Our Under 16 State Teams have headed off to Tasmania for the Under 16 Australian Junior Championships, best of luck to all of the teams. The WABL competition enters a two week general bye for Under 14 and above and the Under 12 age group plays an extra week under their new competition structure which is now operating smoothly. Basketball WA also held the first Smarter than Smoking North West 3x3 Tournament in Karratha at the end of June. This is an exciting new concept to help grow participation in the North West. The final results were Metro Women 62 v Country Women 59 and Metro Men won their game v Country Men 89 to 61.

These games were a full dress rehearsal prior to the AJC, with all teams in their new game uniforms and playing fully timed four quarter games. The Umpiring Officials selected to represent Western Australia at the same AJC's also took part. Ron Romero (Perth Basketball Association) also attended and will be Western Australia's representative on the Score bench as Statistician.

At the conclusion of the Men's game, presentations took place, with all members of each team receiving a Certificate of Achievement and their gear bags. These presentations were followed by light refreshments.

This City v Country Clash is the best opportunity for family and friends to watch their sons/daughters/nephews/nieces/ grandchildren play prior to leaving for the Championships. With the Tournament being held in Tasmania, the cost precludes many families from making the trip over to support these teams.

The teams left Perth on Thursday 2 July for the Tournament which started on Saturday 4 July and ended on Saturday 11 July 2015.
