INTRODUCTION

Since the dawn of time, French Polynesia has been a land of stories and legends, resolutely turned towards the lagoon and the Pacific Ocean. The 2027 Tahiti Games are the perfect opportunity to welcome the brothers and sisters of the Pacific, to write together a page of common history. Sport has always set the pace of Polynesian life. As outstanding navigators, they are endowed with extraordinary physical abilities and this is found in both ancestral sports and more modern disciplines.

The octopus, fe'e, feke, heke or'eke in the languages of the Polynesian Triangle, is much more than a simple seafood in the culture of our archipelagos. It is the symbol of the bond that unites all the islands together. This slimy, and therefore slippery, animal, which escapes easily when you try to catch it but which has a great capacity to cling, was one of the emblems of navigation in ancient times. The octopus is also the most important animal mentioned in the Polynesian myth of the creation of the world.



THE OCTOPUS IS A PIROGUE

For Polynesians, the sea has never been an obstacle. Land and sea are a continuum, thanks to the pirogue that was used to link the islands. And the octopus was used to symbolise this link. The octopus will be found in the pirogue and in the journey that unites the islands.

THE OCTOPUS IS A JOURNEY AT SEA

In Marquesan, heke is therefore the octopus, but is also the verb "to glide", in the sense of easy movement: to go from the top of a valley towards the shore, to sail at sea downwind or following the currents, it being understood that most of the time it is a current and an easterly wind.

THE OCTOPUS IS THE LINK BETWEEN THE POLYNESIANS AND THE OTHER PEOPLES OF OCEANIA

The octopus is therefore the pirogue and the journey, in the sense that they serve as a link between the islands. It represents those commercial or diplomatic expeditions that take advantage of favourable winds, or those great migrations in search of a new land. A long-distance relationship again revealed in the meaning of the words.

The octopus's tentacles are said to be aveave; there are eight of them. They symbolise the link, rendered by ave (filament). The eight tentacles of the octopus are the eight routes that link all the islands of Polynesia to Taputapuatea, Raiatea, and the other peoples of Oceania.





EDITO

After the successive setbacks to the bid for the 2019 and 2023 Pacific Games, French Polynesia, through the Olympic Committee of French Polynesia (COPF) and its management team, reiterates its strong desire to organise the 18th Pacific Games in 2027.

The South Pacific Games (original name) were born from a common will of the leaders of the countries in the region. They allowed and will allow the different peoples to meet through the organisation of sports competitions facilitating conviviality, the exchange of cultures and especially the basics of how to live together, which I wish to see perpetuated.

French Polynesia has already twice organised the Pacific Games, the fourth edition in 1971 and the tenth in 1995, with the success that we know and that the peoples present were able to appreciate despite the particular nature of those of 1995.

Our country is ready to take up the challenge of hosting all the athletes and officials of the participating countries in the true tradition typical of the Polynesian people.

The team that I have been leading since December 2017 and which will be re-elected in 2019 is looking forward to organising these 18th Pacific Games and making them a success. But first and foremost, we must win this bid so that together we can deliver the most beautiful Games of the Pacific area and celebrate them with dignity.

Please, let me wish you a warm welcome in 2027 in... Tahiti.

II • VISION 2027



The Pacific Games are the largest sporting gathering of the peoples of Oceania, with more than 5,000 athletes and officials from 24 nations, islands and territories coming together to defend their colours through 24 sporting disciplines.

They offer one of the rare opportunities for the countries and nations of the great ocean to come together. It is a sporting event, but also a fraternal gathering. Meetings, dialogue, cultural enrichment through mixing and sharing are therefore the key words of these Games.

32 YEARS OF WAITING FOR TAHITI

Since the first Pacific Games in Fiji in 1963, Tahiti has already had the honour of hosting the most important sporting event in the Pacific island, on the occasion of the 4th Pacific Games in 1971 and the 10th Pacific Games in 1995.

In 2027, 32 years will have elapsed before Tahiti will once again host this event.

This long period explains Tahiti's desire to celebrate the fraternal relations that bind the peoples of Oceania and to once again give concrete expression to the major principles set out in the Charter of the Games by bidding to organise the 18th Pacific Games.

If our bid is successful, Tahiti would join the group of countries that will have organised the Pacific Games three times, namely: Fiji, New Caledonia, Papua New Guinea and Samoa.

This approach will mobilise several thousand volunteers within the sports movement and Polynesian society in general.

Indeed, this would reinforce the eminent place of sport as a vector for individual self-improvement and as a factor of cohesion in Polynesian society.

The Polynesian sports movement, with its thousands of volunteers and its 72,506 members, will



therefore give the best of itself. Our country is ready to respond to the new demands of high-level sport and to put at the disposal of the athletes of the Pacific, the facilities and equipment necessary for the accomplishment of their sporting feats.





A NEW ERA FOR THE POLYNESIAN SPORTS MOVEMENT

Tahiti had already unsuccessfully bid for the 2019 and 2023 Pacific Games, demonstrating its eagerness and desire to welcome all the peoples of Oceania to its country. Tonga and the Solomon Islands certainly had stronger bids, but Tahiti's new bid is ambitious and will be placed under the sign of a new dynamic.

The Polynesian Sports Movement has gone through a difficult period in recent years. Beyond the unsuccessful bids for 2019 and 2023, a sports "crisis" has shaken French Polynesia. Today, a new team has been set up at the head of the COPF (Olympic Committee of French Polynesia). Conflicts and disagreements are behind us and we are starting off again on solid foundations with a double objective: the 2024 Paris Olympic Games and the 2027 Pacific Tahiti Games.

The new call for bids that has been launched by the Games Council for 2027 is a perfect opportunity. We want to be worthy of our hosting tradition and all means will be mobilised to this end, both in terms of accommodation for officials and athletes, and in terms of transport and communication.

The support of the official authorities and the mayors of the municipalities concerned is a strong sign of this mobilisation. The organisation of these Games contributes to a better integration of our country into the regional environment. The nations of the Pacific deeply wish to bring their citizens closer together and create this feeling of "Oceanian community" and solidarity between the peoples of Oceania. We are ready to help the countries of the region discover or rediscover the friendship, authenticity and legendary hospitality of the Polynesian people.

Beyond sport, Polynesians, Micronesians and Melanesians all live in the same ocean and must remain united in the face of the difficulties and challenges of the 21st century. Cyclones, health epidemics, labour migration are all difficulties that the island states of Oceania must face while at the same time supporting each other.

Furthermore, faced with the problem of rising sea levels due to global warming, the countries and territories of Oceania were able, on the occasion of the Pacific Islands Forum in 2014, to launch a call for rescue and ask for help from the Industrialised Countries since the situation is worsening year by year. Sport is federating peoples and if it can further

strengthen agreements to consolidate regional cooperation, we will have achieved our goal.

If Tahiti and the city of Piraé (and the cities of the urban agglomeration of Papeete) were chosen as the host country and city, everything will be done, in compliance with the rules of the Pacific Games Council, to ensure that these Games will be the greatest celebration of sport offered to Oceania in 2027.

The construction or upgrading of sports infrastructures and the need to have a village to accommodate several thousand athletes and officials are, of course, major investments, but these projects can only strengthen the sporting practice of several tens of thousands of citizens and the rise to the top level of young Polynesians. Our national and international results in certain flagship disciplines already work in our favour and this is all the more reinforced by the choice of Paris 2024 to hold its surfing competition on the Territory of French Polynesia.

As you will have understood, Tahiti and all of French Polynesia are ready to organise these 18th Pacific Games 2027 and would be proud to welcome the brothers and sisters from the Pacific during this period of 15 days.

A. PRESENTATION OF FRENCH POLYNESIA

THE POPULATION

With necklaces of fragrant flowers, Polynesians welcome relatives and friends as they get off the plane or boat. They use necklaces of shells, not ephemeral these ones, to say goodbye when one of them leaves the island.

A visitor is always welcome and in all the “fare”, these traditional houses. Extra beds await those who, coming from other archipelagos, would need a roof over their heads. They are immediately given a place at the table without ever being asked the for their departure date...

Welcoming, generous, humorous and kindly mocking, Polynesians are very “bon vivants” (they like the good things)! They do not miss a single opportunity to pick up drums and “ukulele”, dance until they are out of breath and enjoy succulent dishes around a Tahitian oven.

Whether they manage major international business, are university professors, craftsmen, secretaries or sell taro and yams from their own plot of land by the side of the road belt, they live in their islands to the rhythm of nature, all of them as much as they are.

Deeply attached to their “fenua”, their country with its lagoons and the ocean that surrounds it, Polynesians love the hours spent in their pirogues fishing or dreaming near the reef on the swell of the ocean...

THE POPULATION IN FIGURES

Estimated at 277,400 inhabitants on 31 December 2018, the Polynesian population is young. About 40% of the population is under 19 years old, but the population appears to be ageing. Indeed, between the last two censuses (2012 and 2017), it is the over-75 age group that has grown the most, while the under-19 age group has decreased.

There is a strong geographical concentration with the Windward Islands, which concentrate a little over three quarters of the inhabitants, notably Tahiti, which had 207,330 inhabitants in 2017. The population of French Polynesia has increased by 48,600 people over the last twenty years, it was 228,800 inhabitants on 31 December 1998 compared to 277,400 in 2018.

GEOGRAPHY

French Polynesia is a large Oceanian country, since its land surface of 3251 km² is made up of 118 islands in the middle of the ocean. Its exclusive economic maritime zone covers an area of 5.5 million km².

French Polynesia is made up of 5 archipelagos: the Society, the Tuamotu, the Gambier, the Marquesas and the Austral Islands.

