MEMBERS REPORT

It's been a year like no other - bushfires, a massive hailstorm and a global pandemic. Despite all of that, we continued to build community within the club and with the broader ACT basketball community to achieve our objective of promoting, encouraging and fostering basketball.

2019-20 Club Mission

The club's mission was to promote a healthy, active lifestyle and encourage a lifelong love of basketball. We endeavoured to develop fundamental basketball skills in a safe and positive environment. We also endeavoured to teach valuable life lessons of responsibility, respect, leadership, teamwork and sportsmanship. Our focus was on participation in community-based sport and the importance of dedication, self-improvement and helping others in the community.

Community within the Club

Our use of social media platforms to engage with our club community increased significantly this year. We regularly reported on the club's performance each week and featured team games, including game day photos. We launched our Instagram page in February 2020 to engage with our younger members/ players.



We continued to engage with our members through social media during lockdown - Training Tuesdays, Throwback Thursdays and an Easter Skills Competition were our more successful social media features.

The club also began work on compiling the history of TSC and while this work is still ongoing, it has become apparent that a lot of our parents played or were some way associated with our two founding clubs, Eveready and Minstrels. It is lovely that we are now seeing a number of generations of players participating in the club in various roles.

Being a part of the ACT Basketball Community

Our club was one of the most represented clubs at the 2019 NAIDOC carnival in July 2019 and we

continue to be proud supporters of this carnival.



In cooperation with the UC Capitals, Maddi Rocci acted as our Club Ambassador this year. Maddi and her Capitals team mates ran a general training session for all interested junior players and then Maddi ran a session on her own for our under 12 girls.

This, and our promotion of the UC Capitals home games on our social media, saw a marked increase in TSC members attending the games throughout the 2019 WNBL season. It was a brilliant season and great to see the Capitals win back-to-back championships.

We joined with Basketball ACT (and many other ACT sporting associations) to contribute to the 2020 Bushfire Recovery. The club donated \$400 to the NSW Rural Fire Service on behalf of all our members.



During lockdown we also pulled together an



entry for the BACT skills challenge – an initiative from Basketball ACT to keep the basketball community engaged in lockdown.

Response to the Covid-19 Pandemic

While some of our coaches could provide virtual training during the lockdown, it's just not the same. Due to the quick work of our Committee, we were one of the first Clubs to offer at venue

in-person training - pre-season training began in mid-June 2020. Allowing us to work on the players fitness before they headed back to the courts to prevent injury.

We would like to thank Capital Chemist Calwell for their generous donation of hand sanitiser which, amongst other precautions, allowed us to protect our players.

Treasurer's Report

Total Income = \$157,051.71
Total Expense = \$104,848.10
Total Profit = \$52,203.61

I am pleased to report that the Club is still in a healthy financial position.

At the end of the 2019-2020 Financial year, we had approximately \$141,000 in our bank account with an apparent profit of \$52,000 over the year.

This profit is an artifact because our income and expenses have been spread over 2 financial years with COVID delaying the start of the winter season. We'll see a reversal at the end of this year when the club will operate at a loss to correct for last year's inflated profit margin.

We have sufficient equity to cover our winter season expenses including the unexpected costs associated with COVID. We'll also be able to pre-pay summer registration fees to take advantage of the BACT early bird discount.

Our Financial records have been audited and found to be a fair representation of the income, expenditure and cash assets of the Club. The Balance Sheet, Profit and Loss statement and audit report are all attached to this report. I recommend these financial statements to the members and Committee for approval.
