# WORK IS UNDERWAY AT OLINDA RESERVE

Although the timing isn't ideal with OFC set to host a huge clash against Pakenham this Saturday at least things are on the move,.

The old fence came down on Tuesday and at this stage it's unlikely the new fence will be completed in time for this weekend's matches.

"Bloodlines" understands that the top rail of the fence will definitely be in place by Friday night but the cyclone wire may not be be affixed to 100% of the posts by the weekend.



New seating will be constructed in front of the pavilion

A 25 metre long net will be constructed at the top end of the ground, that will most likely be installed next week.

The net at the bottom end of the ground, to protect the netball courts, will probably not be built until the next stage of the project ( which we hope to learn more about by mid year).

Other improvements include-

\* new seating in front of the social rooms
 \* artificial turf to be professionally installed at the player entrances.
 \* repairs to turf at the oval entrance gate where the playing surface has become uneven.

With a huge crowd in attendance, and preceded by a moving and respectful Anzac ceremony, everything was set for Upwey to make it two wins in a row to start their season

However the visitors had other ideas and the crowd fell silent as The Bloods piled on six goals in an awesome first quarter.

In particular Josh Wallis, Kelsey Currie and Patrick Rosier were instrumental in getting the ball out of the middle and helping to provide a deluge of forward entries.

At quarter time OFC had set up a healthy 6.2. to 2.2. lead.

In the second quarter Matt Scharenburg seemed to own the entire half back line and was impassable. He led a water tight defence that kept the lid on the expected Upwey fightback and allowed OFC to go into the big break with a healthy 21 point lead.



# Club Legend Returns for Life Members Day

Four time OFC Premiership player Sandy Gammon is visiting from Queensland and will be a most welcome guest at Life Members day this Saturday.

Sandy was in the famous 1958 U/16 premiership team and went on to captain the teams which won senior flags in 1965 and 1966.

In 1967 Arthur Gill was captain coach of the premiership side while Sandy was in a back pocket.

The two flags in ^65 and \*66 were among the greatest victories in OFC history.

The picture above was taken during the second semi against Coldstream. a team which had gone through the season undefeated and boasted an incredible

percentage of 258%.

To the surprise of everyone in the League OFC upset them in the semi then smashed them by nearly 10 goals in the grand final.

The following year OFC finished third on the ladder behind Wandin and Norwood .

In the grand final The Bloods trailed Wandin for most of the match before winning with what was pretty much the last kick of the game.


