The strength of AFL Victoria's talent pathway has been on show for everyone to see over the past six weeks at the NAB AFL U18 Championships.

Gresham is a former member of the Victoria Kickstart side and captain of the Flying Boomerangs, and after becoming one Vic Metro's key players at the recent U18 Championships, is now a step closer to achieving his AFL dream.

While our high performance academies and TAC Cup regions do an extraordinary amount of work to prepare players for the elite level, community football continues to be the backbone of our game.

These young athletes are where they are today because of the opportunities provided by junior football clubs and NAB Auskick clinics, and the commitment of coaches, coordinators, volunteers and of course their parents.

We wish all players the best of luck as they enter the second half of the TAC Cup season and for whatever the future holds.

Scott's shock to the system



Anthony Scott found the jump from local football to the Peter Jackson VFL to be a pretty big change at first.

Last year, the 20-year-old Richmond wingman put together a season for Old Trinity in the VAFA that made many in the football world sit up and take notice.

After leaving the Oakleigh Chargers' TAC Cup program at the end of 2013 without achieving his goal of being drafted into the AFL, Scott won the VAFA's Rising Star award, represented the VAFA in its U19 squad and featured in the AFL Victoria Young Guns Game.

The Tigers snapped up the classy 178cm left-footer, but Scott initially wasn't fully prepared for the shift to a more professional football environment.

"When I'd just finished Year 12 and went and played for Old Trinity, I think my pre-season probably started in February, whereas when I went down to Richmond last year, it all kicked off in November and it was very strict from day one," Scott said.

"It ended up being a shock to my body as well, because I sustained a bit of a groin injury in the second week of pre-season.

"I think it's just that a step up in the workload was a bit too much for my body to handle and I ended up missing close to four months due to this niggling injury that I couldn't quite get over.

"It wasn't anything I sustained at training in an incident – it was just that build-up from the extra running that I hadn't really done before, and I couldn't really handle it."

Other strict adjustments Scott has had to make at Richmond include following individually tailored gym programs, half-hour recovery sessions after training and shorter, more intense training sessions during the season proper.

"That's just totally different to anything in the VAFA," Scott said.

What he does on-field has changed too.

The need to replicate what Richmond is doing at the elite level in order to aid the development of the younger AFL-listed Tigers means the VFL club's style of play has also come as a shock to Scott.

"In terms of the size of your opponents, I was kind of seasoned to that in the VAFA last year," he said.

"But the big difference for me was just the pace of the game and the need to make decisions a lot quicker.

"Whether that's with the footy or without it, you just find that blokes are getting rid of the ball quicker, you've got to be running to the right spots and you've got to be anticipating the play more than you would in the VAFA."

The changes don't stop there, either.

Having played on a wing throughout his junior career, as well as during his time with Oakleigh and Old Trinity, Scott was suddenly thrust into an unfamiliar forward line role at the behest of Richmond coach Tim Clarke.

"During pre-season I spoke to Tim just to see where I was at coming into the season and he mentioned a forward role, which was a bit surprising at first," Scott said.

"But then he explained to me how, due to the set up of the list with the AFL players (needing to be accommodated), playing forward would give me a good opportunity to actually play games in the side."

Scott came around to the idea, and started gaining confidence once he learnt the team's structures and had played some practice matches.

The VFL Academy member has gone on to play all bar one match in 2015, booting three goals from nine games and featuring in Richmond's best players twice.

From his significant time spent playing on a wing, Scott said his natural strengths of good ball use, run-and-carry with the ball and "just being able to do things that some other players can't" have translated well to his new role.

However, certain areas have required extra attention.

"Playing on a wing, you're not really that inclined to do the defensive acts and I kind of got away with not doing that much," Scott said.

"But playing forward now, you realise how important the defensive stuff is.

"I've had to keep reminding myself that 'you need to go for tackles', and tackling someone inside 50 is just as important as maybe giving off a handball to set up a goal."

