



KALGOORLIE-BOULDER BASKETBALL ASSOCIATION LOCAL PLAYING RULES - SENIORS

Revised 18/11/2019

Player Registration:	<p>1st scheduled game of the season for Seniors shall be 17th & 18th October 2019 All players must be registered with their Club online through Sports TG.</p> <p>Players not registered online will be ineligible to take the court. Players must be selected from the list of active players on Sports TG.</p> <p>If a new player registers they must be allocated to a team before the game laptop/ computer is taken out to the court. <i>Players are not permitted to register manually courtside before the game.</i></p>
Timing of Games:	<p>Division 1 - Clocks will be set with the following</p> <p>7 minute warm up</p> <p>4 x 10 minute quarters that will be fully timed</p> <p>3 minutes half time</p> <p>2 minutes at quarter & three quarter time</p> <p>Shot clock will be used for Division 1 games</p> <p>If there is a Draw at full-time - scores stand</p> <p>No "1 minute" after 5th foul on player</p> <p>Division 2 & 3 - Clocks will be set with the following</p> <p>7 minute warm up</p> <p>2.x 25 minutes halves</p> <p>3.minutes half time</p> <p>If there is a Draw at full-time - scores stand</p> <p>No "1 minute" after 5th foul on player</p> <p>Note: Clocks will start at scheduled game times and will run continuously for each game night with the exception of Division 1 as fully timed games will affect the start time of the following game. Game clocks will run regardless of teams/referees/score bench being fully prepared to start. Non compliance will result in a warning and a \$50 fine for subsequent non- compliance.</p>



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Timing - Finals:	<p>Timing to be the same as the season.</p> <p>In the case of a draw:</p> <p>Division 1 - extra 5 minutes and subsequent 5 minutes will be played until there is a result, all fully timed.</p> <p>Division 2 & 3 - 25 minute 1st half, 20 minute running clock 2nd half and last 5 minutes fully timed. In the case of a draw an extra 5 minutes fully timed and subsequent 5 minutes will be played until there is a result.</p> <p>No "1 Minute" after 5th foul on player.</p>
Player Selection:	A player not listed in the active players on Sports TG laptop scoring prior to the start of the game is ineligible to take the court.
Balls:	<p>Men - size 7 Women - size 6</p> <p>All game balls for the 2017/2018 season must be Spalding. Teams to provide their own ball for games.</p>
Uniforms:	<p>Players must be in correct uniform by the 4th game of the season. If a player or team does not wear the correct uniform - they cannot take the court.</p> <p>If a Club applies to the Board for a uniform exemption, due to late uniform orders they must produce a receipt of the order with their letter. An application can be made to the KBBA to provide tops if available that can be used so all the players are wearing the same uniform top.</p>
Uniform Numbers:	Legal numbers shall be: 00,0 - 99
Forfeits:	<p>Teams must select their available player's names prior to the start of the game on Sports TG laptop scoring. A team can start the game with 4 players but if the 5th player does not arrive before 15 minutes has elapsed on the game clock for the first half for Div 2 & 3 senior games or by the completion of the first quarter for senior Div 1 games, the game will be awarded to the other team. If the players don't leave the stadium before half time or if they have a scratch match, they will not be refunded their gate fee. To be refunded their gate fee, the player must provide their name and sign for the refund. Date and time to be recorded.</p> <p>The game will result in a 20 - 0 win for the other team and minus 3 points for the forfeiting team.</p> <p>The team that has forfeited will be fined \$100.00.</p>



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Premiership Points:	<p>Win - 3 points</p> <p>Draw - 2 points per team</p> <p>Loss - 1 point</p> <p>Forfeit - minus 3 point</p> <p>Umpiring fines - minus 3 points</p> <p>Teams ending in negative premiership points ineligible for finals.</p>
Clearances:	<p>Clearances close 8 weeks after the commencement of the season. Regardless of what age you are, you must be financial with your Club before applying for a clearance or playing for another Club. <i>Refer to rule 15, section a of KBBA by-laws.</i></p>
Player Qualification for Finals:	<p>4 qualifying games for Senior player. Junior player can play 1 Senior game per playing week and qualify under the Junior Local Playing Rules.</p> <p>If player plays in the local Domestic Competition and has played the 4 qualifying games, but have played at Country Week for another Association instead of the KBBA they will be ineligible to play in the KBBA Final series.</p> <p>There will be no applications for finals.</p>
Age Eligibility	<p>No player under the age of 14 years is permitted to play Seniors. Any junior playing seniors must turn 14 before 31st December in the year the season commences.</p>
Bench:	<p>Division 1: The team named first in the fixtures must provide 2 bench officials and the opposing team to provide 1 bench official. The duties include, laptop scoring, the score clock and the 24 second clock. Division 2 & 3: Each team must provide 1 bench official.</p> <p>It is the responsibility of the bench officials and team coaches to select the correct names from the active players on Sports TG. It is the responsibility of the bench officials and coaches to ensure the correct names and playing numbers are allocated to players before the players take the court. Failure to provide a bench official will result in the offending team to incur a warning for the first offence and will be fined \$50 for subsequent non-compliance. It is the responsibility of the referees and bench officials to remove any players that have failed to attend be removed from the active list of players before the game is confirmed in Sports TG at the end of the game.</p> <p>ALL BENCH OFFICIALS WILL REMAIN NEUTRAL WHILE SCORING.</p>



