



AFL Victoria's premier competitions of course remain a constant focus, with the Peter Jackson VFL, TAC Cup and Victorian Women's Football League all at interesting stages of the season.

It is during the icy cold weekends of July that premiership tilts begin and anticipation builds for what is to come at the start of spring.

Our Vic Country and Vic Metro Academy staff members had almost no time to dwell on the completion of the NAB AFL U18 Championships with the U16 Championships kicking off last weekend.

Not only is Victoria represented by Vic Country and Vic Metro but also a host of indigenous and multicultural youngsters participating in the Flying Boomerangs and the World Team.

Last week also saw the season finale of our TAC Youth Girls Academies with the girls from all six academies gathering at Ikon Park to play a series of matches.

It's exciting to see the level of improvement in the girls from November last year to now, after they have enjoyed expert coaching and extra training, and completed a personal development program similar to what players in the TAC Cup undertake.

Our community department has also been significantly busy, preparing for this Saturday's representative matches between AFL Victoria Country and the Victorian Amateur Football Association.

The two rivals will go head-to-head in three separate clashes at Bendigo's Queen Elizabeth Oval as another chapter in the battle between the bush and the burbs is written.

This weekend also marks the end of the school holidays and the end of our July School Holiday Programs. The one-day super clinics have proven very successful across Victoria and provided another option to introduce young boys and girls to football.

The size of football community might be incredibly large but last week we saw its ability to unite after the tragic death of Adelaide Crows coach Phil Walsh.

From grass roots clubs wearing black armbands and VFL and TAC Cup games pausing for a minute's silence to the scenes witnessed following the completion of AFL matches, the football community was able to show its support for the Walsh family and the Adelaide Football Club at this tragic and difficult time.

A special bond

When a team is the sum of many talented parts spread across Victoria and separated for much of the football year, how do you bring them all together, build relationships and form those parts into a juggernaut?

Handling players hailing from Gippsland to Geelong, Dandenong up to the Murray and over to Ballarat and Bendigo, the challenge for coaches of Vic Country representative teams has always been the same.

It's perhaps best illustrated by the fact that in the 20 editions of the NAB AFL U18 Championships before this year, Country claimed three titles compared to Vic Metro's 11.

While the talent of different teams in different years plays a part in such results, there is nevertheless a hurdle for Country teams to overcome.

However, the coach of the Country side that recently marched undefeated through six matches at the 2015 Championships seems to have cracked the code.

"You have to be really efficient with your time," Paul Henriksen said.

"When we come together, we need to use our time as efficiently as possible and that's just the nature of the locations that we live in.

"Just coming in together for a few days in camps helps us... (It's) that camaraderie you get from just being around one another; the players start to feel comfortable."

A large core of this year's Division 1 title-winning team has been gradually, sporadically building camaraderie with each other for several years now, dating back to when Vic Country took out the AFL U16 Championships in 2013.

Henriksen also coached that U16 team and has seen the core group of boys develop through two successful national carnivals.

"They walked in the front door as 15 and 16-year-olds and, for me personally, I'm (now) seeing them walk out the door and whatever comes our way, those relationships we've forged over the last three years have been really important," he said.

"It's something I'm really appreciative of – to have those relationships."

Forging strong relationships in very short spaces of time is clearly a key to success for any Vic Country squad.

But, as Henriksen also acknowledges, sharing success together keeps the ball rolling – and the 2013 U16 Championships was where it all started for this group.

U18 Country representatives Tom Cole, Kieran Collins, Josh Dunkley, Nash Holmes, Aidyn Johnson (injured for the 2015 Championships), Jake Lovett (also injured), Rhys Mathieson, Kurt Mutimer, Gach Nyuon, Darcy Parish, Josh Schache, Sam Skinner, Darcy Tucker, Jacob Weitering and Brandon White were all part of the U16 team that won the title two years ago.

Henriksen said their previous shared success bonded them together, but the measure of this core group of players was the way they welcomed different teammates into the fold at the U18 level.

"That's really important within the group," Henriksen said.

"They bring others in and say: 'This is the way we'd like to play; please get involved. If you've got any more questions, you're all part of us.'"

Josh Schache, Vic Country's MVP and Larke Medallist as the best player in Division 1 of the 2015 Championships, also looks back to the U16 carnival as the root of this year's success.

"We've been together a fair while," the 199cm key forward said.