After an enjoyable year spent playing with school mates at Old Trinity, the jump to VFL level has been a shock to the system on many levels as Anthony Scott attempts to eventually crack the AFL.

But if he does make it there one day, now at least, he'll know what to expect.

Coughlan's change of direction

Nick Coughlan is doing things
differently in 2015.

After missing out on being drafted to the AFL last year, he has a new attitude to football, is playing in a new position, living in a new city and representing a new club.

The 195cm 18-year-old from Albury was disappointed when his name wasn't read out by an AFL club in November, but he's using that disappointment to craft an impressive season with Murray as an overage player in the TAC Cup and with Footscray in the Peter Jackson VFL. "I haven't given it (possibly being drafted) a thought this year," Coughlan said.

"I'm just trying to enjoy my footy rather than worrying about what will happen at the end of the year, because that's what sort of drove me down a little bit last year.

"After every game, I'd think 'Oh, I hope the recruiters saw that', whereas this year I'm more focused on if the team does well, we're more likely to have success and therefore I'm more likely to have success."

The Bushrangers have certainly been successful so far in 2015, sitting in second spot on the ladder with a record of 7-3.

A factor in that success is Coughlan's switch from attack into defence, which has seen him named in Murray's best players six times in nine games played.

"Last year we had a few key backs in Caleb Marchbank and Dave Mennen, and we didn't really have a key forward, so I set up there," Coughlan said.

"We just decided that after last year when I didn't play very well and had an interrupted season (through injury), it might be a good idea to turn around and have a go down back, and it's paid off."

As a Hawthorn supporter, Coughlan has taken note of the way Hawk key defenders Josh Gibson and Brian Lake can expertly balance defence and attack.

In a similar vein, his natural strength of long kicking has been put to good use by the Bushrangers' coaches.

"They're sort of giving me a licence – when I can go on the attack – to go as hard as I can," Coughlan said.

"The way (Gibson and Lake) are able to read the ball, watch it come in and then work off their man is something I feel I can do fairly well.

"You can chase around your opponent all day and then all of a sudden you're able to run off, and you're always running in the same direction – I like that aspect of the game."

Another new experience for Coughlan this year has been moving to the big smoke of Melbourne.

The country boy is now cooking and cleaning for himself, and has been training with Footscray since March.

On Sunday, Coughlan played his third game for the Bulldogs as the 23rd man, in what was another chance to show his wares to AFL recruiters.

They'd know that 19-year-old Murray players have a good track record of being drafted in recent years, with Collingwood's Jamie Elliott (2011), Fremantle's Matt Taberner (2012), Hawthorn's Daniel Howe (2014) and Richmond's Nathan Drummond (2014) all coming through the club.

But this year – one of many changes for Nick Coughlan – he won't be worrying too much about what those recruiters are thinking.

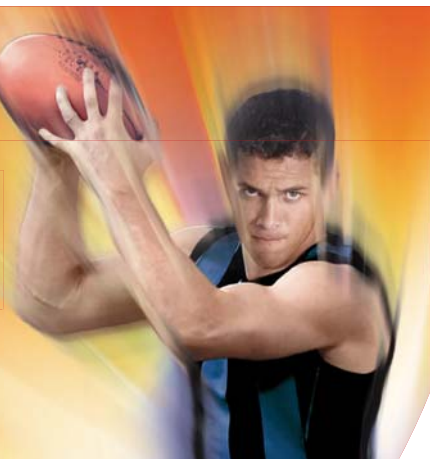

Gallucci launches from U16 Champs

As the 2015 NAB AFL U16 Championships kick off in Queensland on Saturday, last year's carnival MVP for Vic Metro is continuing his strong form in this year's U18 Championships and TAC Cup as a 17-year-old.

The Eastern Ranges' Jordan Gallucci is proof of how the U16 Championships can launch talented young footballers to bigger and better things.

