



RULE OF THE WEEK – HOLDING THE BALL (PRIOR OPPORTUNITY)

- There are 6 factors that contribute to Holding the ball prior opportunity free kicks being paid. The below chart provides information on prior opportunity.



- Evade** prior to being tackled, evade is an action that attempts to elude a tackler after the player has taken possession of the ball (Cues: Change of direction & while in possession lifting of the arms from a lower point to a higher position)
- Fend** Prior to being tackled, a fend is the use of an arm that contacts an opposition player to break the tackle.
- Prior Option** When a player in possession of the ball shapes to kick or handball and then decides not to dispose prior to the tackle (Cues: action of shaping to handball or kick then electing not to)
- Balanced & Steady.**
Balanced and steady would be considered when a player has had time and space to dispose of the ball (Cues has time with the ball has space with the ball)
- Mark or Free Kick**
A player who has taken a mark or who has been awarded a free kick and elects to immediately play on, would be considered to have had prior opportunity.

- Drives the head. A player who elects to drive their head into a stationary or near stationary opponent, shall be considered as having a prior opportunity. (Cues: Drops head from higher to lower position or has forward momentum with head down.)

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- What if a player gets tackled using one of the above factors but disposes of the ball?

Players will be given reasonable time to dispose of the football via handball or kick (below the knee). Holding the ball cannot be paid if the player disposes within a reasonable time.

- What defines a legal tackle?

A legal tackle is one that does not make contact above the shoulders but does not slip below the knees. The tackle also does not land in his back or place the player with the ball in a dangerous position.

- What factor does the 360-degree rule come under?

There is no such rule in football as the 360-degree rule. A tackle that had the player rotated 360 degrees can be used as an indicator by umpires but is not a rule or a focus factor of holding the ball.

- How is the balanced and steady factor measured?

Balanced and Steady is indicated to umpires by approx. 3-4 paces.

- How do umpires know if the player is driving the head or picking up the ball?

Players who drive the head tend to look up and see the contact coming and put their head down again and move into their opponent with force. Whereas when the player is not expecting the contact usually the roles reverse, and the player tackling will be moving into the player picking up the ball with momentum.

The Redlegs are looking forward to learning which former AFL star will be joining them for a game this season after the 'Carlton Draft' takes place on Wednesday (April 27).





We owe it to those lost and to those left behind.

Farmers know their land, livestock and machinery better than anyone, but that doesn't make them bulletproof.

We know the "it'll be right" attitude that is common in agriculture can have deadly consequences. We also know that experienced farmers are suffering serious incidents, and that if safety is not a priority, experience alone isn't enough to prevent a tragedy from occurring.

Our 'It's never you, until it is' agriculture campaign highlights that deaths and injuries on farms are preventable, not inevitable, and encourages farmers to treat safety improvements like any other improvement in their business. This campaign isn't about us telling farmers and those in the agriculture industry what to do, but reminding them that life changing incidents can and do happen.

You can prevent these incidents by making safety a priority. And you most certainly can prevent deaths. Our farmers are the lifeblood of our community and we need to support them in every way possible.

SEE YOU AT THE COUNTRY CLUB

Together with our partners at AFL Victoria and Netball Victoria, WorkSafe will host six Country Club games this year throughout the state.

If we are in your area, come and see us, have a cuppa and help us encourage all farmers to rest during long hours on the land. Fatigue isn't just about being tired, it's pushing your body beyond its limits, day after day. It impairs reaction times, concentration, and the ability to think clearly.

That's why taking a safe-tea break is so important

We'll also be calling on all clubs to nominate their favourite farmers to go into the running to win some great prizes for their club and the farmers themselves.

Let's not just kick goals on the field or shoot goals on the court this season - let's work together to change the score in agriculture.


