Representative Committee Report

The 2014/15 season was the most successful for Rockhampton Basketball in recent years. Rockhampton finished 9th in the Vince Hickey Award for the Champion Association at the State Championships. This is a great result with the associationstriving to maintain the balance between winning and developing all of our future players. We also had two teams in three age groups this year, U18B, U16B and U16G. This makes it the largest contingent of players that Rockhampton has sent away to State Championships in recent years.

Our teams were again led by a willing group of coaches. We thank them for their time and effort over the season. Our two rookie coaches Jason Mayer (U14G) and Trent Shillington (U12G) were also our best placed teams, finishing 4th and 5th in their respective Division 1 age groups at the State Championships.

In order to find more competition during the season some of the teams went searching abroad. The U12G, U16B and U18.2B went to Emerald in September. Competition over the two days was against Emerald, Blackwater, Gladstone and Rockhampton. Emerald became reaffiliated with Basketball Queensland this year so some teams will be travelling there for a CDC next season. Others teams took advantage of the weather and visited the Sunshine Coast in January. The U14G, U16.1G, U16.2G and U14B played against Noosa, Sunshine Coast and Ipswich over the weekend.

The representative committee is continually looking to improve the program and respond to needs of our members. 2015 saw a significant change to the accommodation model used by the U12 and U14 teams when they travel for competitions where the players remained the responsibility of their parents. In some age groups the parents arranged to stay at the same motel, allowing the players to bond and the parents to socialise. The intention is to continue with this model again in 2016.

Another first this year was the introduction of Stadium Scoring by Basketball Queensland at State Championships. Whilst we were only able to provide access to the system for a few weeks prior to Christmas for the U18's, most people found it to be user friendly. We even had some people take on scoring responsibility that had never done it before. Two small scoring sessions were also run including the 24 second shot clock prior to teams going away at Easter.

This was the second year that Basketball Queensland has selected a Central Queensland Emerging teams for U15 and U17. Many Rockhampton players were again successful in gaining selection. The Emerging teams travel to the USA in July 2015 for competitions. A full list of State achievements is available below.

We also took the opportunity to bring Leonard King (High Performance Director, BQ) and Scott Butler (State Performance Manager – North, BQ) to Rockhampton during the U12, U14 & U16 CDC in March. This provided an opportunity for Leonard and Scott to run clinics with our regional coaches at the one time. We will endeavour to bring similar high profile coaches next season to continue the development of our coaches.

The referee's weren't left out either with Matt Skinner (Referee Development Manager, BQ) setting up the CQ Referee Development Program. The first session was held in Gladstone prior to Easter and the second in Rockhampton in May. A third session is planned for Bundaberg later in the year. Several of our top referee's were selected to attend State Championships this year. A list of these can be found in the table below.

Finally, some thanks. This year saw several new faces on our junior representative committee. We would like to acknowledge their efforts and time they have contributed to organising CDC's, finances, equipment, forms, accommodation, buses etc. We also thank the previous committee members for their contribution over the past years.

To the parents for your effort in getting the players to training, competitions, doing the scorebench and supporting your child in their sporting interests.

A big thanks also to *The Capricornian* for their continued support of the Junior Representative program.

Rockhampton U12 Girls 2015 Representative Team Report



We had a very successful Representative season culminating with finishing 5th in the State at our State Championships in Townsville. Over the course of the season the team has improved significantly not only individually but also in the way they played as a team. Every player on the team contributed which allowed us to be such a success as a group.

In Townsville we played some difficult opposition teams such as Ipswich, Gold Coast, Cairns, Townsville, Spartans and Logan. Our first game of the competition was against Ipswich, who were the eventual Silver Medallists; we went down by 7 points in this game. We played the Gold Coast in our second game, who ended up being the Gold Medallists, we lost by 30 points, but the girls never gave up and continue fighting right to the very end. Our third game against Townsville was our first win of the competition; this was fantastic for the girls as it highlighted how well we played as a team. During the crossover games we played both Cairns and the Spartans. We went down to Cairns by 7 points but we were leading for most of the game. Our second win of the carnival came when we played the Southern District Spartans; we eventually won this game by 18 points. This put us in the position to be playing for 5th or 6th against Logan. This was fantastic game which showed the girls 'never give up attitude' as the lead changed regularly throughout the quarters. In the end due to the defensive pressure of the team and some big offensive moments we won by 9 points.

I am extremely proud of each of the ten girls who were part of this team. The improvement I noticed in each and every one of them over the course of this season was remarkable to see and they should be very proud of their efforts.

Rockhampton U12 Boys 2015 Representative Team Report



The 2015 U12 Boys Rep season was once again an enjoyable time for all involved with the team.

The goal of the team was to play in Division 1 at the State Championships. This didn't eventuate due to inconsistent games throughout the Central District Carnivals (CDCs). For the coaches and parents it was a bit like Forrest Gump's box of chocolates, we never knew what we would get for each game we played.