At last year's carnival, the Vic Metro coaches threw Gallucci onto the half-back line – a position he'd only played once before in a competitive match – and it has certainly paid dividends for the youngster from Lilydale.

"It was a little bit of a shock in terms of where I'd be playing," Gallucci said.

"All throughout the (Vic Metro) training, it was through the midfield – and that's where I played all my junior football – but I got thrown down back (in the first match) and I really enjoyed it."

Gallucci used his skillful boot and ability to run and carry the ball at speed to drive Metro forward, and ended up being named Metro's best player across the three matches.

Soon after, Gallucci made his TAC Cup debut for the Ranges as a 16-year-old in August, before starting this year with Eastern in that same position he made his own at the U16 Championships.

"I think I'm comfortable down there," Gallucci said.

"I've been watching Chris Yarran a lot this year in terms of playing off a half-back flank because I like his run and the way he uses the ball.

"(But) I try and play my own style of game."

Gallucci's style saw him selected in this year's Vic Metro U18 Championships squad, impressing in his three matches so far at the top underage representative level.

The jump from starring at the U16 representative level to performing consistently in the elite U18 competitions

against older boys can seem like a potentially difficult one to handle.

But Gallucci said many of his teammates from last year's U16 Championships – including Oakleigh Charger Sam McLarty and Sandringham Dragon Jack Scrimshaw, who were also selected in Vic Metro's U18 squad this year – have managed the jump well.

"I think they've been able to go into their TAC Cup side and really make a stamp on where they're going to play and how they're going to play, which is really good," Gallucci said.

"It's always challenging going from that (U16) level and then going up again, but I think all the boys have done their best and they're playing some really good footy."

North Ballarat Rebel Jarrod Berry is another 2014 U16 Championships MVP who has adapted well to U18 representative football, impressing in this year's title-winning Vic Country team as a 17-year-old.

The North Ballarat Rebels moved two games clear on top of the TAC Cup ladder after seeing off the no.2 team in the league for the second consecutive week in Round 11.

Having dismissed the challenge of the Murray Bushrangers in Round 10, the Rebels accounted for the Dandenong Stingrays by 23 points away from home at Shepley Oval.

The league leaders did it despite having two fewer scoring shots than the Stingrays and being severely beaten at the clearances, but North Ballarat's pressure forced Dandenong into error and the Rebels capitalised with efficiency in front of goal.

200cm big man Lloyd Meek was North Ballarat's best, booting two goals to go along with 14 hitouts.

On a high-powered weekend of TAC Cup football, the Geelong Falcons and Murray Bushrangers waged a 3 vs 4 battle that ended with Murray returning to second position on the ladder after recording a hard-fought nine-point win at RAMS Arena.

The Bushrangers trailed by three points at the last change, but kicked four goals to two in the final quarter to secure the victory. Murray's Clayton Oliver starred with game highs of 27 disposals, eight clearances and 11 tackles.

Continuing the theme of the round, the fifth-placed Eastern Ranges met sixth-placed Oakleigh Chargers in another even match-up.

The Chargers prevailed by seven points, but not before suffering a huge scare in the last quarter as the Ranges flew home from a 29-point deficit at three-quarter time.

In Round 11's other matches:

- The Gippsland Power solidified its position in the top eight with a 33-point defeat of the Bendigo Pioneers at RAMS Arena;
- The Sandringham Dragons claimed a much-needed third win of the season by six points over the Calder Cannons at Trevor Barker Beach Oval; and
- The Northern Knights' second victory of 2015 by 20 points against the Western Jets at Preston City Oval kept the Jets grounded on the bottom of the ladder.

Gippsland isn't lacking for height at ruck contests, dominating the hitouts in its win against Bendigo 68 to 28. 191cm Joshua Patullo had 38 of those hitouts, while 187cm Matthew De Bruin had 26. Their work allowed the Power to gain a 34-31 advantage in clearances over the Pioneers.