With a surface area of 1,042 km², Tahiti is the largest island in French Polynesia. The island reaches a maximum length of 60 km (on the north-west - south-east diagonal, including the peninsula) and a width of 30 km on the main part. The total perimeter of the island reaches 190 km, and that of Tahiti Nui 120 km.

THE INSTITUTIONS

French Polynesia is an overseas collectivity (C.O.M), a “country that governs itself freely and democratically”. French Polynesia is autonomous in all areas except security and public order, justice, currency, university education, immigration and nationality, defence and foreign affairs and the guarantee of public freedoms. There are 5 major institutions which are the major actors in the political life of French Polynesia:

01 THE PRESIDENT OF POLYNESIA

He/she is elected by the Polynesian Assembly from among its members. He/she represents the country, signs international conventions, appoints ministers, determines their functions and attributions and publishes the acts of the various institutions of French Polynesia in the Official Journal of French Polynesia. The President also directs the administration, promulgates the country’s laws, can take regulatory acts and has a power of appointment. He can also conclude agreements with the municipalities and the State.

02 THE GOVERNMENT OF POLYNESIA

The President of French Polynesia chooses the ministers making up the government. The Vice-President, in addition to his/her ministerial portfolio, is responsible for acting for the President of French Polynesia when he/she is absent or prevented from attending. He/she chairs the Council of Ministers when the President is absent. The Council of Ministers has, among other things, the prerogative to adopt legal standards in matters within his/her jurisdiction, to make appointments (heads of department, directors of public establishments, representatives of French Polynesia on the Boards of Directors of semi-public companies). He/she may be consulted by the State for draft decrees.

03 THE ASSEMBLY OF FRENCH POLYNESIA

It is composed of 57 members elected for five years by direct universal suffrage and representing the five archipelagos of French Polynesia (Windward Islands, Leeward Islands, Austral Islands, Tuamotu-Gambier and Marquesas Islands). It adopts deliberations, but also “laws of the land”, the latter being subject to the control of the Council of State in Paris. The 57 members of the Assembly of French Polynesia elect the president of this institution and vote each year on the budget of French Polynesia.

04 THE ECONOMIC, SOCIAL AND CULTURAL COUNCIL

It gives its opinion, notably on projects of an economic and social nature and on the “laws of the land” presented by the Government of French Polynesia. The Economic, Social and Cultural Council is composed of 48 members, appointed for a period of four years. They are divided into three colleges (employees, entrepreneurs, associations). Consultation of the CESC is compulsory for the laws of the country of an economic or social nature. The CESC can also decide on its own on various subjects if two thirds of its members so decide.

05 THE HIGH COMMISSIONER OF THE REPUBLIC

He/she represents the French State in French Polynesia. He/she is the depositary of the powers of the French Republic and is responsible in particular for compliance with laws and international commitments, public order and administrative control.





PEARL FARMING

Pearl farming is an emblematic sector of the Polynesian economy. The pearl is a source of income for the remote archipelagos and of foreign currency for the country (1st item in the export of goods).

The Tahitian pearl enjoys an excellent reputation for quality on the international market and is in fact a benchmark against which all pearl production throughout the world is compared.

CULTURE

The roots of Polynesian culture lie at the sources of the sacred. In ancient times, artistic creation was a religious act. This was true of the music, shows, dances, and even magnificent feasts led by the "arioi", a community of beauty troubadours, who went from island to island in times of plenty, celebrating rites of joy and fertility, an ode to the generous Mother Earth and the god Oro.

By shaping their "pahu", large drums with a deep tone and their small "to'ere", slit drums that crackle under the wand like green wood fire, "them who knew" felt invested with the magical power to create these objects that would tear the silence.

In the same way, the builders of "va'a" were aware of the power that their art gave to the elaborate prow that would dominate the swells, a power that was mastered in their own way by those who knew the art of knotting fibres, of shaping mother-of-pearl hooks, or of tattooing complex patterns on the skin that would give individuals their human, social and religious identity.

Thus, the "Maohi" culture is expressed in many dimensions: community spirit and extended family, language, crafts, music, dance, sculpture, traditional sports, traditional navigation and fishing, subsistence agriculture, religion, culinary preparations, traditional medicines and massages, legends, genealogy...

The population of some archipelagos has its own vernacular language (Marquesan, Australs, Tuamotu-Gambier). In the Polynesian islands, today as in the past, the cultural arts draw their inspiration from fervour.

ECONOMY

French Polynesia is considered as a country with a high standard of living, thanks mainly to its membership of the French community. It is doing rather well according to an assessment carried out at the end of 2019, with a GDP (Gross Domestic Product) that is increasing by 2.5 points thanks to private



and public investment and household consumption. As for employment, it is increasing by 3.8%.

French Polynesia's economy is considered to be that of a developed country. Tourism and pearl culture are the main economic activities.



TOURISM IN A FEW WORDS

French Polynesia's leading export resource, tourism contributes up to 7% of the GDP. The number of tourists exceeds 200,000 people per year.

Revenue-generating tourist accommodation is divided between the hotel industry, which accommodates two thirds of the tourists, and the cruise sector. The hotel complex, concentrated in Tahiti, Bora-Bora and Moorea, has been greatly modernised and the hotel capacity has nearly 3000 graded rooms and several hundred units in guest houses.

This makes it possible to organise relatively large international events without having to worry about accommodation issues.

GENERAL INFORMATION

WATER

In French Polynesia, running drinking water is of high quality. Our visitors also have the choice of drinking local or exported mineral water.

ELECTRICITY

The power supply is 220 V/60 Hz. The electric outlets are European made. Foreign plug adapters can be found onsite.

TIMETABLE

On the same time zone as Honolulu in the Hawaiian Islands, Tahiti is at -10 h GMT ahead of New Caledonia by 3h (-1 day) and New Zealand by 2h (-1 day).

CURRENCIES

The exchange rate is such that 1 euro equals 119,332 CFP franc. In March 2020, the main exchange rates of the currencies of Oceanian countries are:

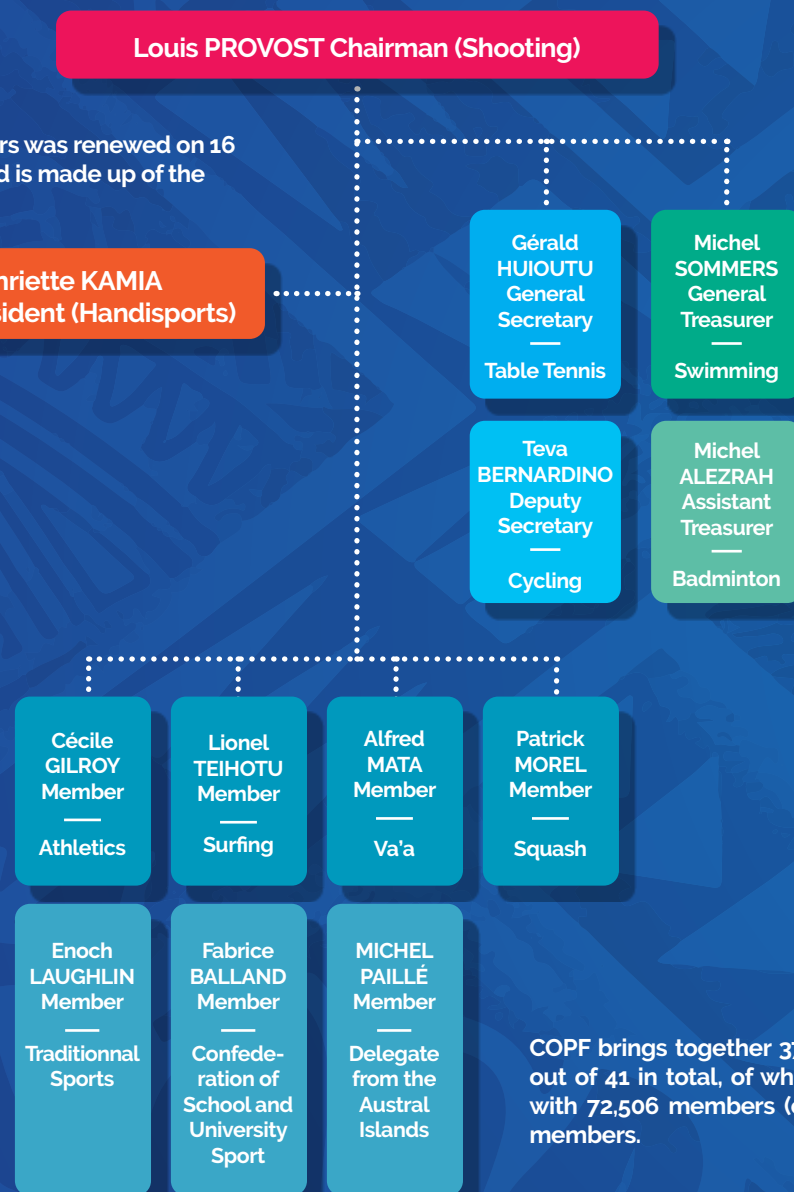
B. THE POLYNESIAN SPORTS MOVEMENT

PRESENTATION

Founded on 3 January 1973, the Olympic Committee of French Polynesia (COPF) is governed by the law of 1 July 1901. It is organised by statutes adopted on 23 August 2018 in accordance with the rules of the Olympic Charter and in compliance with article 12 of the amended Deliberation No. 99/APF of 14 October 1999 relating to the organisation and promotion of physical and sports activities in French Polynesia.

Its main purpose is to bring together the sports federations of French Polynesia and to represent the Polynesian Sports Movement for all matters of general interest, in particular with the public authorities and official bodies of French Polynesia, Metropolitan France, the Asia-Pacific region and the World, including the Pacific Games Council, the French National Olympic and Sports Committee and the International Olympic Committee.