We lost and won games against both Gladstone and Bundaberg but in the end Gladstone won one more game than us. This meant we were relegated to Division 2, which in the end turned out to be a good thing.

One of the reason for the inconsistences during the CDCs was the coaches noticed the Fast Break we initially taught the boys was not working effectively. This would have eventually limited the boy's capability to score at the State Championships. It was decided after the Bundaberg CDC to make a change to the Fast Break, so it had not become a habit for the team during the Rockhampton CDC. This is one reason why we didn't perform as well against Gladstone as we might have. But during our game against Bundaberg the team showed what they were capable of when they played as a team and won by 30 points.

At the State Championships the team continued to play the team game they had played against Bundaberg. They became one of the most consistent performing teams the coach had taken to any State Championship. There was just one game (Cairns) that the team didn't perform to the level they expected of themselves. Apart from that, the quality of teamwork the boys played with was of a very high standard. There were comments from other coaches and parents who were impressed with how well the boys worked together.

This teamwork resulted in an average of almost 80 points per game and holding the opposition to an average of less than 40 points per game. It also enabled the team to go through Division 2 undefeated and eventually win a Gold medal. This was a well-deserved result from a team who had worked hard at training plus listened to and executed what the coaches asked them to do during the State Championships.

From a coaches perspective the Division 2 Grand Final was one of the best games to be involved with because it showed how far the boys had improved during the season. Prior to the game the coaches showed the boys a slight change to the fast break and half-court offence to enable them to beat the Redlands defence. The players all ran the offence extremely well. We also set specific goals for our defence and again they did this very well.

The team was also warned that if we were winning, at some stage, Redlands would change their defence and we would need to change our offence accordingly. Redlands did eventually change their defence and without the coaches saying anything the boys made the required change to their offense. For an U12 boys' team this was quite impressive to watch.

The team would like to thank all the parents for their ongoing help and support, all season. Thanks to Matt Neason for all his extra coaching and assistant throughout the season. Also a special thanks to the U12 girls for training with the U12 boys and for the great cheerleading during the boys games.

The Rockhampton U/16 Boys Team travelled to the Gold Coast for the 2015 State Championships. The Team was competing with 28 other Teams in Division 2/3 and finished with 7 wins, 2 losses and coming away with a win in the Bronze Medal game.

Having beaten Burdekin Wildcats, Logan Storm and Sunshine Coast Rip 2 in the pool round the only loss came to Southern Districts Titans by 5 points. This meant we competed in Division 2 for the rest of the Championships.

Finishing 2nd in our Pool had us playing cross over games against Gold Coast Breakers and South West Metro Pirates Gold. Pirates was an extremely tough game but the boys showed they could finish off a game strongly.

The Quarter Final was against Toowoomba Mountaineers who were a big team but we held a good lead throughout most of the game. The Semi Final was against our CDC rivals Gladstone. Our first quarter was not the best so after trailing by double digits it stayed even for the next 3 quarters. Gladstone went on to win the Gold Medal.

A playoff for Bronze was our reward for a good carnival and by chance it was against our only other loss of the tournament in the pool round, Southern Districts Titans. We saved our worst half of basketball for the Final and were down 14 going into the 3rd quarter. The coaching staff concentrated on having a new ring to shoot at and the players saved their best half of basketball for the Final, finishing with a double digit win.

We had outstanding team play throughout the carnival with every player contributing to the success of the Classics. Everyone scored and everyone played defense. Having Frazer Roberts in the middle meant we grabbed most rebounds and his defensive play against positions 1 to 5 was one of the reasons he was our MVP. Ryan Johnson defended everyone we told him to without question. We relied on him being able to shut down his player and he never disappointed. Jaxson Zulian was the back up point guard that pushed his way into the starting 5 by increasing his control over the tempo of the game along with his overall offensive impact. 2 first years started with Israel Power, a point guard who could create for both the Team and himself. More credit should be given to his defense as it was relied on heavily during the Classics. The other was Flynn Phelan who came from the end of the bench to starting due to his high energy and ability to guard much larger opponents. The sacrafices he made for the team should not be forgotten. Josh Ellsworth ended up being the Team high scorer with 20.4 points per game. He had big games during the Finals that kept the score ticking over and his team in the contest. James Matheson was our offense off the bench. Having made some big scores in the Classics and hit 3 big 3's in the Final, but it was his defense during that game that made it hard to take him off. Joel Hick was our most improved player during the Rep Season. He had the most consistent inside outside shooting and guarded much bigger players, earning himself more and more minutes. Mylique Prior was originally selected for his offensive ability. During the Classics he became our defensive stopper and had a big impact on shutting down Southern Districts 3 point shooter during the Bronze Medal game. Then we had Tyreek Tatow. Unfortunately he was nursing an injury but still managed to hit 3's and get a couple of rebounds.
