WorkSafe AFL Victoria Country claimed the 2019 Brian Molony Cup, after defeating the VAFA by 17 points. Finally, country Victoria's premier junior regional championships, the V/Line Cup, kicks off on Monday September 23 in Shepparton. This year, the competition has grown to include 14 Under 15 Boys teams divided across two divisions, and eight Under 15 Girls teams.

2019 saw the highly successful WorkSafe Game of the Month return with nine games featuring some of the AFL's biggest names including Joel Selwood, Ben Brown, Nathan Jones, Mason Cox, Jack Gunston and many more, who embraced the country football atmosphere in a bid to promote safety in some of Victoria's smallest communities.

As season 2019 comes to an end, I would like to thank all players, coaches, umpires, volunteers, club administration staff and supporters for making this season a memorable one. You are the backbone of country football and without your support, our great game would not be possible. I hope you have a safe and happy off-season and return just as passionate in 2020.

### JOHN BUTCHER

**Games: 9, Goals: 16, MVP Votes: 0, League Votes: 0**

A late but box office addition to the Eagles' 2019 list, Butcher made his highly anticipated return to Gippy League footy in round three. It has been something of a slow burn since, with the former Port Adelaide forward appearing infrequently throughout the campaign. However, standing at nearly 200cm and with some of the best hands in the business, he can turn any game on its head. Butcher played in the Eagles' senior flag in 2009 and alongside his brother Danny in an NTFL premiership earlier this year, but can he complete the ultimate family fairytale for his home club and under father, Wayne?



### KADE RENOY

**Games: 19, Goals: 7, MVP Votes: 3, League Votes: 4**

After making his mark at senior level as a classy goal sneak, Renooy has made the transition to defence this season and matured quickly into a key component of the Eagles back line. Playing alongside the likes of proven performers Sam Fleming and James Huts, Renooy has quietly honed his craft, putting his foot skills and footy smarts to good use to be one of the Eagles most consistent performers. Still only 21, his rebounding off half back it will go a long way to a Maffra victory.



### JAMES HUTS

**Games: 18, Goals: 0, MVP Votes: 3, League Votes: 0**

A tough uncompromising defender that has reached veteran status at only 24. Huts has played 129 games for the Eagles after debuting in round 2 2012. Playing in his fourth consecutive Grand Final he will be expected to get one of the big jobs on either Lloyd or Maskell if fit. Provides a presence and stability in the backline which allows other defenders to thrive he will play a massive role in keeping the free scoring Parrots in check.



## LEONGATHA

### CHRIS VERBOON

**Games: 21, Goals: 2, MVP Votes: 16, League Votes: 7**

The ultimate swingman has become Leongatha's go-to general in defence. Supreme in the air, clean in his disposal and an elite reader of the play, Verboon is among the most vital cogs in the Parrots machine, as evidenced by the race for the league's MVP award. Now in his ninth year at The Aviary, the 33-year-old has settled deeper in defence this season and with the likes of John Butcher, Daniel Bedgood and possibly Mitch Bennett expected to rotate through the Eagles' forward line at different stages, Verboon's ability to match up against different sized opponents, zone off as a third defender and even roll forward if required, will be crucial.



### JOSH HOPKINS

**Games: 21, Goals: 22, MVP Votes: 4, League Votes: 4**

Hopkins is having a career best season and has moved himself into the top bracket of TRFM Gippsland League players. Still only 23 years of age he is in his fourth year with the Parrots and will be playing in his fourth consecutive Grand Final. Hits the scoreboard and has pace to burn, he set up the qualifying final win with four first term goals. Expect him to be a big contender for the Stan Aitken Medal if the Parrots get up.



### COL SANBROOK

**Games: 16, Goals: 1, MVP Votes: 0, League Votes: 3**

The evergreen Sanbrook is still one of the classiest players in the competition. A big bodied midfielder he continues to accumulate the football and goes at a high efficiency. Missed the first three games of the season but has been a regular contributor after that. A big time performer, Sanbrook was dominant against his former club in last weekend's Preliminary Final and was last year's best on ground in the TRFM Gippsland League Grand Final.