Its Board of Directors was renewed on 16 November 2019 and is made up of the following persons:



COPF brings together 37 sports federations, out of 41 in total, of which 887 associations with 72,506 members (civil and school) are members.

AMBITION AND MAJOR PROJECTS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF HIGH-LEVEL SPORT / CREATING A MUST-WIN IDENTITY

The development towards high level, and therefore performance, is today a strategic axis for the French Polynesian Olympic Committee.

TAHITI - A HIGH-PERFORMANCE NATION IN CONSTANT SEARCH OF PROGRESS

Indeed, Tahiti has not hosted the Pacific Games since 1995, and despite this, it remains one of the most representative nations with more than encouraging results. Nevertheless, some delegations, once not as good as Tahiti, are catching up in certain disciplines, or even becoming more successful.

This is the case, for example, of Papua New Guinea, which finished 2nd at the 2019 Pacific Games, and which has been able to take full advantage of the organisation of the 2015 Games by developing, as soon as the Games were awarded, the High-Level branch, which now dominates Tahiti in several sectors.

This is the reason why the Olympic Committee of French Polynesia has set up a project called "COPF 2027" which aims to improve the performance of Polynesian athletes in 2023 and obtain the Pacific Games in 2027. It is therefore necessary to know why before knowing how!

TOWARDS AN OVERHAUL OF THE COUNTRY'S SPORTS INFRASTRUCTURES

It is above all a performance, social, structural and economic project because we associate within this project all the local actors who need to come together around a common project after years of political instability.

Today, political calm has returned and it is essential and necessary to upgrade our infrastructures, some of which date back to the 1970s, which is no longer acceptable if we wish to make progress in sport.

Since 2019, French Polynesia has been working on a global restructuring in the coming years, with our sports infrastructures needing to be either renovated or rebuilt to meet international standards. Therefore, the French Polynesian Olympic Committee has proposed to all the sports federations a 7-year programme based on performance and high performance.



A FEDERATIVE PROJECT AIMED AT MOBILISING THE ENTIRE TERRITORY AND THE SOCIAL, SPORTING AND ECONOMIC STAKEHOLDERS

First of all, by communicating as much and as well as possible in order to recreate a link between the federations but also with the authorities and the population who need to know what the sports movement wishes to propose over the next few years.

Build a “must-win culture” by instilling in athletes, coaches and elected officials the obligation to commitment, to requirements, finally, to want to win. To achieve this, we must optimise our strengths by proposing existing (but little or poorly used) or innovative means to secure technical executives and/or administrative officers within the various federations. Our project is also based on a common objective, which is to improve the performance of our athletes in 2023 in order to be successful in 2027, the year representing the main objective of this project, i.e. hosting the Pacific Games in Tahiti.

We must therefore share this project with all the local stakeholders such as businesses, municipalities, schools and also the neighbourhoods that will be the providers of volunteers for the Games.

In this respect, it is planned to include the Games of the archipelagos (Austral, Marquesas, Tuamotu/ Gambier, Leeward and Leeward Islands) into our performance and talent identification programme in order to associate our distant islands with our project. We also intend to share our project outside

our borders with partners such as the CNOF (French National Olympic and Sports Committee) and French Federations to help us on technical and financial aspects. We would like to extend this sharing with International Federations and certain Pacific countries if they wish, by pooling our resources to help them also to progress. Our desire is therefore to perform while sharing with all those who will support our project.

Within our country, it is essential to federate all the actors around this common project if we want it to succeed. This is the reason why the Olympic Committee of French Polynesia has already set up a seminar bringing together the whole sports movement and the authorities (Ministry and its services, education, and municipalities) so that they understand that we must all unite around the same objective to be better and host the Pacific Games. Training our technicians, referees, managers, volunteers and athletes will also be an important and necessary axis.

Commitment, requirement and desire will be the pillars of this project because to host the Pacific Games, we know that we will have (as in competition) serious and very high-level opponents, and it will be important to show what we are capable of today because only the first place counts! Hosting the Pacific Games is completely in line with our performance project “COPF 2027” with a schedule

and a consistent budget that will allow our athletes to express themselves in the best possible way for the coming years.



C. FOCUS ON TRADITIONAL SPORTS

Tahiti greatly supports the development of traditional sports such as va'a and maohi sports.

THE VA'A

Anchored in the cultural heritage, va'a is the main and ultimate sports activity in French Polynesia. Registered in the Pacific Games since 1985, French Polynesia largely dominates the other countries in this discipline by winning a large number of medals. Created in 1990, the Tahitian va'a federation currently has 217 clubs and 5061 members. Several va'a events are organised in French Polynesia in particular:

- The Hawaiki nui va'a: usually organised at the beginning of November, is the largest pirogue race in the region and also illustrates the very strong links that have always united Polynesians to the sea. This event has the reputation of being the most

difficult V6 (six-seater) pirogue race in the world but also the longest and the most beautiful... with its 129 km in three days over three stages, without any change of paddlers.

For the start, the bay of Huahine in the Leeward Islands, becomes the place of this huge gathering of pirogues coming from all over the world. Then the race heads to Raiatea, Taha'a and Bora Bora. This frantic and exhausting race, from island to island, over three days, remains a unique event that connects and unites the islands and their welcoming inhabitants.

- The inaugural Va'a Marathon World Championships in June 2017.

- The World Va'a Speed World Championships in July 2018. They have already taken place in French Polynesia: in 1986 in Papeete and in 2002 in Bora-Bora.

Finally, on the occasion of the International Day of Disabled Persons, the President of French Polynesia, Mr Edouard Fritch, announced on 3 December 2019, the hosting and organisation of the first International Development Seminar of para va'a in Oceania in Tahiti.

Para va'a's inclusion in the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games programme and the confirmation that it will be maintained at the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games has strongly boosted the development of this discipline on all continents. However, in order to better establish the place of va'a in the Paralympic programme, the International Canoe Federation (ICF) wishes to set up a development programme specifically aimed at the Oceania continent, which is the historical and cultural cradle of va'a.





together nearly 28 associations and more than 800 members spread over the 5 Polynesian archipelagos.

The festivities include the HOROTIMAUARA (race of fruit carriers), the TAUMAHA ARI (coconut tree climbing), the AMORA AOFAI (stone lifting), the impressive PATIA AI (javelin throw), traditional PA AROHA ARI (copra), VAA TAIE (sailing pirogues), PA AROHA ARI (coconut husking), AMO RA AOFAI (stone lifting) and traditional wrestling.

MAOHI SPORTS

From 29 June each year, Tahiti lives to the rhythm of one of the biggest traditional festivals in the Pacific: the HEIVA, which is celebrated during the July festivities (the Tiurai, or "July"). During this festival, which has existed since 1881, professional and amateur traditional song and dance groups compete with unique shows, craftsmanship is honoured with the Heiva Rima'i and traditional sports with the HEIVA TU'ARO MAOHI (tu'aro = sport, maohi = Polynesian).

THE HEIVA TUARO MA'OHI brings together traditional sports competitions. They take place on weekends in July generally and are completely free. Competitors, both men and women, compete in traditional dress, usually in pareu or pareo.

This event has been organised by the FÉDÉRATION AMUITAHIRAA TU'ARO MA OHI since 2003, bringing



D. THE PLACE OF SPORT IN POLYNESIAN SOCIETY

A MEANS OF TACKLING OBESITY AND IDLENESS

Tahiti, like the islands and island states of the South Pacific, has a high prevalence of overweight and obesity. According to two studies (1995 and 2010), overweight has stabilised in the Polynesian population but remains very high. 70% of the adult population is overweight, 40% of which is obese. This public health problem affects children from a very young age, and the child population is strongly affected. The latest study was carried out on children aged 7 to 9 years old and shows a prevalence of 36% overweight of which 16% are obese.

If this finding is cross-referenced with other risk factors in the population (tobacco and alcohol consumption, high blood pressure, lack of physical activity, low consumption of fruit and vegetables), it is estimated that 45% of the population is at risk of developing a non-communicable disease.

In order to tackle overweight, but also sedentary lifestyles, wandering and idleness in the neighbourhoods, delinquency and all forms of addiction, several programmes

have been created with the aim of raising awareness of healthy eating and encouraging the practice of regular and supervised physical activity.





According to the health authorities, illnesses, particularly overweight diseases, are the leading public health scourge in French Polynesia.

Among the challenges identified, there is a need to develop synergies of actions targeting these diseases and thus contribute to controlling health expenditure. Among the solutions, the partners of the “Mai ta’i Sport Santé” network have the common goal of promoting an innovative system: physical and sports activities adapted to health (APA).

THESE ADAPTED PHYSICAL ACTIVITIES

- Consist of the practice of a sport or physical activity, under medical observation and in a tailor-made fashion, as part of the care programme;
- Represent a non-drug therapeutic alternative to conventional treatments and can be considered as “sport on prescription”;
- Are a link between the world of health and sport;
- Are intended to be a transitional measure towards regular physical and sports activities.

DIFFERENT EYES ON DISABILITY

In order to offer people with disabilities the opportunity to practise sport, Tahiti supports the operation and development of the Polynesian Federation of Adapted and Disabled Sports which, with its 1302 members, offers adapted physical activities in sports schools in 14 disciplines. Thanks to its institutional and private partners, the federation is able to apply its sporting philosophy which consists in turning sport into a real tool for cohesion, support and development of the person with a disability, a source of value and identity, encounters, appreciation and recognition.

The federation's success is also reflected in the success of its athletes who perform at a very high level, such as the table tennis players who won one gold, one silver and one bronze medal at the latest Pacific Games in Samoa in 2019; a feat for French Polynesia's first participation in para table tennis.

