SEVEN RDFNL JUNIORS HEADED FOR FAR NORTH QUEENSLAND

Seven Riddell District FNL juniors fly out today for one of the most unique trips of their footballing lives to date as part of the AFL Goldfields Under 17 football team that will travel to Far North Queensland today to play matches against representative sides from AFL Cairns and AFL Townsville/Mackay.

After the success of the trip over the last two years, with several members of both the 2013 and 2014 squads now playing senior football and/or TAC Cup football, AFL Goldfields are once again looking forward to taking a 26-man squad up north featuring players from the Ballarat Football Netball League,

Rupertswood trio Bailee Revell, Dylan Featon & Dylan Landt, Kilmore's Liam Middleton, Melton's Blake Souter, Melton Centrals' Majur Mamur and Sunbury Lions' Brad Bernacki will make the trip to represent the RDFNL, with seven players the largest representation from the league in the three years of the trip.

The team will play against a representative team from AFL Cairns at Cazaly Stadium, Cairns on Sunday 28th June at 3pm, and a second game against a combined team from AFL Townsville and AFL Mackay at Tony Ireland Stadium in Townsville, the site of the Under 19 cricket World Cup final held in late 2012, on Wednesday 1st July at 1pm. The team will also represent AFL Goldfields at the KingPrint Online Bob Davis Trophy in Geelong against AFL Barwon on Sunday July 5th at Hamlyn Heights.

The squad flies out from Melbourne on Saturday 27th June, returning on Thursday 2nd July.

Riddell District FNL Operations Manager, and former East Point FNC Reserves coach Toby Boyle will coach the side, with Anthony Rhodes (RDFNL Junior Interleague Coach), Darren Antonio (CHFL Junior Interleague coach) and Brandon Weatherson (MCDFNL Junior Development Officer) assisting. Ballarat Football Umpires Association Operations Manager Liam Brady, MCDFNL Operations Manager Scott Carey, AFL Goldfields Media, Marketing & Events Manager Shaun Kelly, Ballarat FNL Director Tim Mugridge and North Ballarat Rebels Media Manager Andrew Day will also join the trip in a supervisory capacity.

A developing umpire from each of the umpiring associations that officiate in AFL Goldfields leagues will also travel with the team, with Tom Lyon representing the Ballarat Football Umpires Association and Zac Martin representing Riddell Umpires.

The final selected side, which is listed below, includes players from the RDFNL, Ballarat FNL, Maryborough Castlemaine District FNL and Central Highlands FL

The team had a final training run on Thursday 25th June at Ballarat's City Oval followed by their official Jumper Presentation.

ROMSEY v MACEDON MATCH REVIEW

Romsey fired a strong warning shot to the rest of the competition in the Riddell District Football Netball League with an impressive 18-point win over Macedon in round nine action at Romsey Park. The Redbacks had to dig deep and play at their best to shake off the Cats for most of the second half before star midfielder Zac Saad broke away and kicked four final-term goals. The win has the reigning premiers sitting on top of the ladder.

Conditions were fresh and windy as Macedon took arguably its best lineup into the game, minus Aaron Christiansen. The Redbacks lacked the pace of the injured Matt Burkett but welcomed the addition of speed from youngster Ricky Wood into the team against a tall Macedon lineup.

The Redbacks burst out of the blocks early with goals to Zac Saad and Phil Lobb inside the opening five minutes. The Cats dominated the middle of the term thanks to James Ferry on the wing and Teghan Henderson at halfback. Unfortunately for the visitors, they failed to capitalise on their opportunities by kicking five behinds in six minutes, two from star forward Marcus Kenny from set shots.

The Cats pressed forward to Darren Goodwin on countless occasions but the 2013 Bowen Medallist could not shrug off reigning premiership captain, Steve Burlak. Romsey held firm to lead by nine points at quarter-time. A goal from James Ferry early in the second term put the Cats three points down in a tight, physical contest. Players from both teams struggled to win clean possession, but it was the Redbacks who made the most of restricted opportunities to lead by three goals at half-time.

Jack Mills pressed forward for the Cats and kicked a telling goal on the run to bring his team to within 11 points just two minutes into the second half. The visitors kicked 3.2 to nothing in the first 12 minutes of the third term to hit the front, sparking a vocal Macedon crowd to life. Romsey regained control with goals to Sullivan, Mitchell and Paterson to take the lead by 15 points heading into time on. The pendulum swung back in Macedon's favour with Darren Goodwin and Kenny kicking goals before a steadier from Lobb pushed the Redbacks out to a nine-point lead heading into the final term.