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Referees:	<p>Referee Allocations will be determined by the Referee Committee.</p> <p>It is the goal of the Referring Committee panel to improve the referee standard and introduce a referee development programme, as well as bringing level of professionalism and respect to our referees. It is expected that referees and players will conduct themselves in a respectful and professional manner.</p> <p>It will be the responsibility of the referees and bench officials to remove any players that have failed to attend be removed from the active list of players before the game is confirmed in Sports TG at the end of the game.</p> <p><u>Automatic Suspensions will apply for 2019/20 season</u> Automatic Suspensions will be applied to players/coaches and spectators who conduct themselves in an inappropriate manner as listed below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If a player is ejected from the stadium as per FIBA rule 37.2.4. Automatic 1 week suspension; • If a player/s engages in rough play or is abusive to officials as per FIBA rule 36.2.3 and 36.3.1 - Suspension to be advised based on severity; • Any player, coach or spectator who engages in a minor act of violence as per FIBA rule 39.2.1. Automatic 3 week suspension or greater based on severity. NOTE - Major acts of violence to be automatically referred to the Tribunal; • The continued use of language after a warning has been issued by the officials as per FIBA rule 36.3.1. Automatic 1 week suspension; • Deliberate acts resulting in damaged equipment as per FIBA rule 6.2.6. Automatic 1 week suspension or greater based on severity; <p>The following steps will be followed in an official reporting a player:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The official/s must make a note of what incident occurred on a report sheet; • The official/s must notify either the games controller, board member or supervising referee straight after the game in relation to the incident; • The process of determining whether an automatic suspension should be applied or if more severe the incident will should be referred to the tribunal will be made by the refereeing committee in consultation with the Board; • The person charged with the offence will be notified within 24 hours of the incident; • The person charged will have 24 hours for a right of appeal; • The automatic suspension will be enforced if the charge is accepted or if appealed a tribunal hearing will be organised.
End of Game:	<p>Teams must vacate their bench at the completion of each game to allow the teams playing in the next timeslot to prepare for their game.</p> <p>All teams must leave their courtside bench clean and tidy. Non compliance will result in a warning and a \$50 fine for subsequent non-compliance.</p>
Blood Rule:	<p>No player can start playing or continue playing with an open wound. Player must leave the court and seek first aid. If blood is on uniform - it must be changed or washed. If a game stops due to the blood rule - it will be deemed as an Umpires Time-Out.</p>



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Incomplete Games due to rain, inclement conditions or power loss.	Games must be played within 14 days or will record as a draw. If a game is called off after half time - the score will stand and there will be no replay.
Code of Conduct for Players, Coaches, Officials and Spectators	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Play by the rules • Develop a positive attitude towards players, team-mates, coaches and officials • Never argue with an umpire or an official. If you disagree have your captain, coach or manager calmly approach the official during a break or after the game. • Play to enjoy the game and improve your basketball skills • Don't blame others and don't make excuses • <i>Control your temper.</i> Do not indulge in any verbal or physical abuse of a referee, official or any player - including yourself • Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Do not distract, interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of another player • Be a good sport and acknowledge all good efforts from your team and the opposition • Work equally hard for yourself and your team • Co-operate with your coach, team mates, referees, and opponents as, without them there be no game • All KBBA members including PLAYERS, COACHES, OFFICIALS AND SPECTATORS are expected to make themselves aware of the BWA Zero Tolerance Policy, Social Media Policy, Codes of Conduct and Member Protection Policy. Failure to comply with these guidelines will result in possible warnings, technical fouls, suspension and possible expulsion from the KBBA depending of the severity of poor behaviour.
Fines:	Any fines issued to a team must be paid within 7 days of the fine being incurred or the team will be ineligible to have points allocated for games played until the fine is paid.
