

## **Treasurer's Report**

It is with pleasure that I present my treasurer's report covering season 2019.

This season, after a write back of one sponsor's money that did not come through from last season, saw the club finish with a surplus of \$4k albeit represented in Debtors of \$31,000 owed by sponsors and cricket club and Creditors of \$17,000 owed to players, coaches and accounts. Due to the hold up of sponsors money coming in there has been a short delay in meeting payments however all will be settled by the end of November.

Again I have been adjusting how some expenses are coded just so I can gain a better understanding of our cost centers so some figures may appear at odds with past years. The reporting will continue to evolve so we can properly analyse the figures.

### **The Results**

We recorded an overall 3% increase in revenue. This was up from \$468k to \$482 for the year compared to last year which is a good result.

Bar: I would like to thank Billy and all that help in running the bar whether it be game day, inside and the outside bars, after match and function days and nights. The bar revenue was down some 3% and this can be attributed to the season not running as deep as 2018 and 2017 (in which we played in the grand final). Also, people are more conscious of alcohol consumption as well. The more significant figure is that of bar margin, which has seen a decrease by 3.5% over the last three years. We have not increased prices in that time, but cost of stock has risen. It has been proposed at committee level to rectify that in season 2020 with a small price rise across all drinks (we have been the cheapest in the EFL for some time). We will release the new pricing structure as we get closer to season 2020.

Canteen Department: The overall canteen, which incorporates BBQ and Thursday Night Meals, has seen an increase of 2% in revenue but more importantly an overall 15% decrease in running costs which has been across all the individual departments. BBQ has decreased in revenue again as a standalone department so I'm uncertain as to how to rectify this and we need to workshop ideas.

Big thanks to Karen Cali for all her efforts over countless years, you will be missed and hard to replace.

Social Functions: This department was down 10% from last year which is predominately represented by not having the race day and drop in ladies day revenue but with an increase in President's lunches (Anzac Day and Team of the Decade lunches). Gala Ball was a great success only marginally down on last year which was our "50 year" celebration. Profit was about the same despite less revenue so a big thanks to Caitlyn Adams on a fantastic job in her first year, very organized. With no Anzac Day game for 2020 we need to think more on how to generate income in this area.

Memberships: Increased revenue of some 16%, great with more women players, a Colts team and more netball teams. Also, great the vets are on top of their subs and we have a fantastic bond with this team as we are all under the one banner. The Kennel Club was again invaluable to our revenue overall.

Revenue: What a fantastic year for the club in this area and we are indebted to Vince and his tireless hard work in driving this department to heights it has never been in the history of the club. New sponsors, fence signs, the calendar, and great commitment from our long and trusted major corporate sponsors. As the landscape changes, so do we, and Vince is driven to ensuring the long term vision of introducing new sponsors to our great club. We are always looking for new ways to improve and engage with those that make a financial commitment to our club.

Merchandise: This was down again from last year, but 2017 was an exceptional year so a decline was inevitable, but it is essential we push to raise this income stream again and strive to get all our supporters in our colours at games. Stock level is "healthy", so a big push for sales in 2020.

Mudlarks Coterie: Thanks to Tubby, Peter, Neil and Ian for all their hard work, this is a valued revenue stream for the club with membership, the Marquee and the "famous" Friday lunch. Although down a bit on last year this can be

explained by our request for more funds in the 2018 season, so I'm sure all will be committed to providing a great result for next year.

**Next Season:**

The hard work does not stop. As a club we are always striving to improve our financial position, but as I said, the landscape is changing and we need to be inventive to ensure we are able to meet our commitments. There are areas we can improve and I know we have the right people at the club to make this happen.

Thanks to Cathy for all your help and support in your final year, you have been a great "sounding board" for me. Thanks to everyone on the committee for your help and putting up with me being cranky at times. I look forward to a successful 2020 both on and off the field.

### **Senior Coach's Report**

A disappointing year. A challenging year. A milestone year. A club developing year. But overall an enjoyable and still a special year at the kennel.

