Womens Footy- Match Wrap

Olinda Women's team fell just short by 5 points in an entertaining tussle with fierce rivals Upwey at home on Saturday night.

Having been afflicted with the same injury/illness curse that has plagued the Senior Men's teams, the Women's side had only 17 of their 32 listed players available, pulling in netball prodigy Mera (MFP) Pringle at the last minute to answer the S.O.S.

Olinda has played all 3 teams above it on the ladder in the last month, and has led at quarter time in all of those games, but losing all 3. It was the same story on Saturday as Olinda burst out of the blocks with a first minute goal to the stellar Olivia (The Weapon!) Edwards, a clever snap around her body on her left. This was to be just a preview of Liv's brilliance.

Another goal from a set shot shortly after to her Krakouer sister Charlotte (Webby) Edwards had the ground buzzing. Unfortunately 2 goals in quick succession to the Tigers drew the scores back to level pegging.

Re-enter The Weapon.

It seems like the more we pump up Liv's tyres, the better she plays, so we're going to keep inflating. At the 9 minute mark Liv was involved in one of the most virtuosic displays of forward craft you're likely to see. A stoppage was created in the left forward pocket up at the Golf Course end of the ground, near the boundary line.

Nessy (Westside) Curnow (nee Bateman) put her hand up to contest the ruck, and Liv set up behind her, goal side. As the umpire shaped to throw the ball up, and with her tagger hot on her heels, Liv sprinted around the contest to the boundary and Ness tapped the ball straight into her arms. Not breaking stride Liv threw the ball on her left and kicked a freakish left foot chanana (Checkside/banana) right through the big sticks from 25 metres, Amazing!!

Unfortunately this would be Olinda's last score until the final quarter, and they would continue to toil while they watched Upwey score 3 goals. Upwey went into 3 quarter time with a 13 point lead, but the scene was set for a nail biting finish.

At the 3 quarter time huddle, the Coaches challenged the players to rally, run and carry, and take the game on to try and steal the win.

The players responded emphatically, and the last quarter was played with a finalslike intensity, hard gut running and frantic defending.

At the 90sec mark Olinda showed an example of the fast, slick end to end ball movement that got them into the Grand Final last year. Starting in the backline, Miss Football Lily (Laser) Carlin affected a desperate smother and earned a free kick from the ensuing scrum. Lil drilled the ball down the line into the hands of Nessy Westside who wheeled around and pinpointed a pass to Captain Courageous Claire (Bear) Hyett who took a strong overhead mark just forward of centre. Claire played on quickly and switched the ball to the opposite flank where The Weapon took a beautiful contested clunk. Liv powered past her opponent on the mark and fired a long (right foot this time!) bomb towards goal. This whole passage of play took no longer than 20 seconds, the ball travelled the length of the field, and the only time it hit ground was as Liv's drop punt bounced through the goals. The crowd and the players erupted and the atmosphere instantly intensified.

Both teams bombarded their forward lines, and while Olinda were creating chances, Upwey could not penetrate Olinda's ferocious defence. Casey (The Vault) Seymour is at her best with her back to the wall, and was excellent marshalling the backline. Anna (Goanna) Hughson, Anya (Onions) Hulston, and Illyah (Chopper) Reid had multiple chase down tackles in the last stanza and it was inspiring to watch. Chopper had switched with Kyah (The Missile) Barry, Kyah having a devastating effect with her fast running on the wing. Illyah was just as impactful in the back pocket, not just keeping Upwey's most dangerous small forward goalless, but monstering her at every opportunity. If Olinda has a movie made of it's season, it should be called Fast and the Furious '24 starring Illyah (Chopper) Reid (with a host of co-stars!).

hard and distributing well by hand and foot.

How did it all end? Olinda held Upwey scoreless in that last quarter, and managed to peg the difference back to 6 points. With 30 seconds left, ("X") Box earned a holding the ball free kick deep in the pocket on the boundary line, and cleverly threw the ball to Webby Edwards, then ran off. Webby lined up from 30 metres on the boundary line and kicked a towering drop punt. All at the ground rode it's trajectory and were sure it was going in....as it crashed into the near goalpost.

So close, but a thrilling finish none the less.

Olinda played a fantastic brand of football in the first and last quarters. The goal in the second half of the season will be to keep that standard up for a full game.

As an aside, the only team yet to salute are Ross Seymour and Liam Smith's team "Luca's Livewires" but they came in 4th this week so they're getting closer!




GOOD FOR FOOTY RAFFLE-


