


With a few hard nuts moved on to the ball, Emerald

A Brief Look at the History of the Emerald Football Club

For the newer members of the Emerald Football Club, the following information is a brief history of our club and this great game of football.

A small Association was formed in 1905 and the teams were Emerald, Cockatoo, Gembrook, Macclesfield, Monbulk and Woori Yallock.

Knickers were worn 3-4 inches below the knee, as anything shorter would have been considered indelicate!

Quite a number of games were only ever played in paddocks, not properly constructed ovals and because of the lack of transport, players walked to neighbouring grounds for the match. At the same time, this was a means of training, kicking and passing the ball to one another, en route to the respective grounds.

There was no insurance for players if injured and they had to finance all their own football gear.

Our colours in the early days were blue and white.

In 1925, Emerald was in the Scoresby District Football League and on one occasion, Kilsyth did not arrive for a game until 3.30pm, because of the bad roads and the last quarter was played in moonlight. Emerald won 7.4 to 5.3.

Emerald's colours in this League were green and gold.

In April 1926, Emerald withdrew from the S.D.F.L. and players were allowed to join any other Club, not requiring clearances from Emerald

In the mid twenties, we were named the 'Emites', the late thirties, the 'Redlegs', and later the 'Bombers.'

We began the 1930 season, in the Mountain District Football Association (M.D.F.A.). Our colours were still green and gold.

Emerald was the first club to introduce a Membership ticket and entrance fee.

In 1939, Emerald was wooden spooners and the only enjoyable part of the season was the end of season football trip!

On the 14th June, 1940, Emerald withdrew from the M.D.F.A. due to World War Two.

In 1945, the M.D.F.A. was reformed and the competing teams were Belgrave, Emerald, Gembrook and Monbulk.

In 1954, it was around this time that our uniform was altered to a black Guernsey, with red sash and black socks.


In 1965, a possible football merger was discussed between Club Delegates from the M.D.F.A. and the Yarra Valley Mountain District Football League (YVMDFL.) The amalgamation of the two Leagues was begun on a trial basis for two years.

In 1967, the trial amalgamation period was pronounced a success and the Y.V.M.D.F.L. was formed and continues today, although several clubs have moved in and out of the competition.

Our Premierships were in 1931, 1945, 1946, 1955, 1981, 1983 and 1997. (On information available.)

In 1981, our Red and Black magazine commenced publication. A tradition that has now continued for twenty eight (28) years.