"Henri' was our coach in U16s, so this year we already sort of had a feeling for being pretty successful because we had the same group of people together back then.

"The other boys who came in for the first time this year were able to build on that and really added something to the team."

Some of those players are Schache's fellow Murray Bushrangers, with underage players Jy Simpkin and Will Brodie having a big impact on Country's fortunes, as well as 19-year-old David Mennen – Schache's roommate when the team travelled interstate.

Others from elsewhere in the state have also formed bonds with the possible no.1 draft pick.

Schache said Sam Skinner from the Gippsland Power is "a really good bloke to be around", as is Dandenong Stingray Gach Nyuon.

Meanwhile, another Dandenong player, Jacob Weitering – Vic Country's captain and also a possible no.1 draft pick – has impacted Schache in a different way.

"On the field he leads by example and off the field too; he

doesn't do much wrong," Schache said.

"I definitely look towards him if I need to do anything."

Efficiently using the precious little time they have together to build such relationships has been the key to Vic Country's all-conquering U18 Championships.

The team kick-started its campaign with Simpkin's set-shot goal after the siren securing win no.1 against Vic Metro in thrilling circumstances, before accounting for Western Australia by 105 points in Round 2 and winning the rematch with Metro by 35 points in Round 3.

Victories against South Australia by 28 points and then 11 points, and finally a 32-point defeat of WA sealed the perfect Championships for Country.

Of the core group that has been together since the 2013 U16 Championships, Schache, Weitering, Nyuon, Dandenong's Kieran Collins and Geelong Falcons Darcy Parish and Rhys Mathieson made the All Australian team, along with Gippsland's Ben Ainsworth and North Ballarat Rebel Jarrod Berry – four more selections than any other team.

Clearly, Paul Henriksen and everyone at Vic Country were doing something right.

Positivity the key for Brown

After six mostly frustrating years on Geelong's AFL list, Sandringham's Mitch Brown is relishing the chance to play in the Peter Jackson VFL this season with less expectation on him.

But while his great form has helped the Zebras establish themselves in the top eight, Brown's personal goal is to one day make it back to the elite level.

The 24-year-old was delisted at the end of 2014 after a combination of injury and lack of opportunity in Geelong's dominant senior team prevented him from fully reaching his potential at Simonds Stadium.

The no.15 pick in the 2008 AFL Draft, 196cm Brown played 53 VFL games and just 15 AFL games with the Cats as a tall forward and, later, a tall defender.

For the 2015 season, the Sandringham local looked closer to home and signed with the Zebras, where he found coaches willing to help him achieve his goal.

"At the start of the year, I spoke to (senior coach) Paul Hudson and the coaching staff and said my goal was to get back to the AFL," Brown said.

"Huddo's bought in to what my goal is and he's open to playing me wherever; I've been up forward, played down back a bit and now recently I've been moved to the wing.

"He's been fantastic for me."

Brown said the team always comes first, but he's happy to help out while showing AFL recruiters his on-field versatility at the same time.

Those recruiters would have to be impressed with the performances Brown is producing this season.

He has booted 14 goals in 11 matches, averaging 19 disposals and seven marks per game – but in his last five outings, that disposal average has rocketed up to 25.

Having the freedom recently to roam on a wing clearly agrees with Brown, as does his status as one of Sandringham's experienced heads.

Brown learnt from some of the best players of the modern era at Geelong and is now using his own knowledge to guide his younger teammates.

"We have a few experienced players like myself, Clint Jones, Trent Dennis-Lane, Myke Cook and Adam Cockie who've all had AFL experience, so I think we have to mentor those younger players," Brown said.

Someone he's enjoying having the chance to help is his younger brother Darcy, who returned to play with Sandringham after two senior games with the Zebras in 2012 and then two seasons playing local footy.


Mitch hasn't taken the field with 23-year-old Darcy since they were at school together due to the 179cm wingman being unable to crack into Sandringham's strong senior side this year.

But his own frustrating experience in the AFL means Mitch is well qualified to advise his brother.

"I've just told him to stay confident," Mitch said.

"Even though it's tough to get a game in the ones at the moment, I've just told him to stay positive and if he keeps playing well, (a senior game) will come."

The need to stay positive is certainly a lesson Mitch Brown has learnt during his football career to date – he'll be hoping it helps return him to the AFL at season's end.

Female umpiring breaks the boundaries

History was made in the Peter Jackson VFL last weekend with the first female boundary umpire officiating a senior game.