It is also worth mentioning the athletes identified by the French canoe-kayak federation to enter the French team and possibly participate in the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games in the para-canoe discipline if they meet the quotas at the World Championships scheduled to take place in Germany.



TOWARDS THE DEVELOPMENT OF GENDER DIVERSITY IN SPORT

Along with the number of female leaders of Polynesian sports federations, female athletes are in a minority, accounting for only 34% of the total number of licensees.

The persistence of gender stereotypes could explain the lack of co-education in certain disciplines from a very young age: indeed, almost one person in two agrees with the idea that "some sports are better suited to girls than boys".

Moreover, in many sports federations, gender diversity is not always achieved. For example, women are well represented in some federations such as horse riding (79%) and disabled sports

(79%). They are proportionally underrepresented in others, such as American football (1%), kayaking (3%), shooting (5%), rugby (8%), weightlifting (11%), boxing (13%) and football (16%).

Only one Olympic single-sport federation has true equality of gender representation (badminton at 50%), and six others are close to it: rowing (52%), athletics (55%), handball and volleyball (47%), swimming (46%), and fencing (45%). In its development programme until 2027, the French Polynesian Olympic Committee has therefore planned to encourage women's participation, notably by inviting the sports federations to organise competitions and championships each year that are

adapted and dedicated to women (for example, the "Tahitienne" is a 3 km foot race reserved exclusively for women, which brought together 4600 women on 8 March 2020 for its 20th edition).

E. MAJOR INTERNATIONAL EVENTS ORGANISED IN POLYNESIA

POLYNESIAN EXPERTISE IN EVENT ORGANISATION

Two-time organiser of the Pacific Games in 1971 and 1995, Tahiti has successfully organised several international events in all sporting disciplines, and still regularly hosts top-level events.

Benefiting from a first-rate hotel complex, healthy infrastructures and an outstanding sense of hospitality, Tahiti is an ideal and idyllic host for any organiser.

Thanks to the dynamism of its civil society, associations and sports federations, clubs, athletes and coaches, Tahiti organises numerous sporting and cultural events with international impact every year. Below is a summary of the main ones with some key figures:

BUT ALSO...

In May: Tahiti Pearl Regatta. It is the most important regatta of the Polynesian triangle, with about fifty boats engaged in the race;

In June and July: Heiva i Tahiti. The largest gathering of dance and singing troupes coming from all the municipalities of Polynesia. It is the major cultural event of the country. Several thousands of people attend the singing and dancing shows at each evening, in Place Toa'ta, over a period of 3 weeks;

In August: Tahiti Pro Teahupoo. An international meeting and competition where the best surfers of the professional world compete on the mythical waves of Teahupoo. This site was chosen for the surfing competition at the 2024 Paris Olympic Games.



The Tour de Tahiti Nui, a regional cycling competition which attracts several dozen international amateur cyclists;

In November: *the Hawaiki Nui Va'a*: more than 100 pirogues sail between the Leeward Islands for this spectacular race and several thousand spectators watch it live.

All of these events require the recurrent mobilisation of staff, volunteers and officials, as well as the deployment of logistical and organisational resources.

Welcoming, transport, accommodation, catering and the safety of participants are an essential part of all these events organised by Tahiti. Today, Tahiti has acquired expertise and legitimacy in the hosting of international events.

F. FRANCOPHONE COOPERATION

Like New Caledonia and Wallis and Futuna, Tahiti and its islands are French and represent the excellence of French sport in Oceania. Relations with the French federations are warm and based on development and performance goals.

In addition, the Olympic Committees of Tahiti, New Caledonia, Vanuatu (a former French territory that gained independence in 1980) and Wallis and Futuna signed a partnership agreement on Sunday 14 July 2019 in Samoa to pool and strengthen sporting links between the four Pacific islands.

Indeed, the four Olympic committees have decided to join forces to promote sporting and technical exchanges between the four islands. This agreement, which was first born under the impetus of a first agreement between New Caledonia and Polynesia in 2006, aims to maintain closer sporting links between these four territories.

This four-party agreement will give more weight to the French-speaking territories for the next Pacific Games, but also within ONOC, the Oceanian Olympic Games Commission.

Finally, in the event that Tahiti wins the Games, this cooperation and synergy will most certainly be useful and activated on the following aspects:

- Transfer of knowledge with the French-speaking countries that have just organised the Games and Mini Games.
- Reflection and partnership on material and logistical aid.

A. PREMISES

HOST CITY

Organiser of the Pacific Games in 1995, it was only natural that the City of Pirae was once again selected as candidate city for the XVIII Pacific Games - Tahiti 2027. It hosts on its territory, on the one hand, sports infrastructures such as the Pater Stadium where the opening and closing ceremonies of the Games will be organised, and on the other hand, the headquarters of the Olympic Committee of French Polynesia as well as that of several sports federations.

Covering an area of 35,42km², Pirae stretches between Papeete and Arue, from the Bay of Taaone to the summit of Mount Aorai at an altitude of 2,066 metres. It is drained by three rivers: Fautaua, Hamuta and Nahoata. It has a population of 14,209 inhabitants. The mayor of Pirae is Edouard FRITCH, who is also the President of French Polynesia.

EXPECTED PERIOD

In order to make the most of the cooler period and especially the school holidays, the dates of Saturday 24 July to Sunday 8 August 2027 are proposed for the 18th Pacific Games - Tahiti 2027. The opening ceremony is scheduled for Saturday 24 July 2027, at the Pater Stadium. As for the closing ceremony, it is scheduled for Sunday 8 August 2027. In accordance with the provisions of the Charter, Sunday 25 July and Sunday 1 August will be days of rest for our competitors, and we hope that these days will be an opportunity to create a unique moment of sharing between the delegations and the people of Tahiti.

On Sunday 25 July 2027, the meeting of the Sports Ministers of the member countries of the Games Council will take place, and Sunday 1 August 2027 will be dedicated to the Games Council Congress.

CLIMATE DATA

The climate classification is mainly based on criteria of temperature, precipitation levels and, to a lesser degree, the duration of exposure. Due to its geographical position, the Polynesian climate is tropical and of a humid maritime type.

There are generally two main seasons:

- From November to April, a so-called "hot" season or southern summer with higher humidity.
- From May to October, a "cool" season or austral winter with lower humidity.

The temperatures during the expected period are ideal for holding a sports competition. The humidity level generally oscillates between 70% and 80%.

According to statistics, July and August are the months least affected by rainfall. There is an average of 68 mm of rainfall in July and 51 mm in August, which limits the risks, especially for weather-dependent outdoor activities (tennis, athletics, triathlon, sailing, beach volleyball...)

PER DIEM

In accordance with Protocol 1.1.5 of the Pacific Games Charter, the Bid Committee guarantees that the contribution towards the cost of accommodation for athletes and team leaders will not exceed the sum of USD25 USD (US dollars) per day.

The Bid Committee, undertake to offer this per diem to the first 80 athletes of each PGA. This USD25 USD per diem concerns only officials, team staff and from 81st athletes of each delegation.

The Bid Committee, and consequently the Organising Committee (TAH2027), undertake to maintain the amount provided.



B. ORGANISING COMMITTEE

CHARTER AND LEGAL STATUS, PROPOSED DATE OF CREATION

Within 6 months of the awarding of the Games, in consultation with the Pacific Games Council, the COPF will establish an Organising Committee "TAH2027" which will be responsible for overseeing all venue development, organisation and management of the Games.

The Organising Committee for the Games (TAH2027) will be an arm of the COPF, in the form of a not-for-profit association, and will be ephemeral in nature: it will be created 6 months after the award of the Games and dissolved 1 year after the Games, once the balance sheets have been finalised and the financial year has been balanced and validated.

