
























President's Report

9th July 2010

One Mother's Perspective

It's Saturday and that means one thing-Footy!

The highlight of my week is going to watch my son play football with his team; the Emerald Bombers.

There are two reasons I make every effort to watch the game: One, is I love the game and two, my son is fortunate that he plays with, and for, a team that he has grown up with from his junior days.

As a mum I am thrilled and relieved that my son is part of a club that cares about the boys, and that supports them to be part of an inclusive group of young men as they train, play and socialise together.

The transition from the Junior Football Club to the Senior Club is a big step, not just on the ground but in graduating from playing with the boys of the same age, to playing football with men of varying ages and life experiences. In some places this can be a real issue and an area of concern for parents. For me, it has been about trusting that the key leaders of the club have the best interests of the boys as their focus and in this belief, I have not once been let down.

I will never forget the day, last year, when my son was picked to play his first Senior's match as a skinny 17 year old. All I could do was worry about the likelihood of his first real injury. On that afternoon I cannot count how many "Bomber" people, most of whom I didn't really know, stopped to offer a word of encouragement, or to let me know that "the boys" would look after him, or commented on the fine first effort he was making with the "big boys". I am so thankful that he plays for a club that is made up of people like that; and yes, he did get injured!

As a mum, I am most thankful for the calibre of people who appear each week, to administrate, coach, run water, offer medical attention, strap, feed and photograph the boys. These special people know the boys well and quite obviously take a personal interest in their development as footballers, but also as people in the community.

I really appreciate everyone's input and I hope that they realise how valued they are.
