PRESIDENT'S REPORT

After the cancellation of the 2020 season, we had high hopes for 2021 with everyone looking forward to getting back on the park and into the clubrooms. As we now know, it became a stop/start affair as lockdowns and restrictions continued to play havoc across the season due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Ultimately, the season was called off having played a bit over half the games.

I will let the coaches talk to the football side of things in more detail, but all teams acquitted themselves well at various times, playing good football, worthy of finals. Had the season continued, who knows where teams may have finished.

The introduction of a second women's team and a second U19's team created some fixturing challenges, however it was great to see so many players involved. We were lucky the new lights worked a treat to allow some later games to be played and this will no doubt be a feature for 2022.



Whilst speaking of players, I would like to thank them for their support of the club off the field. Whether Thursday night dinners and clean up, working in the canteen or bar, finding player sponsors, or supporting the Junior teams, nothing was too much trouble. It is one reason I feel we are such a great club.

Having players back at Cheong also meant having supporters back and it was great to finally catch up with friends once again at the footy, even if we had to juggle with various restrictions.

Once again, our thanks go to our amazing sponsors who continue to support the club financially or through inkind services. Many of them have been doing it tough themselves, so we really do appreciate their contributions. We will continue to encourage our players and supporters to give back to all our valued sponsors by using their services or buying their products where possible.

Our thanks also go to the EFNL and the Maroondah Council for their assistance throughout the period – they have again borne a lot of costs along the way which has helped place us in a very good position going into the

2022 season. The State Government should also be acknowledged for several small grants provided during the year.

The other major outcome of the pandemic was the change of plans for the redevelopment of the clubrooms. With their reduced income, the Maroondah Council felt is necessary to scale back the plans for Cheong Park, resulting in the change from a 2nd storey redevelopment to a single story. As you read this, we should have almost finished cleaning out the rooms to enable demolition works to commence, with new larger change rooms, umpire rooms, a trainer's room and storage at one end and new canteen/kitchen, bar and social rooms at the other. Unfortunately, the social rooms are unlikely to be finished until mid-year presenting some challenges on match days, however I am sure our amazing volunteers will see us through, hopefully with a favourable draw to save high drawing crowds for the second half of the year.

Speaking of volunteers, as always, we have had an amazing band of helpers this year, so thankyou to every one of you.

Finally, I would like to thank my fellow committee members who do the heavy lifting throughout the year. Fiona Schinck (Secretary), Vince Cali (Vice President), Caitlyn Adams (Social) and Cathy White (General Committee) have all indicated they will be stepping down from their committee roles and will all be greatly missed for the work they do.

I look forward to seeing everyone back at Cheong Park in 2022.

TREASURER'S REPORT

It is with pleasure that I present my treasurer's report covering season 2021.

An interrupted short season.

The Results

I am pleased to report that we have had a trading surplus \$21k, which puts us in good stead for the start of season 2022.

Overall funds sit at \$67k with a few small expenses still to come out once the bills arrive.

Income

Another successful season off field in terms of Corporate Sponsors, Calendar and Player Sponsors. This area raised \$99k, and a big thank-you to Vince and all the players in securing a great result in this area. One that we must strive to emulate for 2022.

Bar produced good results considering we had a short season and with the stock on hand being taken into consideration, margin was back up at 50% which is where we need to be.

Thursday Night meals were down in margin at 40% but considering this was outsourced, we can be pleased with the result.

Canteen was busy for our home games and produced on par margin at 52%, so profits holding well on this front, thanks again to Karen Colman and all that helped.

BBQ was down on margin (31% when we should aim for 40+) so not sure where we head with this other than put some prices up. Not a huge revenue raising department so not overly concerned here.

Mudlarks and Kennel Club revenues were both down on previous years and this can be partly attributed to a slower uptake post the 2020 season cancellation, importantly however all contributions/memberships pledged were collected.



Mudlarks have good funds and we did not call on all of them for this year so added funds are available for 2022 should the need arise. They also missed on their sports lunch which is always a good revenue raiser.

Socially, sadly nothing. We missed on Gala Ball and the great Lucky Raffle, these two combined can generate

some \$20k. Also, no luncheons and other player functions that generally raise good funds along with Bar takings.

Costs

The costs were reasonably held in check.

Players Salary cap will remain at \$100k for season 2022 so this will help us keep finances in check while we build funds for future seasons.

Trainers had a pay increase that was well overdue and combined with having now 7 teams we are needing more on game day.

Uniform and Merchandise spend was very high but with approximately \$30k (at cost) in stock in this area we are well stocked for next season. We need to make a concerted effort to move this stock next year and should ease up on purchases until this stock level is reduced. My recommendation to the committee is to appoint a Merchandise Manager to control all this. We cannot let this area get out of control.

All other areas are in line with what I would expect.

NEXT SEASON:

As I say every year, the hard work does not stop.

Season 2022 will throw up its own challenges. We need to be mindful of 'no pavilion' for the start of 2022 and this will be very challenging financially early in the season. As a committee there are certain things that need addressing as we head into next year.

I would like to thank the executive committee for their hard work in a trying 2021. It has not been easy for all of us juggling business and work commitments and a stressful football club landscape.