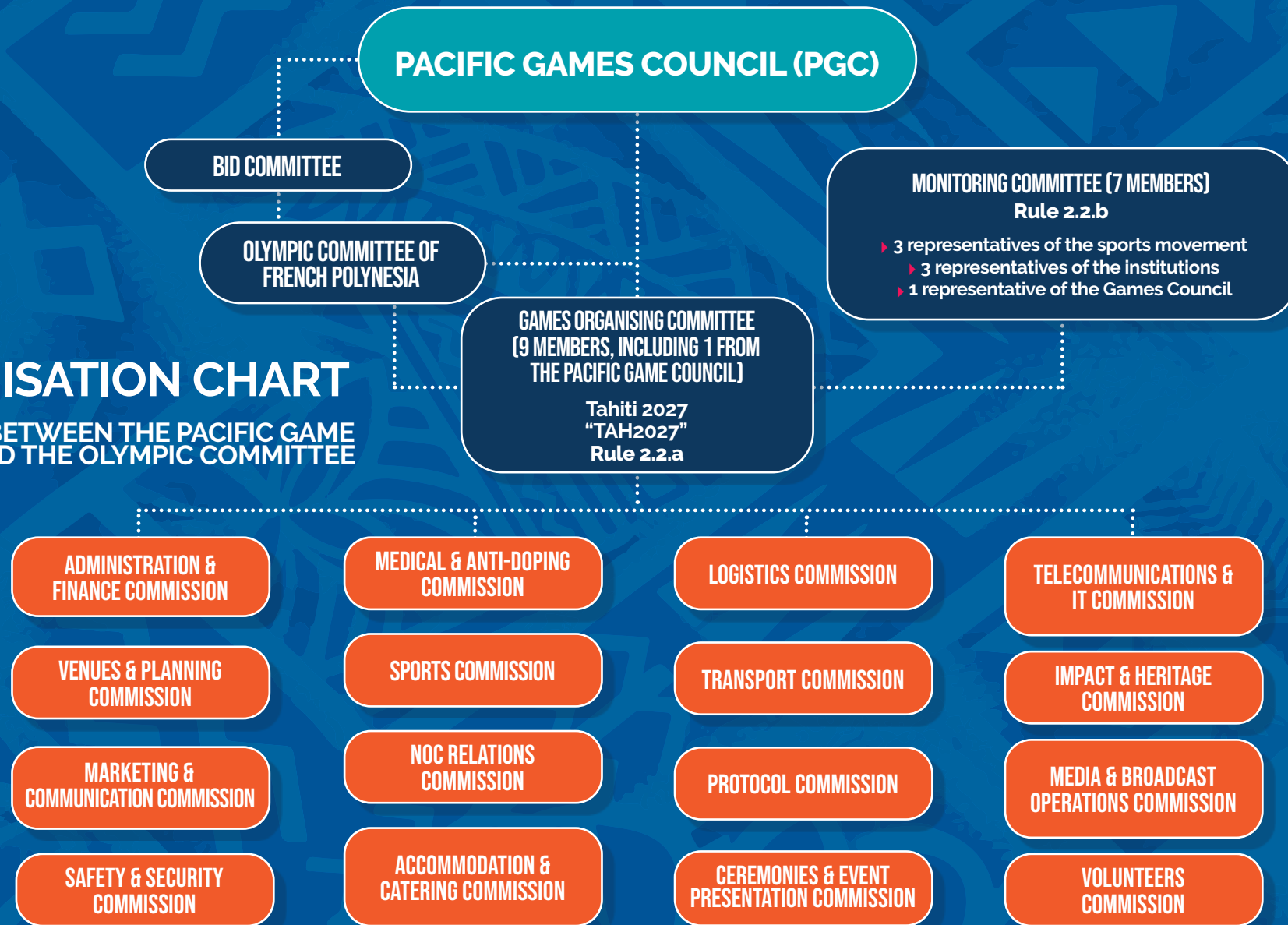

PROPOSED STRUCTURE

The Organising Committee of the Games will be managed by a Board of Directors/Executive Board, composed of minimum 9 members, representatives of the Government of French Polynesia, the Territorial Assembly, the COPF, the Pirae City Council and the Sports Movement.

An oversight committee meeting the requirements of the Games Charter would be made up of 7 members, including 1 representative of the PGC.

Generally speaking, the Organising Committee will be structured around 16 Commissions, chaired by volunteers.

VOLUNTEERS PROGRAMME

As with any sporting event of this magnitude, the volunteer programme is a key element in the success of the organisation. Volunteers are the event's ambassadors and are often the ones who bring a positive vibe to the Games with their smiles, their sense of welcome and their presence at all the official venues.

For the 2027 Tahiti Games, we plan to mobilise between 4,000 and 4,500 volunteers.

The Organising Committee's objective is to set up a global and sustainable Volunteers Programme policy, with the aim of creating a permanent database for the Polynesian Sports Movement, and why not the development of a complete management platform. The idea is also to use the 2024 Paris Olympic Games as a basis for communicating and promoting the TAH2027 volunteers programme, but also to use the processes and volunteer base that will be mobilised during this event.

The volunteers programme will be based on an ambitious strategy, with the implementation of a volunteer registration and interview process, as well as an approach to volunteer missions that goes beyond sports and competition venues. We want to apprehend volunteers by functional department and provide them with training adapted to the missions they will be offered.

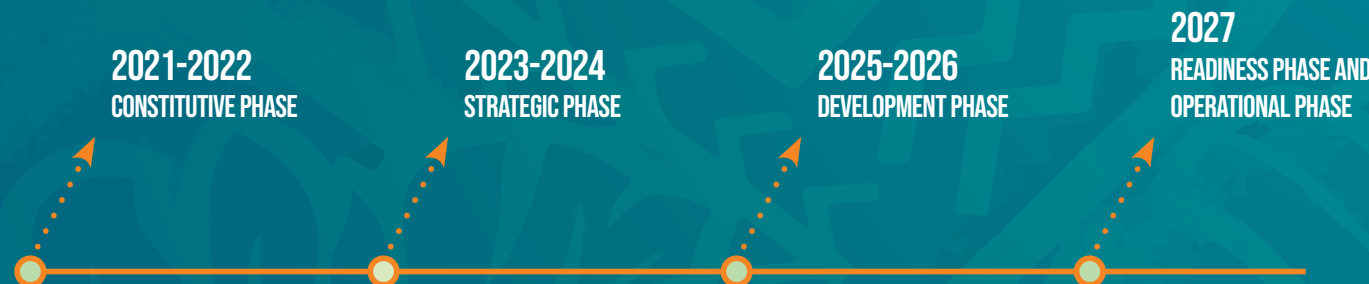
We can already plan to launch the volunteers programme at the beginning of 2026, to allow time for registration, interviewing and selection of

volunteers, as well as their training and involvement in all the test events.

The volunteers programme will be open to all the archipelagos and islands of French Polynesia, but also, why not, to other participating countries, particularly the next organisers of the Games and mini-Games.

The volunteers experience will be unique for the 4,000 selected volunteers, with a personalised and humanly rich adventure: training, uniforms, volunteer centre, catering, promotion, targeted communication, dedicated interface, legacy. And, of course, the objective is to rely on the local associative network, which is mainly based on volunteer work. Tahiti and French Polynesia in general is a land of events and sport. The local population is very familiar with this type of gathering and will be able to put all their skills, availability and motivation at the service of the 2027 Tahiti Games.

D. TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

The technical officials are committed to ensuring the smooth running of each competition. They ensure that the competitions respect the rules of the International Federations.

It is therefore crucial for an organisation such as the Pacific Games to have qualified, experienced and competent technical officials.

The Olympic Committee of French Polynesia and the affiliated sports federations intend to train a sufficient number of local technical officials to ensure the coordination of the various sports. There is therefore a double challenge for Tahiti concerning technical officials:

► To develop a training programme aimed at covering the majority of the needs in technical officials for the Games. The aim is to train as many local people as possible to supervise the competitions;

► To benefit from a pool of experienced local technical officials at future events.

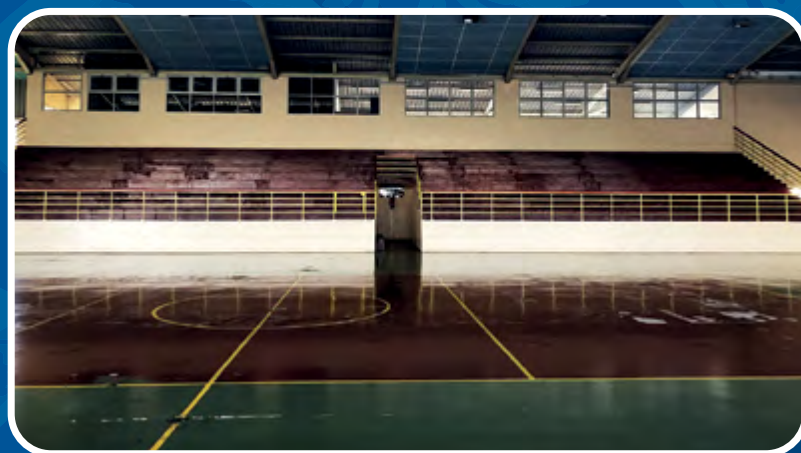

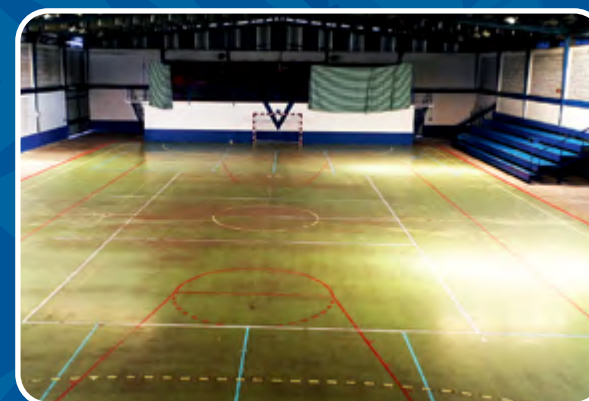

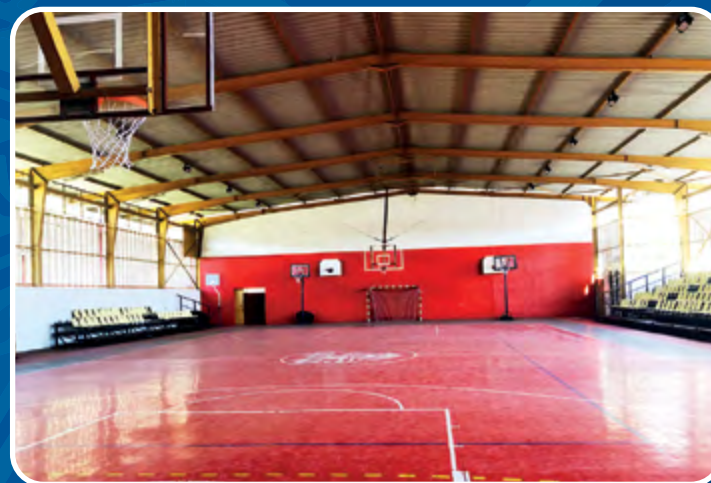

F. THE GAMES VILLAGE

The Delegation Village is an essential part of the Games infrastructure since it hosts the main actors of the event: the athletes! The smart choice of venue(s), the quality of the infrastructure chosen and the services provided make it a key site for the Games. For the 2027 Pacific Games, we have decided to make an eco-friendly and sustainable choice by pre-selecting four existing school facilities to host the delegations:

- ▶ Le Diadème Middle and High School in Pirae, with a total surface area of 8 hectares and usually accommodating up to 1,200 high-school students and around 300 middle-school students. It is located close to the main venues of the Games.

