






D Grade



Our Mids battled hard but their ruck work was too superior, although the efforts from Triffo and Harry Leo were good.




If you were to put a brand name to Saturday the 12/8, an appropriate label might be Rollercoaster Saturday. From Thursday evening through to about 12:11 pm Saturday, the struggle of getting the required playing numbers seemingly failing, even the optimists looked worried. With the confirmed number of available players low, and the quality of players that were unavailable high, the game we had to win, a win some players pencilled in several weeks ago, suddenly looked to be a difficult task.

Not sure if it was because some players got a good night's rest, or that the pre-game cheesy music was it, but something clicked in the rooms prior to the bounce, because the focus and effort from every player was evident from the very first bounce.

Many players embraced an opportunity to lead us on the field, and Zac started the day with the words of 'Damo Who', then backed up his recent strong form with a quintessential 'captains' game.

We were also again blessed to have several of our talented group of U/18's join us, Nick Pascoe, Aaron Stuhldreier, Mitch Thomas, Brayden Wood, Brad Pepi, Dan Edwards & Tanner Thomson are all stars of the U/18's competition, and as usual played at a level that reiterated again why we speak with such confidence when talking about the club's bright future. All of these boys have played with us in the 2's on several occasions this year, and I for one am a huge fan of all seven of them.

From a coaching perspective, it is very pleasing to report there were numerous highlights throughout the game, Ed Pascoe really set the scene for us with a superb first quarter. Kev Burns was prominent all day and could of kicked 10, however Kev's performance in the last 10-15 minutes of the game didn't include a shot on goal, but it did include some of Kev's best footy of the season. Some other performances of note were the games of Marty Bass, Marty was pushed further up the ground today than usual, and Marty was instrumental in linking our defence into attack, many of the Bomber scores today involved 'distribution' through Marty. Rawley Van Haren channelled the 'old man', and relished the opportunity to set the tone of our defence. Rawley locked down his opponents, attacked the ball and any oppo player with the ball with a ferociousness that spilled the ball our way on a number of occasions, his work rate was also a catalyst for the speed in which several rebounds out of the back half resulted in our forwards enjoying far more open space than they are generally accustomed to. Harry Leo's first half was solid in the ruck, however after a little bit of a push and shove with a couple of opponents early in the third, Harry seemed to be everywhere. Harry gave us first use of the ball with some nice ruck work, used his athleticism to get around the ground like a wingman, take some nice contested marks and impact other he couldn't. With Harry's ability to run and carry the ball quickly of 30 metres then deliver a 50 metre pass to a leading target on show a number of times today, we saw plenty of evidence as to why Harry is seen as a player with huge as yet unfulfilled potential. If Harry can start to put all these facets of his game together, and perform as confidently and in the same manner as he did today each and every week, then Harry will be become a player to watch in 2018.

I most pleased with the group's overall effort, we didn't take the foot off the pedal throughout the entire game, we were able to remain focused and disciplined, and as a result the Bombers ran out to a well-earned victory.

Taking on the top of the ladder OFC with nine u/18's, someone could expect and maybe even accept that a one-sided result was the likely outcome. Being down by 5 goals at quarter time made such a result appear to be a very safe bet.

However, we were able to dig in and take the game up to the quite obviously bigger opposition. For the majority of each of the remaining 3 quarters I thought we had the better of them in terms of general play, we just couldn't convert that good work in general play into goals. We were the superior team in the attack on the ball, there were many situations where Damo (Playing Against Medical & Coaches Advice!), Jason 'Guns' Burns, Tanner Thomsen, Ed Pascoe and co, had some opposition players second guessing their commitment, via the willingness to run straight through contests to push in order to push the ball forward, a key requisite in such wet conditions.

Young Steve Kapahnke made his senior debut, and despite the conditions being non-favourable to big men, Steve put the ball into favourable positions for our midfielders, covered the heavy ground very well, taking several marks around the ground, and impacted numerous contests to bring the ball to ground. Steve was clearly the best performing big man on the ground and against a quality 2's team who had a good ruckman. We also had the senior debuts of Jake Zimmerling and Roy Pack, with both boys contributing well for us forward of centre. We also gave Jake the opportunity to rotate through the midfield and he showed all the signs of being a senior player in the very near future, perhaps even as early as 2018, which is an achievable goal for Jake in the year he turns 18.

To surmise the day; we started poorly (lacked sufficient senior player numbers), before regrouping (Led by The Prez), then stuttered a little (Clearly beaten in the 1st quarter), before finishing the day strongly with a quality team performance after quarter time.

Thanks again to all the U/18's who played today, along with their coaches and parents, you all contributed to the club's display of real camaraderie today.


