Each cell in the file shows the club played for, the number of games played in a particular competition and the points scored in that competition. A player may have played for more than one team during the competition and that is reflected as for example: TVJ-1/43, RSL-13/159. Meaning that a player played 1 game for the Jets and hit 43 points then played 13 for RSL and totaled 159. Total points would be 202.

From 1976-2023 the Wet Season begins in October of one year and usually finishes within the first four months of the next year unless otherwise stated. The competition was originally organized to finish up just prior to the NT Championships that would be held during the Easter weekend. I have maintained that aspect in this file until only recently when the DBA decided to run the competitions to coincide with school terms. This means that as of 2000 the Wet season actually starts at the beginning of a year and finishes in June before school holidays. The Dry or 'Championship' season runs from July through December. As of 2021 the DBA will once again use the 1976-99 format

Score sheets for the 1985 Dry & Wet, 1986 Dry & Wet & the 1987 Wet seasons have not been sighted therefore an average score from the Dry (or Wet) seasons immediately before and after the missing season has been calculated to arrive at a likely total. The number of games played is documented, but no 'points scored' has been accounted for. An example would be Fred Adams. The 84 Dry and Wet season info is available plus 1987 Dry and 1988 Conferance (Wet). The formula would be to add the 84D + 87D points scored: 101+235=336 divided by the number of games played 14 + 20= 34 for an average points per game and then multiply the number by the games played in the 85 Dry season. An example: 101+235=336÷34=9.8x21=207 and repeat the process for the 1986 Dry season which would be 1985 Dry plus the 1987 Dry to get the point total 207+235=342÷41=10.7ppg.x22=237. Use the same calculations for the missing Wet