Aaron Fenton had a day out in Eastern's tight loss to Oakleigh, doing all he could in an attempt to drag the Ranges over the line. To go along with 30 disposals, the North Ringwood product had seven clearances, nine inside-50s and 14 tackles. But despite his team beating the Chargers in those last three statistical categories, Eastern couldn't win on the scoreboard.

Sandringham's Tom Wilkinson was a difference maker in the middle during the Dragons' close win against Calder. The 19-year-old demonstrated his maturity in the clinches, winning a game-high 12 clearances to continually drive the ball forward for his team. Wilkinson's 34 disposals and two goals came in handy for Sandy too!

Country wraps up U18 Champs title

Vic Country secured the national title in Round 5 of the NAB AFL U18 Championships at Simonds Stadium in Geelong by recording back-to-back wins over South Australia.

The final games (Round 6) of the Championships were played on Wednesday (Vic Metro vs SA at Etihad Stadium) and Thursday (Vic Country vs Western Australia at Simonds Stadium).

But in Round 5, Josh Schache (Murray Bushrangers) again showed his prowess up forward for Country with strong marking (eight marks) and accurate kicking (6.2 from 13 disposals), while the Dandenong Stingrays trio of Jacob Weitering (13 disposals, eight marks), Bailey Rice (18 disposals, six marks) and Kieran Collins (10 disposals, six marks) restricted the SA forwards.

Rhys Mathieson (Geelong Falcons) led the clearances in the middle with another strong performance (18 disposals), while Gach Nyuon (Dandenong) had his best game of the Championships, shouldering the ruck duties but also proving effective around the ground (22 hitouts, 15 disposals).

After a strong first quarter, in which it kicked the first four goals of the game, Country was challenged by SA in the second term and held just a one-point lead going into the second half.

But Schache and Ben Ainsworth (Gippsland Power) spearheaded a five-goal-to-nil third term that helped set up the win, the pair adding two goals apiece. It gave the home team a commanding 30-point lead at the final break, which was enough of a buffer in the last quarter to hold on for an 11-point win.

In the second game at Simonds Stadium, Vic Metro was unable to record back-to-back wins against WA, overrun in the final term to suffer an 18-point defeat.

After leading by 11 points at three-quarter time, WA raced home with a five-goal-to-nil last quarter to record their second win of the Championships.

Nick O’Kearney (Calder Cannons) led the way in the middle with 28 disposals to be among his team’s best with Calder teammate Callum Moore (seven marks), Northern Knight Jade Gresham (20 disposals, two goals, six inside 50s), Sandringham Dragon Theo Thompson (10 disposals) and Oakleigh Chargers pair Alex Morgan (15 disposals) and Jack Firms.

Jobe brings up double-ton

Essendon champion Jobe Watson will play his 200th AFL match when the Bombers face St Kilda at Etihad Stadium on Sunday.

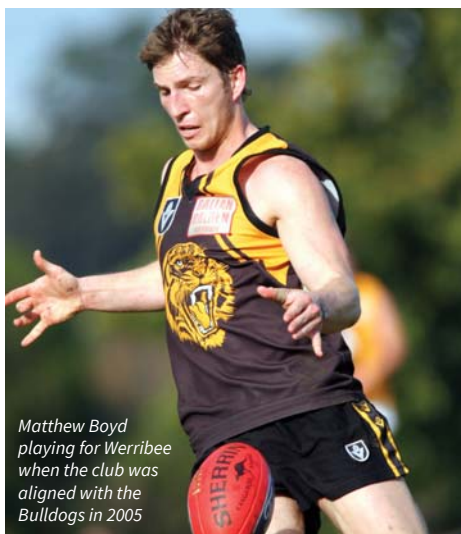
The 30-year-old has captained the club where his father Tim became a household name since 2010, becoming known in his own right for his ball-winning ability and often inspirational competitiveness.

Watson was drafted by Essendon from the Sandringham Dragons with pick no.40 in the 2002 AFL Draft as a father-son selection.

