A very cold and wet day at Emerald didn't stop a big crowd of past players, Life Members and faithful Emerald supporters brave the conditions to watch their young bombers. It was third verses fifth on the ladder with Kinglake playing for the second chance in the finals and Emerald playing to keep it and have a chance to go to second with a win against Thornton-Eildon next week.

Emerald started well in the tough, boggy conditions, kicking five straight, to bounce away to a twenty-two point lead at quarter time.

Kinglake hit back in the second quarter. Emerald

struggling to play their running game in the boggy slippery conditions and were forced to go one on one with the bigger Kinglake bodies. With pure physical strength, Kinglake were winning the tough contests and reduced the deficit by five points at half time.

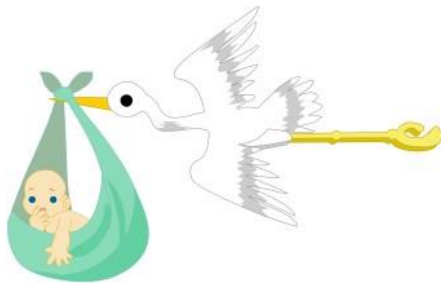

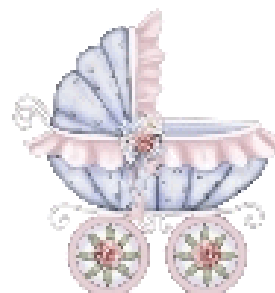

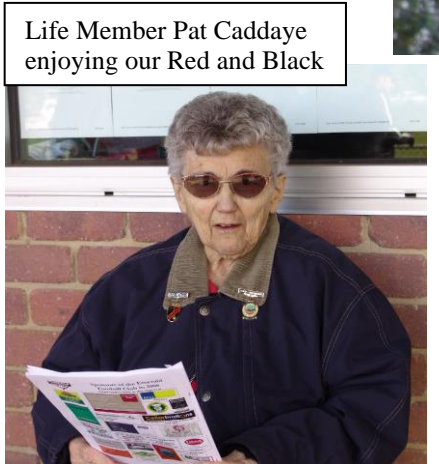
