Not only did the COVID-19 pandemic prevent the games and training each week for our players, it prevented the vital social outlet looked forward to by so many people across the South Croydon football community. Not seeing the smiling faces each week is something we have all missed.

The terrible situation will impact people for many years in many ways, with lives and jobs lost and many businesses shattered. Our thoughts and best wishes go out to all those impacted.

Our thanks do go to those sponsors who felt it was important that they contribute to help keep the club afloat despite their own difficult circumstances – there are many and we thank them all. We now look forward to the 2021 season, with recruiting starting again and preseason as soon as we can access grounds.

One of the ways we stayed in touch this year was through "The Dog House", our weekly cash draws and updates broadcast live on Facebook. This was a great success and certainly helped put us in a strong position. I would like to thank all 150 people who signed up, it was a great effort given the uncertainty at the time.



On the social front, we ran a successful day at the Heathmont Bowls club in late February before everything was put on hold. A mix of performances on the greens, but the usual star performers back in the clubrooms. Thanks to Caitlyn Adams and the team for their work in getting this up.



The other major happening during the year was the progress with Cheong Park. Our new lights are up and working and have now been aligned by the council. They will be a great improvement for all and should allow some night football in 2021. Additionally, we have been working with the Cricket Club and the Council on plans for the redevelopment of the Cheong Park rooms with a new two storey facility.

Plans have been signed off by both clubs and are awaiting the new Council approving the issuance of the plans for tender. The expectation is that works will begin mid-year and we have requested extra home games in the first half of 2021 to minimise the impact.



Finally, I would like to thank my fellow committee members. Whilst some may have had a slightly easier ride this year without football and netball games being played, we look forward to your help in 2021. To Fiona Schinck (Secretary), Vince Cali (Vice President), Warren French (Treasurer) and Damon Hindmarsh (Football Operations) who did not necessarily get the easier ride, I thank you for your advice and efforts across the year.

TREASURER'S REPORT

It is with pleasure that I present my treasurer's report covering season 2020.

The season that never was.

The Results

Well there is not a lot to report, no comparisons, obviously, to season 2019.

I am pleased to report that we have had a trading surplus \$31k, which puts us in good stead for the start of season 2021.

Overall funds sit at \$46k with a few small expenses still to come out once the bills arrive.

Income

There has been hard work behind the scenes in terms of revenue raising for 2020, especially from Vince with corporate sponsorship. This has come about through commitment from some key sponsors to still put their money in with little exposure for their business. The calendar, which again was a big success. A key sponsor coming through with funds that were recorded in last years' figures but had not been paid as of close of books for 2019 and with the onset of COVID-19 this may have been in doubt but they generously came through for our club.

Great job Vince, and a huge thank-you to those corporate partners and their generosity in hard times. It has not gone unnoticed.

To Steve, what a great initiative the "Doghouse" was, generating over \$13k net after GST, with some winners donating the money back to the club. This has been a great help for our cash flow to kick off next season.



Player subs in the accounts of \$6k, after refunding some players who required it, will roll-over to 2020. On this basis the subs will be lower next season so we have that money in advance.

Costs

There was very little in terms of costs due to no season. One of our largest outlays was for uniforms (jumpers, socks and shorts). With most, if not all, still in stock to kick off season 2021 so we just have it in advance. In regards to this, we had already ordered and committed to purchasing this stock and we had the funds, so it was not an issue.

NEXT SEASON:

As I say every year, the hard work does not stop.

Season 2021 will throw up its own challenges. Apart from the unknown in terms of what a season will look like, we have the added pressure of our beloved pavilion being torn down to be replaced with a fantastic new facility that we are all excited about. This is going to impact our ability to generate home game and after match function revenue. To balance out this we will have a halved salary cap from the EFL and Football Australia. It will, again, be very tight financially and we need everyone on board helping us forge ahead.

I would like to thank the executive committee for their hard work in a trying 2020. It has not been easy for all of us juggling business and work commitments and a stressful football club landscape.

COACH'S REPORT – WOMENS

2020, a football year without wins and losses, goal kickers and awards. A tough year for the community, compounded by an inability to enjoy the usual outlet that a football club and the weekend game brings to so many of us. There were, however, many positives for the club and the Women's program despite the difficulties of the year.

At the start of pre-season, we had two clear goals for the Women's program for 2020:

1. To grow the program and field two competitive



- sides every week. We wanted to ensure that not only could we field a second team each week, but that it would be resourced to ensure development and enjoyment for the players within it, and not a "poor cousin" to the Premier Side. To achieve this, player numbers needed to increase. Whilst there were a handful of players who were not returning to play in 2020, the team list had grown to <u>52 players</u> when we finalised jumper numbers in March. This was an enormous effort by the playing group, and testament to the great reputation that the club has within the community. A total of 29 new players came from other clubs, or with friends and joined the club in 2020.
- 2. To consolidate the club's position in Premier Division following promotion from the 2019 premiership. Without games having been played, it is difficult to quantify this entirely. We were, however, confident that organic improvement in skills and game-sense within the existing players, combined with the added skillset gained with new players to the club stood us in a very strong position heading into the season.

Additionally, I think it is important to acknowledge the incredible player leadership that the program has. It is literally an embarrassment of riches in this regard, and I would like to thank Kate, Dani, Sarah, Denni, Caitlyn, and Emilie for all their work and support in the year. Their efforts in helping to build a good program and keeping the group together through a tough year was elite.

I also need to thank the many people that assist, starting with Declan (Nigel) the best 2IC you could ever hope for and a fantastic coach outright for our Development team to learn and grow from. Liam (Tobes) who's assistance in planning and organising the program structurally has been invaluable.