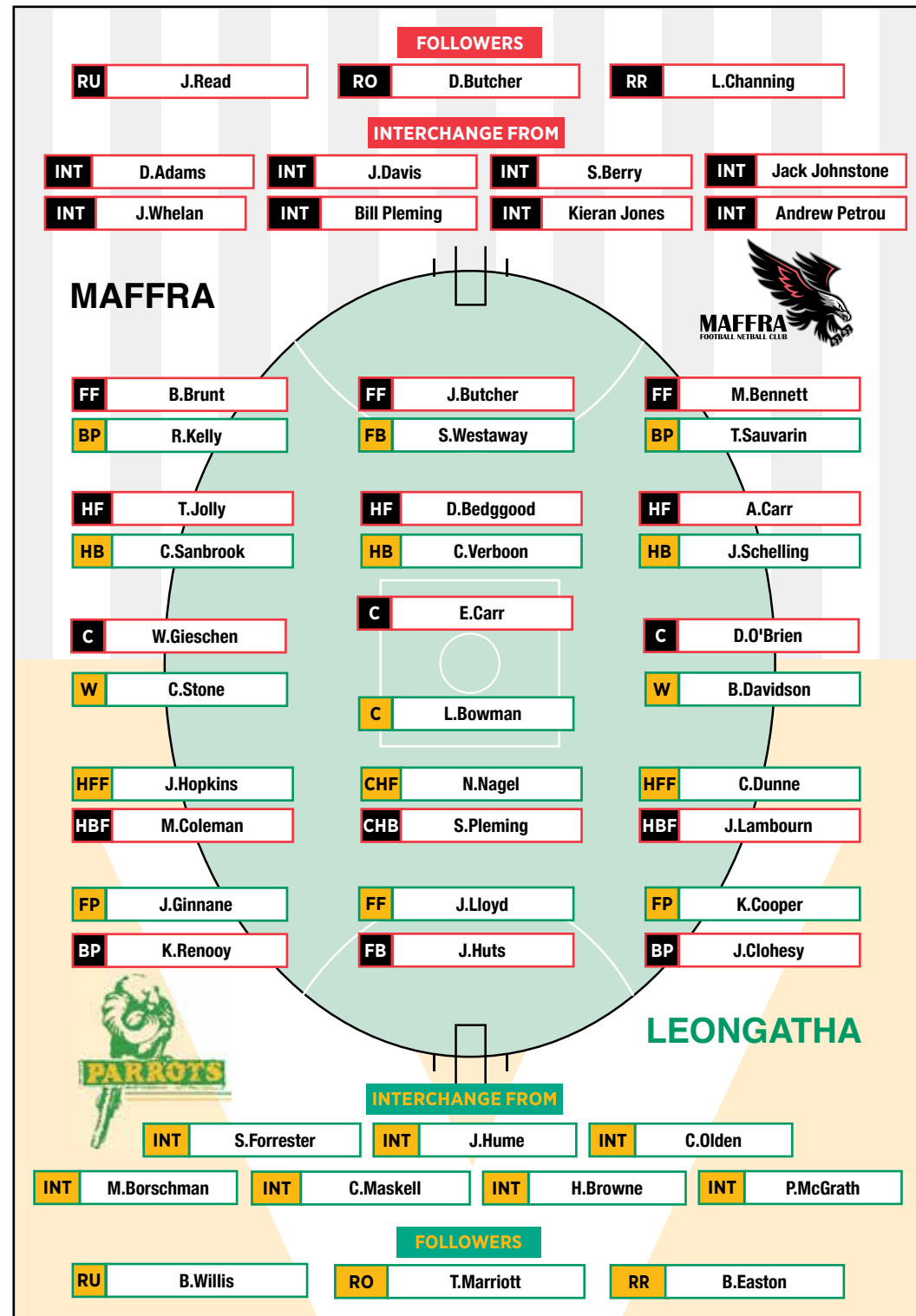

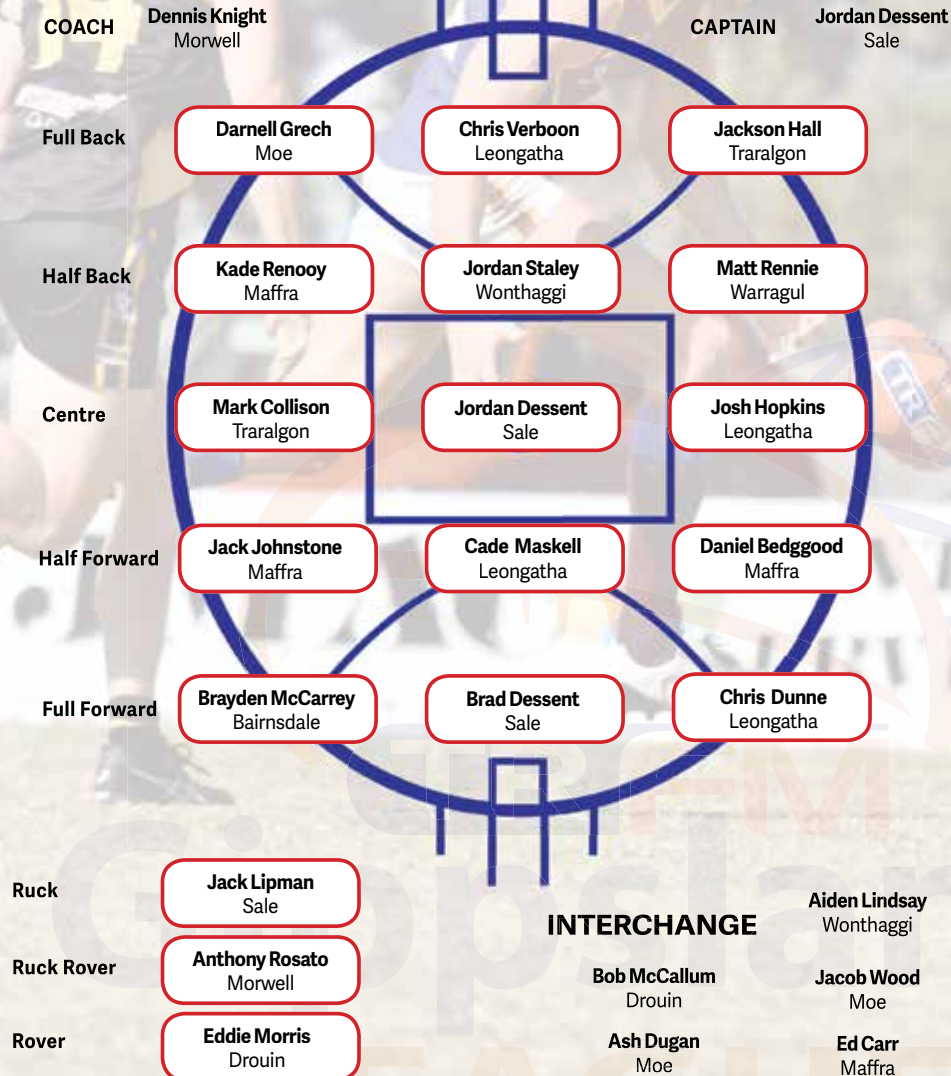

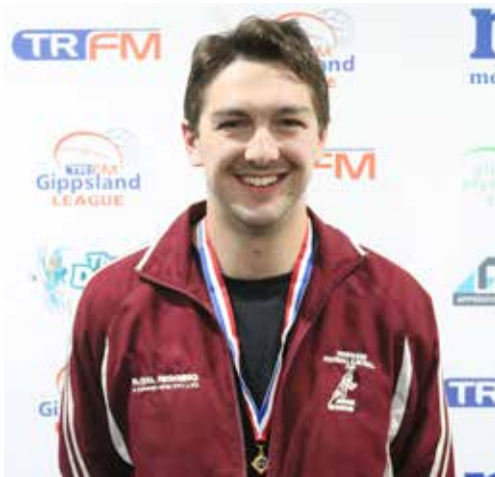

Notes: For the fourth year running Maffra and Leongatha will contest the TRFM Gippsland League Grand Final. This is the first time in league history that the same two teams have met in the flag decider for four years running. Previously the record stood at three in a row, that being in 1964-65-66 when Morwell and Traralgon met in Grand Finals. And it is the fifth successive year that Leongatha finds itself in the "Big Dance", losing to Traralgon and Maffra in 2015-16, then winning back-to-back flags in the past two years. They are closing in on the league record of seven successive Grand Finals, a record set by Traralgon when they contested the 1960-66 inclusive Grand Finals. Fans will expect today's game to be another thriller after margins in the past two Grand Finals of one and nine points. Last year the lead changed throughout the game no fewer than twelve times with the Parrots turning an eleven point deficit half way through the final quarter into a nine point victory after they scored the last 3 goals 2 behinds of the match. Their three meetings this year have seen the home team victorious on each occasion. Although