



UMPIRES REPORT V资A

In line with the AFL direction on "zero tolerance of abuse towards umpires" the GVFUA sent the following letter to all leagues and clul prior to the start of the year.

"The GVFUA introduced a Zero tolerance of umpire abuse during the 2021 season, which in the majority of cases resulted in umpires having a safer workplace and more enjoyable umpiring experience.

This directive will continue into 2022. Any abuse towards umpires from players or officials, whether it be verbal abuse, disputing an umpire's decision, or demonstrative behaviour towards umpires will result in a free kick, 50m penalty and potentially a report.

To remove any grey area regarding who the abuse may have been directed at. Umpires will be directed to penalise any player who is using abusive or foul language. This will include swearing.

The GVFUA understands that many supporters are passionate abo their club and love to support them. They create the atmosphere around the ground that is loved by both players and umpires. However, we believe it is imperative that this behaviour does not become abusive to either umpires or opposition players.

We ask if a supporter is getting a bit too passionate that a club official remind them to support but not abuse.

If the whole football & netball community can work together, we can make a day at the football an inclusive and enjoyable experience for everyone."

The GVFUA believes in the majority of cases that players, officials and supporters in the Goulburn Valley are aware of what is and is not allowed in the leagues we officiate.

RULE OF THE WEEK.

18.7 ROUGH CONDUCT

18.7.1 Spirit and Intention

Players shall be protected from unreasonable conduct from an opposition Player which is likely to cause injury.

18.7.2 Free Kicks - Rough Conduct

A field Umpire shall award a Free Kick against a Player when that Player engages in rough conduct against an opposition Player which in the circumstances is unreasonable which includes but is not limited to:

- (a) executing a dangerous tackle on an opposition Player;
- (b) making forceful contact below the knees of an opposition Player or executing a forceful action towards the lower leg of an opposition Player causing the opposition Player to take evasive action;
- (c) sliding knees or feet first into an opposition Player,
- (d) using boot studs in a manner likely to cause injury.

Dangerous Tackles

Players, when tackling should not:

 Place their opponent (head or body) in a vulnerable position which is inherently dangerous.

A dangerous tackle could be considered when the level of force is more than is normally expected in a given situation.

Doing so will be deemed to be rough conduct and will result in a free kick and possibly a report.

Cues:

- Excessive rotation, including slinging
- Arm or arms pinned that leaves the head or body in a vulnerable position
- Lifting legs (above horizontal) that leaves the head or body in a vulnerable position
- A tackle that drives or has 2 actions that leaves the head or body in a vulneral
 position

A tackle may be considered rough conduct if the tackle is of an "Inherently Dangeron kind.

Sliding

A free kick for rough conduct will be paid against a player who slides into an opponent feet or knees first and makes any type of contact with an opposition player.

Contact below the knees

A free kick shall be paid against a player who makes forceful contact, or action in a manner likely to cause injury (reckless manner), or causing an opposition to take evasive action.

Cues:

- · Player going to ground (may not necessarily "elect")
- Reckless bowling ball type action
- Movement into opposition legs
- Forceful contact (may cause player to go to ground) below knees
- Opposition player not causing contact.

Note: A player can still be penalised if he makes forceful contact below knees of his opponent even if he is moving side by side in the same direction with that player.

The following are instances when contact below the knees would not be paid

- When a player is genuinely attempting to mark the ball and in doing so, makes contact to an opponent below the knees.
- When a player is already on the ground and makes contact below the knees of an
 opponent in a genuine effort (reaches out) to contest the ball.
- Where a player is pushed, bumped, or tackled to the ground and makes contact to the knees of an opponent.
- When a player smothers, or attempts to smother, an opponent's kick (including kicking off the ground) when contact is made with hands or arms.

Studs up

Players are no longer permitted to carelessly employ their studs in marking contests, ruck contests, or general play. The determination of carelessness will depend on the view of the field umpire as to whether the action of the Player is unreasonable in the circumstances.

Cues

- Full use of studs
- Kicking out motion
- Be considered likely to cause injury
- Rarely going to be from a marking contest from behind.