- ▶ Lammenais Middle and High School in Papeete, with a capacity of 1,200 places.

- ▶ Paul Gauguin High School in Papeete with a total surface area of 7 hectares and usually accommodating up to 1,500 students. It is the third key accommodation facility with significant advantages (see details below).

- ▶ The university's student accommodation centre with a capacity of 600 places. This means a capacity of 4,800 beds spread over just 12 km.

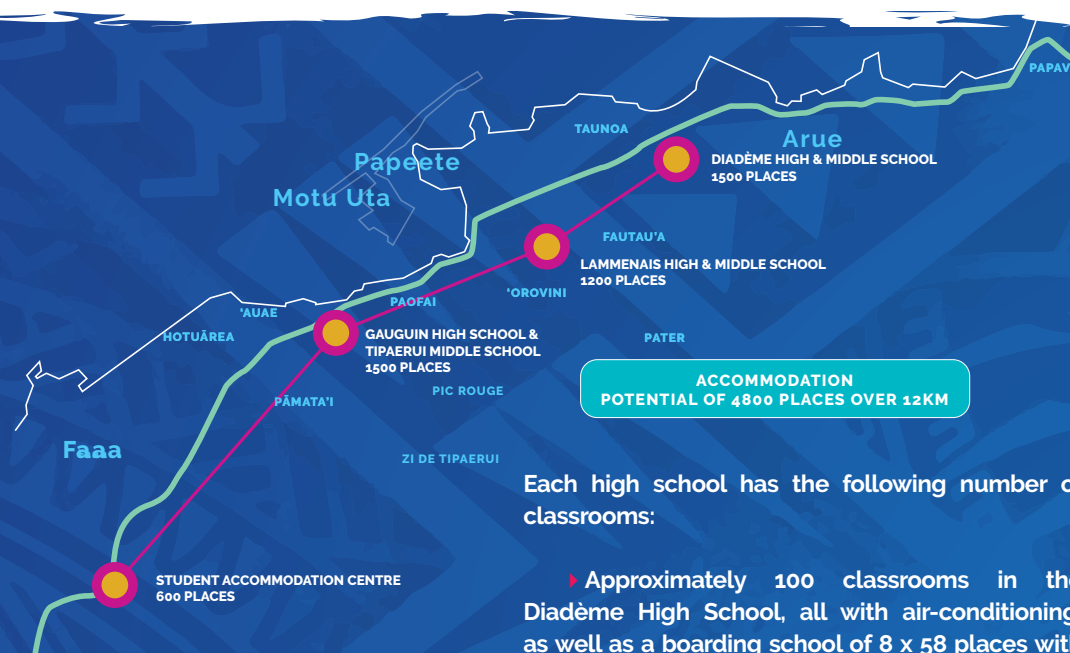
- ▶ These 4 venues will offer a wide variety of services to athletes and officials during the 2027 Pacific Games, and have the economic and practical advantage of being existing, and already possessing existing spaces and equipment that can be used for the Games (kitchens, sanitary facilities, green spaces, sports areas).

CATERING

A catering service will be provided for breakfast, lunch and dinner with time slots wide enough to accommodate the athletes' schedules. The kitchens and catering areas of the existing school facilities will be available for use. The Oceanian dietary habits will be strictly respected as well as the nutritional requirements of an athlete.

ACCOMMODATION

The classrooms will be transformed into dormitories. The number of people per classroom will be discussed with the Games Council. The advantage of having four accommodation sites for the delegations is to distribute the number of people per village fairly, so as not to overload one school more than the other.



Each high school has the following number of classrooms:

- ▶ Approximately 100 classrooms in the Diadème High School, all with air-conditioning, as well as a boarding school of 8 x 58 places with sanitary facilities. A renovation project including an additional building is planned and will be delivered within the next two years. A middle school is attached to the school in case the capacity needs to be increased.

- ▶ There are about 40 classrooms at the Paul Gauguin High School with a surface area of 50 to 60m² per room. A boarding school with a capacity of 114 beds spread over 3 floors will also be made available for the period of the Games. This high school is adjacent to the Tipaerui Middle School which can also be added (capacity of 300 to 400 places).

- ▶ The cleaning of the bedding will be carried out regularly and directly by the teams on site. The privacy of the athletes will be respected, and men and women will of course be separated in the dormitory areas.



SANITARY FACILITIES

Each school already has existing showers and toilets. For the Pacific Games, a programme to renovate and increase the number of toilets per venue is already being discussed. Again, gender-separated showers and toilets will be available.

SAFETY

From the official opening and the arrival of the first delegations, each village will be secured by private security company agents, reinforced by staff and "village services" volunteers.

TRANSPORT

Regular shuttle buses will serve the four school facilities to enable athletes and officials to reach each competition and training venue. A transport office will be set up in each village to respond to the requests of the teams and to ensure that the transport schedules are well distributed.

CLEANING

A daily cleaning service will be provided in each village. This service is part of the provision of high schools for the reception of delegations, and the usual staff will provide this service, with the support of a private cleaning company.

INTERNET

We would like each village to be able to benefit from a WIFI connection which will be available to the delegations.

LAUNDRY

A laundry service will be available to delegations at each athlete accommodation site. The instructions for use will be communicated in the run-up to the Games at each Pacific Games athlete.

MEDICAL CENTRE

One medical centre per village will be set up on a temporary basis. This service will be accessible to every accredited person staying in the villages and will be available continuously throughout the period of activity of the villages. There will be a 24/7 presence. Doctors, nurses, physiotherapists and osteopaths will be present to take care of the athletes and their support personnel.

A health information centre will be located next to the medical centre. Athletes and their managers will be able to seek advice and information on various illnesses and infections, as well as on anti-doping.

OTHER FACILITIES

AND SERVICES

DIADÈME HIGH SCHOOL

Sports fields, as well as an indoor multifunctional sports hall, a meeting room and a 350-seat canteen with its own kitchen will also be available on this accommodation venue.

PAUL GAUGUIN HIGH SCHOOL

also benefits from outdoor sports fields, a weight room and an indoor multifunctional sports hall.

A living area with a hall can be used, and the canteen has a capacity of 550 seats with an integrated kitchen (accommodate 1,800 people between 11 am and 1 pm during the school period).



G. HOTELS

As mentioned above, Tahiti is fortunate to have a first-class hotel complex, with an abundant supply of hotel rooms, as well as a wide range of affordable, quality accommodation that will satisfy the specific needs of each client group.

For the 2027 Pacific Games, Tahiti has pre-selected the following accommodation plan:

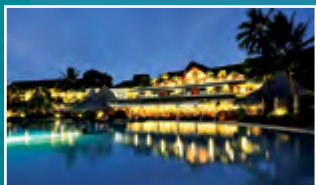
The technical officials will be accommodated at the La Mennais High School in Papeete. A catering centre will be set up there.

H. TRANSPORTS

ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES OF DELEGATIONS

Due to the insularity and distances, air and sea transport are well developed in Tahiti.

The number of enplaned and deplaned passengers at the Tahiti-Faaa airport (PTT) is close to 1.5 millions. Several companies, including "low cost" companies, offer weekly and regular connections to and from the United States, France, New Zealand, Japan, New Caledonia and South America (Easter Island). The domestic airline Air Tahiti also operates flights to the Cook Islands.

The Autonomous Port of Papeete is an ultra-modern home port and port of call. It can accommodate four liners simultaneously and is therefore a major contributor to the reception of delegations wishing to travel by sea.

Tahiti 2027 wishes to find the most economical transport solutions from Auckland's airport hub to offer to Pacific Games athletes.

ENTRY & RESIDENCE FORMALITIES

All travellers must have a passport valid at least six months before their stay in French Polynesia and a reservation for a return trip.

Some foreign nationals will also need to apply for a visa, while others are exempt if they meet certain conditions (see adjacent table).

Tahiti 2027 and the Tahitian government are committed to enforcing free visas for all delegations. In addition, the procedure for obtaining visas will be made as easy and short as possible in order to guarantee participation in the Pacific Games for all athletes.

CUSTOMS RESTRICTIONS

In order to avoid paying customs or import duties, goods imported for the Pacific Games will have to be reported upon arrival to the customs service and may benefit from the so-called temporary admission procedure.

THE IMPORT OF ARMS & AMMUNITION **(GUARANTEE 6)**

Competitors carrying competition weapons must report to the customs service. A procedure specific to these items will be put in place for the Pacific Games to authorise their entry into the territory.



PROVISIONAL TRANSPORT PLAN

The transport strategy for the 2027 Tahiti Games is based on the principles of comfort, safety and adaptability for all participants in the Games. It also takes into account the continuing demand for transport to the city centre of Papeete and its urban area where jobs, facilities and services are concentrated.

The challenges of the transport plan are therefore manifold, resulting in three main areas of work:

- ▶ To ensure fast, reliable and safe transport with an adequate level of service for each group of participants, and with absolute priority to the transport of the delegations;
- ▶ To ensure the continuity of current activities in the Papeete urban area;
- ▶ To ensure that the means of transport put in place and the management of mobility are as sustainable as possible and provide the best legacy for the territory.

THE AVAILABLE MEANS OF TRANSPORT

● BUS

The existing bus fleet in the region is made up of more than 240 vehicles renewed in 2020. These 43-seat vehicles are all air-conditioned and equipped with GPS. In addition, more than 20 vehicles are currently electric.

● MINIBUSES

The available fleet of minibuses is constantly being renewed and will be a significant asset in the transport plan.

● RENTAL CARS

There are three car rental companies (Eco Car, Avis and Hertz) with between 150 and 200 vehicles each.