scoring was been moderate in their home and away clashes no-one expected the defences to dominate the way they did in the 2nd Semi-Final. The match aggregate of 73 points was the lowest between these teams since they combined for 67 points in 2003. Both teams will have been busy during the week trying to get star players fit for the big clash this afternoon, both teams having to deal with injuries to key personnel right throughout the year. It's a tribute to both the Eagles and Parrots that they have developed such depth within their ranks that they have been able to promote players who have been up to the task. As Maffra seeks their 9th Senior flag, and Leongatha their 11th, a massive crowd will be on hand again this afternoon to witness what may well go down as one of the more memorable matches in league history.

The AFL and Victorian State Government's announcement of an additional \$18 million investment into Victorian country football over the next three years will make a huge difference to the grassroots game across regional Victoria.

The Victorian Community Football Investment plan's projected saving for clubs in Gippsland stands at \$284,662, thanks to the removal of affiliation fees alone, in addition to a share in the \$950,000 worth of dedicated volunteer-assistance initiatives and \$1.5m-backed Strategic Community Investment Fund.

Separate to, but complementing this significant development, has been the appointment of Don Harley as Commercial and Operations Manager for the AFL Gippsland Regional Administration Centre.

The newly-created position is a result of working closely with AFL Victoria over the past few

months to review and identify strategies to improve our business operations.

Don offers an impressive list of achievements that align well with the broad scope of this new role and his passion for community football is plain to see. We are extremely confident he will not only be a good fit but make an immediate and notable impact here in Gippsland on his commencement in the role on Monday.

Finally, as we bring season 2019 to a close today, I would like to take the opportunity to acknowledge some key people.

Evans Petroleum has been on the journey with us from day one, as the major partner of AFL Gippsland. The contribution of Stuart Evans and his team – particularly John Schelling – to grassroots football in our region is unmatched and has enabled us to invest in areas of game development like never before. 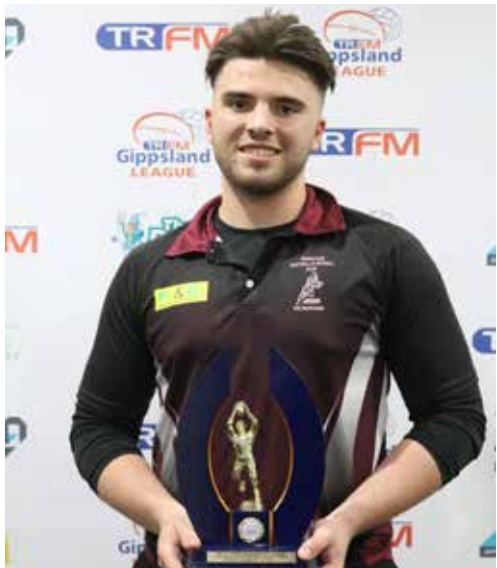


