



Umpires get paid between \$50 and \$200 per game, depending on the league and umpire discipline.

In 2022, there are no new rules being implemented in local football, for the first time in many years. For the next few weeks, we will review the new rules that were implemented last year.

RULE OF THE WEEK - KICK IN FROM BEHIND


- For Kick-Ins from a Behind, the player on the mark will now be positioned 15m from the top of the goal square.
- The Protected area for a kick out previously ran from point post to the 10m mark where the man on the mark stood and across to the other point post.
- The Protected area for a kick out will now be a 15m arc, from the man on the mark and arced to the boundary line (see below image)

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Are players allowed in the 15m Protected area?
 Yes, it is encouraged for both attacking and defending players to be making a genuine effort to leave the protected area.
- What if an attacking player is loitering in the 15m arc?
 If the attacking player is not trying to get out of the protected area a 50m Penalty will be paid.
- Where will the 50m Penalty be taken to?
 The 50m Penalty will be taken from the man on the mark, with the goal square being 9m long & the man on the mark is 15m away the 50 will be 74m Penalty from the goal line which on most grounds will be around the center circle.
- Can an attacking player be in the 50m penalty but avoid giving away a 50m Penalty?

Yes, the attacking player must remain within 2m of the defending player if they are staying in the protected area however both will still be encouraged to leave the area.

- When can players enter the protected area?
 One the umpire calls play on then players can enter the protected area.
- Does the new stand rule apply for the man on the mark?
 Yes, if the player on the mark chooses to stand in between the 2 goal posts then he will be instructed to stand, however if he positions himself outside of the goal posts and in between the goal and point post the player will have full movement, the player cannot come back into the stand area once leaving it.
- Will a free kick remain for a kick in that goes out of bounds without being touched by any player?
 No, umpires will only award a free kick if player doesn't demonstrate sufficient intent to keep the ball in play.