● TAXIS

There is a union of independent taxis comprising almost 200 vehicles.

● AIRLINE

There are many flight connections between Tahiti and Moorea (shooting competition venue, golf and open water swimming) operated by the domestic airline Air Tahiti. Private flights can also easily be arranged upon request (plane or helicopter).



PROPOSED MEANS OF TRANSPORT BY GROUP OF PARTICIPANTS

Transfers between the airport and the villages for the delegations will be provided by TAH2027.

A shuttle bus service (electric as far as possible) will provide transport for the athletes and coaches from the village to the training and competition venues. Transport will be adapted to the sports calendar and the accreditation card will give free access to this transport.

Cars and minibuses will be allocated to each delegation, according to its size and under the conditions mentioned in the Charter.

Assistance will be provided to the Olympic Committees to rent cars. Parking permits will then be offered to them.

Reserved cars, with drivers, will be made available to the members of the Pacific Games Council Executive Committee and its President.

Public transportation will be free for anyone with a Pacific Games accreditation card. Tahiti 2027 will work closely with public transport operators to ensure the best possible service and include existing bus routes in the official transport plan for the Games.

In addition to a drop in ridership of around 30% in

July and August due to school holidays, mobility management measures will be implemented to reduce the basic demand for public transport and ensure stable journey times.

The Municipal Police of the municipalities hosting the Games activities will facilitate the circulation of the Games vehicles on which stickers will be placed for better identification.

Finally, a major awareness-raising campaign for residents, businesses and the general public prior to the Games will be implemented in order to limit demand.

I. SECURITY & ACCREDITATION

Tahiti 2027 will be able to guarantee the athletes and all those present optimum safety conditions.

SAFETY

French Polynesia is not independent in the fields of security and law enforcement. France's experience as an organiser of major sporting events is a major asset in the security planning for the Pacific Games.

Close collaboration will be established between Tahiti 2027 and the State services in order to put in place all the efficient procedures required to welcome all the participant groups of the Pacific Games in the best possible security conditions.

Security forces will be called upon to contribute to law enforcement but also to road safety.

A Command Post will be set up during the Games, bringing together government services, the police, intervention brigades, firefighters, emergency services, security service providers and decision-makers from Tahiti 2027. Security and crisis response procedures, established by the government, will be implemented.

SECURITY

There are several private security (safety) companies in Tahiti. These companies will be contracted by Tahiti 2027 in order to secure the Pacific Games venues and ensure access control. They will of course also be the main agents to secure those venues, while maintaining close links with the police forces.

ACCREDITATION

An accreditation system will be used in accordance with the access zones set out in Directive 11 of the Charter.

A coherent accreditation system that is easily operational is essential for the successful staging of the Pacific Games and has a direct impact on security, programming, transport and venue management.



J. MEDICAL

A medical and anti-doping commission will be created within the organising committee to coordinate and manage the medical aspects.

This commission will be involved in outpatient care, nursing care, medical evacuation and doping control. A doctor will be appointed to head this commission.

French Polynesia has a modern and highly efficient medical centre, the Taaone Hospital (CHPF) in Pirae. It is a latest-generation hospital equipped with a high-level technical platform (EMS and emergency reception, 11 operating theatres, emergency equipment for resuscitation, imaging platform including scanner, MRI and scintigraphy, etc.). It provides a range of high-tech care in surgery, medicine, obstetrics and psychiatry. A local hospital in Taravao (near the surfing venues) and two private clinics in Papeete complete the medical offer.

A standard healthcare circuit will be set up in order to take care of each participant in the best possible conditions and with the shortest possible response time.

Thus, a medical centre will be set up in each village of the Games for the benefit of the athletes, coaches and duly accredited technical officials (with a 24/7 presence).

Doctors, nurses, physiotherapists and osteopaths will be present to support for the athletes and their support personnel.

A health information centre will be located next to the medical centre. Athletes and their support personnel will be able to seek advice and information on various illnesses and infections, as well as on anti-doping.

Each venue will also be equipped with a detached medical centre to care for athletes and the public if necessary. Coordination between the different venues will be the responsibility of the State services and the Chief Medical Officer of Tahiti 2027 (ambulance, medical evacuation, etc.)

In addition, the venues will also be equipped with a health forecasting system, imposed by the authorities and intended to guarantee the medical safety of the public. They will obviously be used for all accredited persons if necessary and will therefore be a complement to the medical services already in place.

Medical evacuation plans will, of course, be in place in order to transfer any person to medical centres or even directly to hospitals in case of need.

Any medical intervention related to the competition (hospital care on site) will be provided by the Organising Committee for the benefit of all accredited persons, and will be in addition to their own medical coverage.

K. ANTI-DOPING

French Polynesia has adopted a set of modern legal instrument relating to anti-doping control on its territory.

On the occasion of the Games, a doping control centre will be set up with specifically trained and accredited personnel who will carry out the tests. Athletes participating in the 18th Pacific Games will be able to be tested at any time and in any place. Testing may be conducted at competition or training venues without prior notice.

The anti-doping centre will work in partnership with the Regional Anti-Doping Organizations (RADO) and the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA).

The French analytical laboratory Chatenay-Malabry (143 Avenue Roger Salengro, 92290 Châtenay-Malabry, France), accredited by WADA, will carry out the tests. All samples will be sent by air under the medical conditions required by the regulations.



L. COMMUNICATION

BID LOGO AND SLOGAN

Born out of the conviction to bring together an entire sports movement and the Tahitian population through this bid, the COPF wanted to create a representative logo.

The bid logo will naturally be replaced by the official logo of the 2027 Pacific Tahiti Games.

MASCOT OF THE 2027 PACIFIC GAMES

As a symbol of the bond between the peoples of Oceania, the octopus was chosen as the mascot for the 2027 Pacific Games. Symbol of peace during the great gathering of the Games, it is called "hekehau" (heke = octopus + hau : peace).

M. MEDIA

The media offer is very complete in the region. Two television media coexist: "TNTV" and "Polynésie La 1ère". The latter is a subsidiary of France Télévision (national public television in France). Its status and technical possibilities make Polynésie La 1ère the logical potential official broadcaster of the 2027 Pacific Games.

Polynésie La 1ère is actually one of the many supporters of this bid.

As far as the written press is concerned, "Tahiti Info" and "La dépêche" share the market.

In agreement with the Pacific Games Council, partnerships with local and international media and TV broadcasting agreements will be established to guarantee maximum media coverage in the Pacific region.

MEDIA OPERATIONS (MAIN MEDIA CENTRE, MEDIA RECEPTION AT THE VENUES)

[GUARANTEE 10]

The Organising Committee will make all the necessary arrangements to facilitate the work of the media covering the Pacific Games. The press rooms will be equipped with all the necessary equipment to facilitate the work of the media and meet their needs. All venues will be connected to the most efficient means of transmission.

A "media unit" will enable the monitoring of the competitions in real time. The information will be relayed on the French Polynesian Olympic Committee's website. In addition, a specific access will be given to the media and a broadcasting on screens will be made at different strategic locations.

Finally, mixed zones will be designed and installed on each venue according to the location and layout of the venues (media, rights holders, non-rights holders, photographers, etc.)

N. BROADCASTING & BROADCASTING SERVICE PROVIDER

(GUARANTEE 7 & 8)

A service provider or broadcasting partner will be responsible for the capture and production of images that will be made available to the right holders. Polynésie La 1ère, a local television channel, will be, due to its status (subsidiary of France Télévision, public channel) and its technical capacities, the best suited to fulfil these functions.

The costs of image capture and production will be entirely covered by the Organising Committee (through possible partnerships). The international broadcasting centre will be located in the Aorai complex and will include all the necessary equipment and facilities.

The intention is to cover the entire event, including the ceremonies. Every effort will also be made to ensure that all countries have access to the images in the best possible conditions.

As the PGC reserves all commercial exploitation rights for all broadcasting rights, it will be consulted at all stages of all discussions with potential service providers and stakeholders.



O. TECHNOLOGY **(GUARANTEE 9)**

A computer system that will integrate the SportingPulse system, among others, will be provided by the Organising Committee.

Tahiti wishes to make the 2027 Pacific Games the most connected Games possible by making Internet connection available (wifi accessible on each official venue).

French Polynesia has one of the most modern telecommunications networks in Oceania. 98% of the territory is covered by fixed and mobile telephone and Internet networks.

The fibre is deployed on the island of Tahiti and provides high-speed fibre optic connections to all competition venues, media areas, accommodation areas and hotels.

In the islands that will host the sporting events, the venues will be connected with the same level of transmission capacity.

The mobile telephone network is available on all the islands where the Games will take place (4G). "A la carte" subscription packages will be available for fixed, mobile and internet telephony. However, telephone lines will be made available to the delegations as set out in the charter.





V • FURTHER INFORMATION



A. ECO-RESPONSIBLE GAMES

Climate and environmental issues particularly affect the South Pacific. The organiser of the Pacific Games must give a major priority to a **SUSTAINABLE APPROACH**. One of the major commitments of the 2027 Tahiti Games is environmental responsibility. The event aims to be committed, responsible and concerned about our environment. This is done on three levels: environmental, economic and societal impact. To achieve this, we plan to rely on the 15 eco-responsible commitments of the event organisers, advocated by the French Ministry of Sports in collaboration with the World Wide Fund for Nature (WWF):

- 1 50% minimum of responsible food (local/regional supply; healthy, diversified and responsible (no-waste) food).
- 2 80% minimum of travel through active mobility, public transport or carpooling (participants, organisers).
- 3 80% of purchases integrating selection criteria based on the principle of social and environmental responsibility.
- 4 25% less waste, 60% of waste reused, recycled or recovered.
- 5 100% of natural sites respected.
- 6 100% of energy and water consumption controlled and optimised (no waste, light management, watering, no phytosanitary products...).
- 7 100% of sites dedicated to the public, accessible to people with disabilities.
- 8 1 action (at least) promoting accessibility for disadvantaged people (specific pricing policy, health and social action, etc.).

