dennis' contribution to the club made over many years.

Therefore, the criteria are that:

- 1. Only players under the age of 21 at the beginning of the year shall be eligible for nomination
- 2. The player has shown outstanding football ability/potential AND
- 3. Has conducted himself in manner befitting a member of the Upper Ferntree Gully Football Club. That is, demonstrating a commitment to BOTH his on field and off field attitude towards the club and his personal development as a player and a club person

Dave Baker Award (Most Courageous)

The Dave Baker Most Courageous award was instigated in 1977 in memory of Dave Baker who played for Upper Gully in the early 1970's. Dave played in the Under 17's between 1970 and 1972 before progressing to the seniors in 1973.

Dave was awarded the Best Utility player in the 3rd eighteen in 1972, the Most Improved senior player in 1974 and Most Determined senior player in 1975. He was also a member of the 1974 premiership team.

Dave epitomized the Upper Gully spirit, showing enormous courage every time he played for the red and blue.

Dave's footy career came to an end when his life was cut tragically short as a result of a fatal car accident in 1976 at the age of 21.

The club introduced this award to honor and recognize Dave's contribution to the club and in memory of the courage he displayed.

It is awarded to a Senior or Reserve Player who, as judged by the coaching panel, has displayed courageous determination in his endeavors for the season either through his on field play or his off field attitude in overcoming injury or other adversity to resume or continue his playing career.

Best Playing Clubman Award

This award was instigated in 2013. The Upper Gully Football club wants to recognise players who are positive contributors to the club. They will be active contributors on and off the field to the overall benefit of the club and themselves. This award is to recognise such a player from the senior club who has given the greatest service to the club off the field in any given year as adjudged by the committee. The current committee shall nominate and verify the eligibility and vote to determine the recipient of the award.

This award is open ONLY to a registered PLAYER in the Senior section of the club who has played a minimum of 9 games (in any combination) in the current season. (This includes U/19's, Reserves/Development Squad, Seniors, Vets and Senior Women's Teams) ***** (Players in teams with less than 18 scheduled games will need to play at least half of scheduled games for that season)

Criteria for Nomination: A player who demonstrates a contribution to the club over and above his personal playing commitment.

The below is considered when determining the recipient of the award

Club Commitment:

- A player who conducts himself in a manner that displays courtesy, honesty and friendliness to all other members of the club community.
- A player who contributes to the constant improvement of our club so that we can provide a sociable and friendly atmosphere for all players and families.
- A player who is involved in club functions and club events/occasions, not only in attending but as an enthusiastic contributor.

On Game Day:

• A player who willingly contributes to the organisation required to the setting-up and management of off-field game day duties and responsibilities before, during or after stated playing times

In Preparation:

- A player who attends the required training sessions and participates to a level that will positively develop his and his team mates fitness and football ability.
- A players who offers assistance to his team mates on and off the field and contributes to the cohesion of the team and club environment in general

The Future:

- A player who believes in and fosters the "One Club Policy" by acknowledging and supporting both the Junior and Senior sections
- A player who conducts himself in an exemplary manner both on and off the field and in the wider community."

Terry Hopkins Foundation Rising Star Award

Frame work for the Terry Hopkins Foundation player assessment.

- All players will be observed through out their Under 17 (Top age) year.
- At the conclusion of the season every player will be assessed by a committee that includes the Under 17 Coach and 3 other persons who have had an active involvement in the Under 17 team.
- Every player will be scored between 1 and 100 for each of the 4 criteria below.
- Similarly, at the end of their first Under 19 season, every player will be again scored in the same manner.
- The votes awarded for the Under 17 year will contribute 40% to the 2 year aggregate score and the Under 19 year the remaining 60%.
- Of the 4 assessment criteria below the 'A Good Club Citizen' and 'On Game Day' elements will be scored between 1 and 100. However the 'In Preparation' and 'The Future' will have a maximum of 50 points.

The Player/s that has been awarded the highest aggregate number of votes will be announced as the Terry Hopkins Foundation rising star.

The players will be assessed for the award under the following criteria.

• <u>A Good Club Citizen</u>: The player should conduct themselves in a manner that displays courtesy, honesty and friendliness to all other members of the club community. We want our players to contribute to the constant improvement of our club so that we can provide club with sociable and friendly atmosphere for all players and families in the future.

Players should be involved in club functions and club occasions, not only as attendees but as enthusiastic contributors to the events. Our clubs reputation should never be spoiled by a player's behaviour in the wider community.

• On Game Day: The player should display courage, skill, leadership and put the interests of the team before their own. The player should conduct themselves in a manner that brings pride to the Upper Gully jumper.

The player should be respectful of the opposition and should not be involved in vilification of any sort.

The player will also be respectful of umpires and all officials of the game and will not engage unsportsmanlike conduct.

- In Preparation: The player should attend the required training sessions and participate to a level that will positively develop their fitness and football ability. Players need to be striving for improvement in their individual skills and the overall teamwork. Players will be recognised for the manner in which they assist their team mates and how they contribute to the cohesion of the team.
- <u>The Future</u>: The Upper Gully Football club wants to recognise players that are going to be long term contributors to the senior club. They will be active contributors on and off the field to the benefit of the club and themselves. They are committed to playing football in the Upper Gully senior ranks whilst playing in the EFL competition.

Best and Fairest

Three vote cards are distributed to the coaching staff at the end of each home and away game for each of the teams that represent the senior club. The persons voting on all three cards do so independently of each other in selecting their five best players. The names of the five best players are written down from 5 for the best player to 1 for the fifth best player on all three cards The votes are then tallied and the player with the highest number of votes receives the Best and Fairest Award.

Most Valuable Player Award

This award was introduced in 2000 by the senior coach, Andy Greenall, to recognize the best senior player as voted by his peers. At the conclusion of each match the senior playing group select one player they deem the best player on the day. The votes are tallied at the end of the season and the player with the highest number of votes is presented with the player's award. In 2005 the club introduced the Most Valuable Player awards to the Reserves and Under 18's teams as well. This has been extended to all sides that represent the senior club

Coaches Award

The coaching panel of each football side chooses a player that typifies what the coaching panel is trying to instill into the team from the start of pre season until the last game of the year.

Best Finals Player

This award follows the same structure as the Best and Fairest Award except is restricted to the finals games played by each team. Three vote cards are distributed to the coaching staff at the end of each finals game for each of the teams that played finals. The names of the five best players are written down from 5 for the best player to 1 for the fifth best player on all three cards The votes are then tallied and the player with the highest number of votes receives the Best Finals Player Award.

Netball Best Club Person

This award is presented to the player who best represents the club in the Club Netball Teams.