Former Essendon District FL and Western Region FL umpire Shannessy Adams ran the boundary in the Round 12 Collingwood vs Sandringham clash, continuing a breakout year for female umpires in the competition.

Adams joins Eleni Glouftsis, who last month became the first female senior field umpire in the VFL, and Kate Griffiths, now a regular senior goal umpire in the competition, as three of six females on the 2015 umpire list.

After consistent performances in the Development League and TAC Cup, Adams was rewarded with a senior call-up in her first year in the AFL Victoria umpire development squad.

Adams is well attuned to the game of football, commencing her umpiring in the EDFL before a successful playing career with St Albans in the Victorian Women's Football League, where she captained the reserves to the 2012 premiership.

Having achieved her goal of a premiership, Adams looked for her next challenge and returned to umpiring with the WRFL, where she was regular in the seniors.

It wasn't long before she was nominated to trial for the AFL Victoria panel, gaining a spot in the umpire development squad at the start of this year.

Initially, her aims were simple.

"I just want to improve as much as I can," Adams said earlier this year.

"I don't expect to get any finals or anything in my first year because there's quite a big squad as it is, so just to get through the season and work on all my one-percenters, and just try to fine tune little bits and pieces

so next year I can go in and aim for a final."

Her current form and quick development might fast-track those aims, as she continues to work on areas that will allow her to consistently be a senior boundary umpire.

"I've been working on my throw-ins a lot," Adams said.

"I've been doing a bit of strength work outside of training so I can just improve in that aspect, and working on my technique."

The boundary umpire pioneer officiated as part of the historic all-female umpire panel in a TAC Cup match in May this year, with the same female panel to also umpire the AFL Women's Exhibition match in August between Melbourne and the Western Bulldogs.

The next stage may be seeing a female officiate in all three umpiring disciplines in a VFL senior game before year's end.

Head Umpiring Coach Cameron Nash said it's a strong possibility, with AFL Victoria continuing to promote and drive female participation in umpiring.

"It is pleasing to be able to appoint the first female boundary umpire to a VFL match," Nash said.

"She was selected on merit and hopefully this shows other girls umpiring that if you work hard and set your goals high, you can achieve what Shannessy has."

Nash said Adams has shown quick development since her progression to the AFL Victoria umpire development squad from the WRFL.

"Shannessy trains extremely hard and her performances this year have been to a very high standard, so she thoroughly deserves her opportunity."

Milestones for Langford, Moloney

Port Melbourne's Tom Langford plays his 100th Peter Jackson VFL match against the Casey Scorpions at Casey Fields this Sunday, while Collingwood vice-captain Ben Moloney reaches his 50-game milestone against Footscray at VU Whitten Oval on Saturday.

27-year-old Langford has turned himself into a regular senior player in a strong team at the Borough since 2012.

The former Oakleigh Charger, who also previously played with West Adelaide in the SANFL and Tasmania, is putting together a strong season, averaging 20.8 disposals across 10 games played.

24-year-old Moloney has been a revelation in the Magpies' midfield since crossing to the club from Werribee ahead of the 2013 season.

The tough onballer has played 38 matches with Collingwood after managing 11 senior games in three seasons with the Tigers, where he won Werribee's reserves best-and-fairest award in 2011 and 2012.

Originally from Geelong, Moloney is enjoying a stellar season, averaging 20.8 disposals and featuring in the Magpies' best players six times in nine games played.

Cat champ makes rare VFL appearance

Geelong superstar Jimmy Bartel returned to a Peter Jackson VFL field for the first time since 2004 when he played for the Cats against the Casey Scorpions last week.

The 31-year-old joined Chris Judd as a Brownlow Medallist recently making a rare appearance in the VFL, with the retired Carlton great playing a game for the Northern Blues in June 2014 on the comeback trail from injury.

Bartel, renowned as a wet-weather specialist, relished the poor conditions at Casey Fields to be named Geelong's best in a 48-point loss.

The triple premiership player and Norm Smith medallist defied the cold to rack up 30 disposals while wearing his signature long-sleeved jumper... under a regular sleeveless guernsey. Yep, that's how cold it was at Casey Fields on Saturday.



Gianfagna umpires first senior game

Former Northern Blues captain Andre Gianfagna umpired his first senior Peter Jackson VFL match on Saturday in the Collingwood-Sandringham clash at Victoria Park.