COACH'S REPORT PREMIER WOMEN

2021, almost a football year! After the difficulties and disappointments of the 2020 year for so many in the football community, it was a challenge to regain the momentum to build the Women's program for the 2021 season. Whilst the program retained a strong core of players from 2021, player numbers during preseason were certainly impacted by the disruptions of the previous year. Fortunately, once the teams were able to get out on the field and play a few games in the first few rounds, the player numbers did increase to comfortably field two sides for the remainder of the season.

The Premier team was a little unlucky with the results in the early rounds. Potentially, the pre-season training numbers had an impact, but the team was also working with a small bench at this stage and was required to adjust to a higher level of footy in the top division. We were beaten 3 times by an aggregate of 14 points and delivered one very solid 80-point win in the first 4 rounds.

To the player's credit, they were not disillusioned by early results and continued to work harder to improve. Their dedication saw the team win 4 of the next 5 games, with the only additional loss at the hands of Blackburn by 5 points (with the last kick of the day).

Ultimately, the Premier team worked its way into second position on the ladder as the season continued. We were playing better football with every additional game, giving us great confidence that the team was going to be very well placed as genuine contenders in a finals campaign. Unfortunately, with the return of lockdown, the season was cancelled after 11 rounds and the team did not get the opportunity to play for a Premiership in 2021.

Whilst the season cancellation was bitterly disappointing from a football perspective, the Women's program did achieve some great things in 2021. Here are a few highlights:

• The program did field two competitive sides every week, with 53 players donning the Red, White, and Blue for our Women's teams in 2021.

• The club's position as a Premier Division Women's program was consolidated, finishing in second position in our first year in the Premier competition.

• We implemented an injury prevention program in conjunction with Latrobe University which ultimately helped keep our injury rate low.



 \cdot The Women's program was involved in multiple joint training sessions with the junior club throughout the year, working towards strengthening the links between clubs and building the Junior Girls program.

· Joint training sessions were run with the Men's and Veterans programs to build club unity across programs.

 \cdot We had 8 players nominated for the Premier Division team of the year, with 6 being selected in the final team. This was the most of any single club.

• We had 29 players feature in the Premier team in 2021. 16 of these are new to the club.

I'd like to acknowledge our great player leadership team Kate, Sarah, Denni, Brooke C, Emilie, and Emma. Their assistance has been valuable in running the program and keeping the group motivated. They have helped keep the team moving in the right direction this year.

I would also like to thank the many volunteers, starting with Declan (Nigel) for his dedication for the past two years and the excellent job he has done with the Development team. Liam (Tobes), Riley the runner, and all our trainers for the great work they have done. Grant, for his commitment and involvement in everything from training to administration, and Andy, our Team Manager who takes care of everything to keep match day running smoothly.

Thank you also to the SCFC executive committee for all their ongoing hard work to continue to run a great club, especially through the past two difficult years.

On the back of our players ongoing commitment and dedication, 2021 was a year which saw an enormous step forward for our women's program. With improvement every week throughout the 2021 season before its premature cancellation, I have no doubt our best was still yet to come. Here's hoping for a clear, uninterrupted, season to showcase all that we can be in 2022.

COACH'S REPORT DIVISION 3 WOMEN

2021 saw the (delayed) launch of the club's second women's football team, a development squad in the Division 3 Women's competition. The division comprised a combination of new start up sides, and development sides from clubs fielding two teams. This mix did make the competition a little two paced in terms of evenness at times.

The Development team started the year in great fashion with a strong 77-point win at home over Croydon North. It was the first of 8 wins in a row for the side. A hard-fought win against Blackburn on Anzac Day and an enormous 150-point win against Boronia were certain highlights in the winning streak. The team played their best game of footy for the year with a narrow 10-point win in a high scoring game away against Chirnside Park to notch their 8th consecutive win for the season.



Unfortunately, the side lost the next 3 games just prior to the season cancellation. Ultimately giving up its top position and finishing in third place for the year. It should be noted that some injuries and unavailability of players within the list, combined with additional promotion of players into Premier football, were contributing factors to the results at this time of the year. Of those 3 losses, we felt only the night game at home against Fair Park was a poor performance. Otherwise, it was a very successful year of on field results for the team.

The timing of the season cancellation was in some ways quite harsh for the development team. Having suffered consecutive losses, they were then without opportunity to get back to the winners list. Their final game however, against a stacked Blackburn team (players back from Premier footy), showed strong signs from our team. Alike the Premier team, had the season run to its scheduled conclusion, the development side would have occupied a top two position and been well placed for a strong finals campaign.

From the outset, the season goal was to grow the South Croydon Women's program and field two competitive sides. The team finished with an 8 wins and 3 loss record. It continued to develop players with many stepping up to

Premier footy and performing admirably through the year. Combined with 5 nominations for the D3 team of the year and 3 players making the final team, it was an enormously positive year.

I think it's important to acknowledge all our players across the program for the inclusive and accepting environment they foster in welcoming everyone to our club. It is no doubt the major contributing factor in being able to grow the women's program and to the success of the Development team.
