Olinda has won all three games between you this season:

"We have been a bit depleted in the attack end this season (losing two players to pregnancy). And, with Ella Priestly away with ANL (Australian Netball League) it's taken them a little while to gel."

What's the key to a big Wandin win:

"Make sure we're not standing around watching, waiting for someone else to do the workload."

"It's going to be a great game of netball, there's some talented players out on the court."
