The 'My Teams' tab is only available for competition participants Coach, Team Manager or Player. My Teams functionality (can be seen here) when logged into the Participant Portal allows you to toggle through dependents and sports. It's a bit of clicking, but it's all in one place.

Regarding stats:

Each player has a public stats profile (as seen here). If they go to a box score and click the name, it will take them to the individual player stats profile. Here there are individual games and totals.

On Saturday 23 April, our Tigers Men are playing Geraldton Buccaneers, tip off 7pm.