- 9 At least 1 "eco-responsible" innovation tested during the event.
- 10 1 or more sports champions who are ambassadors of "eco-responsibility" and who are mobilised for the event.
- 11 100% of the volunteers involved in the event valued (rewards, access to training, sociable times, meetings with celebrities, provision of sports equipment or facilities).
- 12 1 commitment (at least) to a solidarity cause.
- 13 1 action (at least) to promote gender leadership.
- 14 1 "sustainability" referent in the organisation.
- 15 1 action or programme (at least) to raise awareness of eco-responsibility.

This global commitment could be translated into a number of concrete actions such as :

- ▶ the use of drinking water with the installation of fountains and water bottles for all (welcome bag for athletes, officials, VIPs, technical officials, volunteers, etc.).
- ▶ the use of sustainable and non-recyclable cutlery, plates and cups, as it is not possible today to recycle them on the territory.
- ▶ the implementation of accessible public transport with accreditation, and the use of electric vehicles (especially buses) to transport identified groups of participants such as VIPs or technical officials;
- ▶ the creation of dedicated voluntary missions: green brigade in charge of raising public awareness

of waste sorting issues, accessibility of people with disabilities, non-smoking venues, etc.

- ▶ the establishment of an Impact and Legacy Commission into the Organising Committee with a main referent.
- ▶ the accessibility of all official venues: ramps for people with disabilities, dedicated spectator areas, adapted directional signage, etc.
- ▶ the implementation of waste sorting in the Games Village and sports venues and a recycling or second life process for products.
- ▶ the strong desire to favour the local economy, and in particular local producers.
- ▶ the implementation of social actions aimed at underprivileged neighbourhoods: inclusion in the volunteers programme, information and awareness campaigns, involvement of young people experiencing difficulties in the completion of works, etc.
- ▶ redistribution of uneaten meals to food banks or associations such as the Restos du Coeur.

The accessibility of the official competition venues is also a priority for the Tahiti 2027 project. In this respect, a compliance study of the facilities intended to host the Pacific Games in 2027 for people with reduced mobility was carried out by the "Te Niu O Te Huma" Federation, in collaboration with the COPF, the Tahitian Government, the Polynesian Adaptive and Disabled Sports Federation and the Youth and Sports Institute of French Polynesia (IJSPP). This study can be found in appendix.





B. IMPACT AND LEGACY

It is a certainty that, if Tahiti is awarded the Games in 2027, the legacy for the future of French Polynesia, for the Polynesians, for the local sports movement will be tangible and concrete. It is therefore essential to already think about a vision aiming to make the most of the equipment, infrastructures and all other creations or innovations that will be linked to the organisation of the Games.

It is vital to plan a strategy from the outset. This is why it is essential to be in line with the Polynesian Government's sustainable projects.

THE GAMES WILL HAVE TO

- Boost and develop the local economy and tourism.
- Leave a legacy for the local sports movement in order to continue and improve the development of high-level sport but also to facilitate access to sport for the majority of people (in order to tackle idleness and obesity).
- Demonstrate a commitment to eco-responsibility.

Successful Games will be Games that provide tools and leave an indelible mark on the local population.

The legacy left by the event is therefore also a major challenge for the COPF. A lot of infrastructures are created for mass-events and then left to fall into disrepair.

This is not the intention of the COPF and French Polynesia in general, as sports facilities will be built for the Games (Olympic swimming pool, Palais des Congrès). The use of these infrastructures will be

optimised in the future to allow as many people as possible to take advantage of them and to facilitate access to sporting activities.

Beyond this **infrastructural legacy**, which includes the development plan for high-level sport in the country, we must add the organisational **legacy of hosting** such a competition, the material (and notably sporting) legacy that the Polynesian sports movement will be able to enjoy, not to mention the transfer of skills and educational content that will benefit the young generation and the local population.

But above all, this event will have a positive overall impact for French Polynesia and the **local economy**. A large number of local companies, craftsmen, businesses and specialised structures (security, catering, cleaning...) will be able to benefit from the manna offered by this international sporting event, not to mention the market associated with tourism. All this will be encompassed in a global vision and a real government policy since it is the whole country which will be mobilised and there are numerous levers on which the political decision-makers will be able to rely (innovation, sport and integration, public health, environmental preservation, soft transport...)

The **marketing impact** of such an organisation could also benefit the Polynesian sports movement. Indeed, the financing of sports events of this scale generally involves partnerships with brands and private stakeholders which use the brand image and values conveyed by sport to associate their activity with it. This "win-win" exchange can continue after the Games and sponsors of the competition can become true partners of the COPF

and the Tahitian federations. This would make it possible to finance the fine momentum of sport in Tahiti and enable fenua (Tahiti in Tahitian) clubs and associations to perpetuate/develop their activity.

One of the key factors of success also lies in the **volunteers programme**. This is a major added value in the environment surrounding the competition, relations and exchanges with the delegations but also with the general public, the media and VIPs.

In line with the 2024 Olympic Games, which will undoubtedly involve a volunteers programme, the idea is to use this solid groundwork to build up a permanent pool of volunteers, train them through events and training content, retain them and enable them to experience a unique human experience.

To go further, it would be interesting to capitalise on this at the scale of French Polynesia, or even more, to develop a global volunteer platform and use it for all the country's events.



C. CREATIVE AND INNOVATIVE CONCEPTS

PACIFIC GAMES HEALTHY CHALLENGE

For this first idea, we started from our will to fight against obesity and idleness in Polynesia but also throughout the Pacific. We believe that this is a relevant subject to tackle, and we have decided to transform this initial postulate into an innovative concept: the “Pacific Games Healthy Challenge”, which will have a double action:

- To encourage the local population (families or individuals) to be active in a playful and accessible way.
- To encourage the populations of the participating countries and territories to take part in the challenge.

PRINCIPLE

To launch a national or even international challenge (with the participating countries) over a period of one month. It would start before the Games and end on the day of the Closing Ceremony. This challenge launched to the whole population would be visible on the official social networks of the future LOC (Instagram, Facebook, website of the Games).



GOAL

The goal is to get the population “moving” through very basic activities for 15 or 20 minutes. Explanations will be given in the form of daily playful vignettes posted on social media. The activities will be presented by a coach or a local personality (Games ambassador). Once the activity is over, the idea is to reveal a well-being recipe or “nutrition” advice to be used at home.

The activities can be carried out with the family or individually, and must be accessible for children, adults, able-bodied or disabled people.

A single goal: to make the whole Pacific “MOVE” around the Games and French Polynesia.

THE PACIFIC FESTIVAL

Another one of our wishes is to create a “village” area where various craft stands would mingle with evening entertainment based on dances from different countries. We would like to create a real place of life and entertainment during the Games: the Pacific Festival.

PRINCIPLE

On a strategic location (large square or popular place) and quite large, develop a Fan Zone where you can find different animations:

- Giant screens to follow the competitions live,
- Relocated medal ceremonies for certain disciplines
- Musical stage for concerts by local artists and traditional and world dances
- Food Market: stalls with travelling restaurateurs serving Pacific or world cuisine
- Attractions or animations of national sponsors/institutions/local organisations
- Cultural exhibition
- Introduction to the practice of ancestral sports
- Animations for children
- Dance competitions throughout the duration of the Games
- Highlighting of local handicrafts with a sales stand
- Presence of a merchandising shop



MASS EVENT VA'A : "IN THE WAVE OF ROWERS"

Following the example of major sporting events, it is increasingly common to mix recreative athletes with elite athletes.

In order to offer a real innovation for the general public, we propose to organise a fun and popular race a few days before the start of the Va'a competition.

Va'a being the mythical discipline of French Polynesia and inseparable from this collectively, it seems logical to us to create a real event around this competition, accessible to the greatest number of people.

PRINCIPLE

To allow spectators and amateurs to come with their Va'a, Paddle, kayak to experience a race in the same conditions as the rowers of the Pacific Games, by taking part of the same course of the queen event of the Games. This allows as many people as possible to "row" or "glide" in the footsteps of the most mythical discipline in Polynesia.

THE TAHITI 2027 RED THREAD "I SUPPORT THE GAMES"

PRINCIPLE

Once Tahiti is named by the PGC as the "Host Territory for the 2027 Pacific Games", the project is to create an "I Support the Games" movement. The aim will be to promote 100 initiatives, events or celebrations related to supporting the 2027 Games. This project is open to every town or village in Polynesia and every economic stakeholder or institution.

GOAL

- Anchoring sport in the daily life of as many Polynesians as possible.
- To increase the number of initiatives by entities around the Games.
- To increase the number of local supporters of the Games.
- To develop the education of the youngest through sport.

03 To the best of our knowledge, no laws, customs or rules exist that are restrictive, limiting or likely to hinder the Games in any way.

04 We will scrupulously observe the Council's guidelines regarding the minimum requirements set out in the contract, in particular with regard to:

- Rule 17** Competition-related advertising
- Rule 19** Accreditation and Protocol
- Rule 29** Media Guidelines

05 We will respect all other commitments of the Pacific Games Charter

- GUARANTEE 9** Technologies / page 69
- GUARANTEE 10** Media Operations / page 69

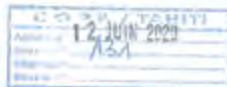

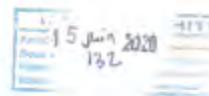