The big-bodied midfielder initially drew criticism for his kicking and aerobic capacity but, after working hard on his skills and fitness, quickly developed into one of the game's premier on-ballers.

He won the Brownlow Medal following a sensational season in 2012, was named in the All-Australian team in 2012 and 2013, and won Essendon's best-and-fairest award in 2009, 2010 and 2012.

Boyd notches 250

One of the Western Bulldogs' greatest servants, Matthew Boyd, will bring up his 250th AFL match against Carlton at Etihad Stadium on Saturday night.

The 32-year-old has become known for his uncompromising attack on the ball and ability to rack up disposals over a long career at the elite level.

A former Dandenong Stingrays player, Boyd was selected by the Bulldogs at pick no.23 in the 2002 Rookie Draft from Frankston in the VFL and has gone on to become one of the AFL's biggest rookie-draft success stories.

He captained the Bulldogs from 2011-2013, was named in the All Australian team in 2009 and 2011, and claimed the Western Bulldogs' best-and-fairest award in 2009, 2011 and 2012.

Journeymen make it to 50 games

After longer-than-expected journeys to 50 AFL games, North Melbourne's Robbie Tarrant and Adelaide's Tom Lynch will celebrate their milestones this weekend.

26-year-old Tarrant has been regularly cut down by injury during his eight-year career with the Kangaroos, but has always shown big-marking ability in defence or up forward since being selected at pick no.15 in the 2007 Draft.

The former Bendigo Pioneer appears to have finally found his place in North Melbourne's senior team as a key defender in 2015, playing in every match since Round 3.

Tarrant will bring up his milestone against Gold Coast at Metricon Stadium on Saturday.

24-year-old Lynch has also suffered from a lack of opportunity and injuries during stints with St Kilda – which picked him at no.13 in the 2008 Draft – and Adelaide.

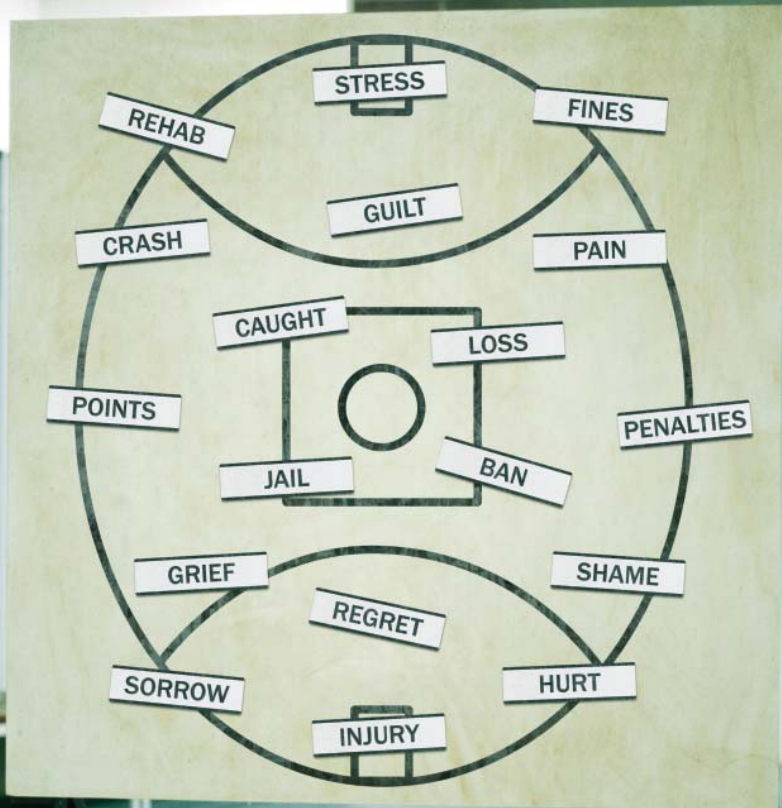
The versatile 191cm forward played just six games during three seasons with the Saints before crossing to the Crows for the 2012 season.