The 70-game VFL player is in his second year of umpiring while completing the AFL Player to Umpire program and was rewarded for performing well in the first half of the season in the Development League and TAC Cup.

With six rounds remaining in the TAC Cup home-and-away season, it appears only one spot in the final eight is still up for grabs.

Two games and significant percentage separates the Gippsland Power (5-5-1) in seventh position and the Calder Cannons and Sandringham Dragons below them, who share records of 3-7-1 after Round 12.

A costly third quarter meant Calder missed a golden chance to record a vital win against the third-placed Dandenong Stingrays at RAMS Arena on Saturday.

After taking a six-point lead into the second half, the Cannons conceded six goals to one in the third term, enough to help the Stingrays eventually hold on by seven points.

Sandringham also came agonisingly close to improving its ladder position, drawing with the Geelong Falcons at Avalon Airport Oval despite having five more scoring shots.

The sixth-placed Falcons have now played out two draws in the last three rounds and hold a unique 6-3-2 record.

The Eastern Ranges also kept pace with the top four, denying a rampaging Gippsland Power outfit in thrilling circumstances at Morwell Football Ground.

The 7-4 Ranges took a 35-point lead into the last change, having held the Power to just 1.6 in the first three quarters, but could only watch as Gippsland slammed on six goals to one in the final term to be within three points when the siren sounded.

In the weekend's other results:

- The North Ballarat Rebels maintained a two-game buffer on top of the ladder by defeating the Western Jets by 29 points at Eureka Stadium;
- The second-placed Murray Bushrangers came from behind in the last quarter to knock off a spirited Northern Knights team by six points at Norm Minns Oval; and
- The Oakleigh Chargers moved into the top four with a 95-point win over the Bendigo Pioneers at Queen Elizabeth Oval.

Stars reach milestones

Two former TAC Cup players and one VFL player who have all gone on to become stars of the AFL will bring up significant milestones this weekend.

The biggest name of the trio is premiership-winning Brownlow medallist Dane Swan, who notched his 250th game for Collingwood against Port Adelaide at Adelaide Oval on Thursday night.

The 31-year-old superstar played his junior football with Westmeadows before being drafted out of the Calder Cannons by the Magpies with pick no.58 in the 2001 Draft.

It took a while for Swan to establish himself in Collingwood's senior team, but in time the ball-magnet became one of the league's superstar midfielders.

He was part of the 2010 premiership team and has taken home a swag of individual honours, including the 2011 Brownlow Medal, five All Australian guernseys between 2009-13 and three consecutive club best-and-fairest awards between 2008-10.

North Melbourne defender Scott Thompson will bring up his 150-game milestone when the Kangaroos meet Geelong at Etihad Stadium on Saturday night.

The 29-year-old had a great season with Geelong's premiership-winning VFL team in 2007 after previously playing for South Barwon in the Geelong FL, and the Kangaroos pounced on him with pick no.37 in the 2007 Draft.

He made his debut in Round 1 the next year and has become known for his niggling nature and ability to mix defence with attack, earning All Australian selection and being named the joint-winner of North's best-and-fairest award in 2013.

Explosive West Coast midfielder Luke Shuey will become part of the 100-game club when the Eagles take on Adelaide at Domain Stadium on Saturday night.

The 25-year-old from Bulleen-Templestowe and the Oakleigh Chargers was selected with pick no.18 in the 2008 Draft and was runner-up to Dyson Heppell in the 2011 NAB Rising Star award.

Shuey has become known for winning the ball in tight and then sprinting away from the contest, and has kicked 89 goals to demonstrate his attacking prowess.

Jack jags Rising Star nom

Last year's MVP for Vic Country at the NAB AFL U18 Championships has been recognised for his stellar first-year efforts in the AFL with a NAB Rising Star nomination.

Former Dandenong Stingray Jack Lonie lit up the forward line for St Kilda in the club's 110-point triumph over Essendon at Etihad Stadium on Sunday.

The 18-year-old small forward had 18 disposals, five inside-50s, two goal assists and kicked one spectacular bouncing goal from the boundary line against the Bombers.

The Seaford junior was drafted by the Saints with pick no.41 in the 2014 NAB AFL Draft and has only missed one match since making his senior debut in Round 1.

Lonie's pressure up forward has been a highlight of his short AFL career to date, averaging 3.2 tackles per game. He also averages 12.7 disposals per game and has booted 10 goals.
