Following a lengthy process of interviews by the coaching subcommittee, there was unanimous support for Glenn and we are excited to have him join our club for the upcoming season says newly elected Club President Dean Stuhldreier.

Glenn has played over 250 games in the Eastern Football League Division 1 with Scoresby and Clayton under coaches Dean Grieg and Dean Rice before moving into coaching were his held senior coaching positions with Berwick and Lang Lang Football clubs. Glenn was also a senior assistant coach with VFL club Casey Scorpions over a 2 year period.

'I'm excited by the challenge of joining Emerald in the AFL Yarra Rangers Division 1 competition and take its young and promising list to another level. I have a real passion to see the development of players improve and my challenge is to work with the current group, develop our U18's squad and give every player every opportunity to play senior football and continue to introduce new players into the club" Dale said.

Unfortunately superior numbers won the day with Mt Evelyn making the most of the conditions to storm home in the second half.



## Past Player Profile Where are they today?

#### Professor Blair Kuys | PhD

Chair, Interior Architecture and Industrial Design School of Design | Faculty of Health, Arts and Design Swinburne University of Technology

Blair wanted to pursue a career in design ever since his grade 3 teacher (and Emerald footy great) Terry Simpson told him he had very neat handwriting and should be a designer. That was exactly 30 years ago and now Blair is in charge of the entire 3D design program at Swinburne University of Technology – A university with one of the strongest reputations in design education in the world ranking 32 out of approximately 8,500 design schools globally.

After finishing year 12 at Emerald Secondary College in 1996 Blair did a Diploma of Design at RMIT and then studied a Bachelor of Industrial Design at Swinburne University of Technology. During the first few years of the Bachelor Blair was more interested in playing footy than going to uni and at the time was captain of the Emerald seniors. It's fair to say more time was spent at Chandler Reserve than at Swinburne and while Blair continued to pass his subjects he was content on 'going through the motions' rather than excelling at what he was doing.

He then received a letter from the university offering an exchange position at Hong-Ik University. It came with a \$5,000 scholarship to study one semester overseas so rather than look at the university Blair just thought about having an extra \$5,000 so he pursued this opportunity. Being a naïve Aussie who had never left Australia, Blair read the word 'Hong' in Hong-Ik University and naturally presumed he was going to Hong Kong. In 4-weeks he had to get a passport and a Visa for Hong Kong which he did, only to realise that when going to the travel agency for his flights that Hong-Ik was in fact a University in South Korea. That came as a huge shock having thought for the past 4-weeks that he was going to Hong Kong. Blair then had 1-week before departure to get a Visa for Korea – A country he knew nothing about. After paying a premium to fast track his Visa and having nothing prepared to spend the next 6-months overseas Blair was all of a sudden in Seoul, South Korea wondering where the hell he was while desperately searching the world's 4th largest city for anyone who could speak English.

Isolated by the language barrier, he spent months obsessively drawing the objects around him, noticing details he'd never before been aware of – how they were put together and how their form responded to their function. His time overseas also taught him to communicate with people outside his own circle of familiarity – a skill that he says is essential for product and industrial designers to explain processes and specifications to those who will help produce the product. As an industrial designer you're working as part of an interdisciplinary team, and that means you need to be able to talk to engineers and scientists and also to manufacturers and to tradespeople. Blair's stint in South Korea also gave him an abiding interest in the global context of design. He believes the transfer of ideas and technologies between professionals around the world underpins innovation.

However, the greatest skill is being able to listen and relate to everyone regardless of his or her background. The many years playing footy at Emerald certainly helped develop these skills as the footy club brings so many different people together with the common passion for footy – something everyone can relate to.

Blair then returned to Australia in June 2002 with a much stronger work ethic and advanced skills that completely changed his focus. On the back of this change in attitude Blair was accepted into the Honors program and graduated with a High-Distinction average awarding him First Class Honors in Industrial Design. This was then converted directly into a PhD scholarship which Blair completed in 2010. Blair's PhD was working in collaboration with the CSIRO to find new products that utilised the advancements in material science. This has generated significant interest and a large proportion of Blair's work today is about helping Australian companies be more innovative to compete on a global scale. He has been awarded over \$5 million in industry-linked research, which is used to keep jobs in Australian manufacturing.

Blair's current role is Department Chair of Interior Architecture, Industrial Design and Product Design Engineering at Swinburne University of Technology. He is Head of all 3D design disciplines in the School of Design and was recently promoted to a full professor. He is the only full professor in the School of Design and at the age of 37 is the youngest person ever to be awarded this prestigious title. In 2007 Blair returned to South Korea to courageously propose to his Korean classmate who he kept in contact with since leaving Korea in 2002. He did this without ever kissing her or holding her hand and thankfully for Blair she said yes. In April this year they will celebrate their 10-year wedding anniversary and have two beautiful girls aged 5 and 8. Since Blair's first overseas trip to South Korea in 2002, he has now had to privilege to travel to 30 different countries, which makes him always appreciate coming home to Australia. He has seen some amazing cities in bizarre countries such as North Korea, Colombia, Papua New Guinea and India, and in 2012 he finally went to Hong Kong – 10 years after he thought he would be there.

On behalf of everyone involved with the Emerald Football Netball Club we congratulate Blair on his career achievements to date and his recent promotion being awarded the status and title of full Professor.

We done Blair we as a club are proud to call you one of ours!




