## FROM THE SENIOR COACH

Since my last report we have played five games, winning two and losing three. The rebuild continues for the club with some encouraging results on field in the development of the group and we are seeing improvement in many individuals.

Our game against Encounter Bay at home was a slog from the start with the opposition having a fast start with many dangerous medium sized forwards creating problems for our backline. The Bays also set up a wall across half back that we struggled to get through and we went into half time nine goals down. After the long break we managed to kick seven goals to the Bays five but we were too far back to record the win.

We ventured to Victor Harbor with high hopes we could record our first win for the year. In a game that was marred by wet weather and some confusing umpiring decisions our lads were able to get that win we were all striving for. The margin was only thirteen points but we appeared to have the game in our keeping after leading all day due to our team having many contributors on the day and the opposition relying on too few to carry them through the game.

Coming off the high of the Victor win we hosted ladder leader Langhorne Creek at Lark Park the week after. The coaching group were looking forward to the challenge of playing the reigning Premiers at home especially after the solid week we had on the track with the boys up and about. The game started very evenly and at half time we were only two goals down but matching it with the best in most areas. We had a very disappointing third quarter being outscored by four goals and responded in the last to outscore the Creeks, but the damage was done resulting in a forty point loss.

Our football was good enough to go with the best in the competition but we needed to become more consistent, in the six games at that stage we won many quarters against very good opposition but we were not winning four quarters which resulted in us losing our games by small margins due to being beaten badly in one quarter a game.

After the Creeks game we hosted Goolwa/Pt Elliot who, like us, had shown some good signs of improvement in their games but were not winning consistently. The weather was a typical Myponga winters day with a strong wind and intermittent showers which made for a pretty ugly game of football. The first half was very even and we went into half time a goal down. The lads responded well to the long break and come out in the second half to be all over the Magpies, kicking two goals eight for the half to the oppositions solitary point resulting in a two goal win for the Larks. It was pleasing that the team could respond to losing one of our best mids to an incorrectly awarded red card (he was found not guilty at the tribunal mid week) with many young Mudlark players stepping up to contribute to the win.

Our most recent game was our most disappointing. We went to Willunga with plans of causing an upset and were provided a football lesson in discipline, structure and team football. Willunga were well drilled and played their oval to perfection switching many times to the high side to create a free man and then executed mistake free disposal skills to go into attack numerous times to set up a fourteen goal win. Our lads will review the footage of this game on Thursday night and will learn from the opposition as we were convincingly beaten in the centre square and allowed our press to collapse when defending with some of our players going man on man when they should have been protecting space. Although a very disappointing result it will provide to us another opportunity to learn and improve on this performance in our final game against Strathalbyn at home. One interesting aspect of this game was the umpire awarding a fifty metre penalty (one of twelve fifty metre penalties for the game...?) against one of our supporters in the crowd. Imagine if they payed this rule (which does not exist) at Adelaide Oval in a Showdown game, it would be a very boring game to watch players walking up and down the field kicking goals on the back of fifty metre penalties awarded against the crowd.

We look forward to your support this week at home against Strathalbyn, lets make this our biggest crowd for the year and come and watch how the team rebounds from last week in a game of football we believe we can win. See you at the footy!






