### FROM THE SENIOR COACH























After the longest preseason in history we kicked off the 2020 season at Yankalilla in Round 1 and if you thought the wait for the season was long you should have been in the coaches box with us that day waiting for our first goal for the season which came from a Senior backman, Wack Hutchinson in the third quarter. We had a much more productive second half and outscored the opposition in the final quarter. The game was one of defences and our tackling pressure on the opposition was first class. We played a very structured game and did not take too many risks with the ball going forward which cost us on the scoreboard.

The first home game was another where we applied intense pressure on the opposition, McLaren, but was not able to score enough goals into the wind which cost us the game. There was only one goal in it for much of the game with McLaren kicking a late goal on the siren to push out the margin to the largest of the day. Our field play was better than the week before with our forward entries letting us down with many kicks missing the target. The wind did make it a tough day to display our skills with most of the game played at one end.

We ventured over to Mt Compass buoyed by our performances in the first two games and had a very good first half. We dropped off in the second half with the opposition capitalising on their centre square clearance dominance which really hurt us on the small oval as they were only one kick from goal on the second possession after their centre clearances. Our second quarter was clearly our best for the year, but we did not do enough damage on the scoreboard when we had it in our half of the oval for the majority of the quarter. We showed some glimpses of what we are capable of in this game and although driving out without the points was disappointing it was a game that gave us a good indication that we are on the rise.

Overall we have seen some improvement each week in the senior squad and we are encouraged as a coaching group of what we are seeing. We are desperate to chalk up our first win as we all know our group will grow in confidence with a positive result. Although some supporters are becoming a little frustrated with our results at the moment we all need to understand we have a team of footballers where half of them have not played together before and we have a game plan with structures that is also new to the group let alone a coaching group no one knew a year ago. Keep the faith as I am sure the results will come as we have a very hard working, skilled and disciplined squad who have a want to get better.

Some very disappointing news when we were informed that we had lost Ryan "Kels" Kelly for the year to an ACL injury occurring against McLaren. A very popular new player to our club with a huge engine who will now get a role in the coach's box for the remainder of 2020 and some of 2021 until he recommences his career as a player at the Mudlarks. Kels will take over the Backs as a line coach and if his dedication to coaching is equivalent to his playing look out the boys in the backline, you may be running laps after the game if you leak easy goals.

Stick with us as we are on the up and we can't wait to celebrate that first A grade win in 2020.