From a club first point of view - which is the Sth Croydon way. Our women's flag, our standalone U19s back, a great new development squad coach, exciting developments with lights and facilities, an inspirational Q&A session with Mon and her dad, another amazing session with Paul Watkins Ultra marathon runner, and of course more brilliant meals every Thursday night, just to name a few...

After a big preseason with a different energetic fitness voice - thanks Lachy!, and more use of the footys the senior side began the year with some quality new personnel and high expectations to go one better than last year's almost success.

Unfortunately our year didn't begin as we wanted. We lost Chris Jones and Jake Tucker in the first two rounds and were 0-3 after playing three eventual finalists early. We turned 3 and 3 at round 6, suffered a heavy loss to Vermont in round 7, lost Liam Cox during a big win in round 8 and were 5-4 at the half way mark.

Over the next 2 weeks we lost to Balwyn by 4 points and beat Rowville well at home in the wet. The worst of our poor kicking then began with 5.18 and 6.17 over the next 2 weeks. We had 41 scoring shots (22.19) to 16 in round 14 and eventually finished the year with a scoring ratio of 228.253. Our 2nd half including finals was 116.151 - 21.55 in 3 games alone.

We set ourselves a goal of winning 4 out of the final 5 games to ensure a finals spot which we did. We knew if we got there we could do some damage. We played well in the first final with 27 scoring shots to 15 and whilst we disappointingly lost Matt Jones, we went into Blackburn confident we could get the job done. Unfortunately, they were hungrier with and without the footy on the day.

Our defence was very good for majority of the year. They were under a lot of pressure at times and withstood it. We kept the opposition to 8 goals or less in 11 of our 20 games. This is a team goal we have each week.

37 players ran out in the seniors this year. That included 5 brand new faces to the club (1 returning) and 4 eligible under 19 players made their debuts - fantastic for the club. We celebrated some brilliant milestones - most notably Jim's 150th and Dano's 250th in round 18.

Whilst we felt we were the 2nd best side this year - ultimately results didn't show it. There are areas to address and therefore improve. We feel we can do this and therefore accept the challenge and be good enough of nothing but the ultimate success in 2020. Personally that has made me hungry and excited to go again and we have gained the services of Marcus Buzaglo as a snr assistant non-playing midfield coach for 2020.

I thank Steve and Dano for their work as forward and midfield coaches this year and I congratulate Dylan on his first year as skipper of the club (did a great job in my opinion) and basically guided the backline throughout also. I thank Ian Skinny Winneke for his work as opposition analyst and also thank Eric Stone for his help in the box on Match day. I thank and more so congratulate Quonny for his first year back as reserves coach. He showed the type of dedication required to do a good job at a not always easy job. Boys loved you mate and I thank you and look forward to you going again in 2020 also!

Thanks to Bernie, Johnny, Dukey, Graham, Waz - the stats team - bit like the news team off Anchorman – (will let you guys sort out who's who..) Huge thanks to Wendy and our trainers. Would be very hard without you guys.

Thanks to Cathy, Vince and the whole committee for all your work off field and especially congratulate Fitzy for being involved this year.

Once again the biggest assistance I have and possibly biggest asset to the club is Damon Hindmarsh. Tireless amounts of work – I and we really appreciate it.

Thanks to all of our amazing supporters and extended families - you guys all rock!

### **Development Squad Coach's Report**

It has been an extremely enjoyable and rewarding season for me personally coaching the development team this season and I have loved every minute of it. My key focus in this role was to ensure everybody enjoyed themselves and to continually try to teach and improve all player's knowledge, mindset and playing ability. Hopefully I have achieved this.

We finished the season with 8 wins and 10 loses and a percentage of 122%. We finished 6<sup>th</sup> on the ladder mainly due to the fact that when we had our opportunities to kick goals this season we didn't take them. This resulted in us losing 4 games to sides above us on the ladder by margins of 1, 3, 6 and 9 points. Unfortunately, we didn't play finals this year but I still feel it was a successful year.