The Cats were back in front when Macedon skipper James Wright kicked a goal at the

16-minute mark of the final term. Zac Saad would prove to be the Cats' worst nightmare. He responded for the Redbacks with a sizzling three goals in four minutes to push the lead out to 16 points at the 22-minute mark. His final goal had him sprint away inside the forward 50 and send the ball through for a mighty goal as the Cats dropped their heads and knew that they fired their best shot. Saad finished with five goals while Romsey captain Steve Burlak was the rock in the backline. Ferry and Davies were strong for the Cats who could not make the most of their opportunities when it counted.

Romsey star backman Ayden Tessari was impressive in the back 50. He welcomed the return of Burlak into the team after missing the first half of the season through injury.

"It helps me out, I'm now not the main defender, he enables me to play more loose," Tessari said, "His talk, leadership and communication is big, he might not be the quickest bloke anymore but he still holds his own."

2015 Laguntas Program Kicks Off

AFL Victoria's Laguntas Program continues to go from strength to strength in the push to provide opportunities for young indigenous footballers.

The 2015 Laguntas Program kicked off earlier this month with a new batch of emerging stars, the vast majority from country Victoria, eager to begin a curriculum that centres not just on developing their football skills but also their personal attributes.

Over the course of three camps, the boys aged 16–18 will train under the guidance of expert coaches, learn about their cultural heritage, develop as individuals and hopefully become young leaders in their local communities.

This year's squad is bursting at the seams with country Victorian boys, with players from Ballarat, Hamilton, Mooroopna, and the Gippsland region figuring prominently.

The focus of the program remains on helping indigenous youngsters make the most of their football ability and to ensure they have the opportunity to thrive in the mainstream talent pathway.

So far this is has been overwhelmingly successful.

The number of indigenous players in the TAC Cup is significantly higher thanks to the programs such as Laguntas (U18) and Kickstart (U15), with 17 boys who have been part of the Laguntas Program over the past few years, now on a TAC Cup list.

Triple Brisbane Lions premiership player Chris Johnson returns to be head coach of Laguntas in 2015, and along with assistants Ricky Coburn and Daniel Charles, is charged with developing the squad's on-field skills and knowledge of the what's needed to reach the highest level.

In partnership with the Korin Gamadji Institute and YMCA, 30 boys from across the state attended the first camp in June, eager to begin a well-trodden football journey.

Over the course of four days, the boys faced fitness testing similar to that conducted at the National Combine and also undertook education sessions on pre-game nutrition and healthy eating in general.

The camp also involved a number of cultural activities, including boomerang throwing and listening to traditional indigenous music with Ron Murray.

On the final day of the camp after three days of getting to know one another, the squad took to the field wearing the Richmond indigenous jumper against the Victoria Country U16 side.

In a highly entertaining contest, it was Vic Country that eventually emerged victorious but not before the Laguntas Squad showed just how much talent lies within its ranks.

AFL Victoria Indigenous Programs Manager Aaron Clark said he was thrilled with the way the boys attacked the weekend.

"It's a pretty a big thing to take these guys out of their comfort zone and it's an intense weekend full of learnings," he said.

"Just to meet a whole group of other indigenous boys from different parts of the state is great opportunity and in the past we have seen long term friendships develop that really help as they grow into young men."

"On the football sides of things, we were really impressed with the level of improvement from Friday to the match against Vic Country and there is doubt a number of these guys have the potential take their football a long way."

WESTERN WATER NETBALL WRAP

Diggers Rest is ready to make its move in the Riddell District Netball League.

After a tough draw and injuries to key players hampered the season's start, the Burras enter the second half of the year at full strength and desperate to repeat a finals appearance on top of last year's.

While her side sits outside the top six, Diggers Rest coach Amy Carroll is taking plenty of positives from the opening eight rounds.

The Burras got the better of last year's premiers, Melton Centrals, and were also competitive against perennial powerhouses Rupertswood and Riddell.

"I think we've actually started a bit better than we did last year," Carroll said.

"We've played a lot of the top teams for the first part of the season and had losses against Riddell and Rupo, but I still thought they were quite strong games.

"I don't think the scores really reflected what those games were actually like."

Carroll is full of praise for her side's defenders who, she says, have done an outstanding job through the first half of the season.

First-year player Megan Jennings hasn't missed a beat since joining the Burras and has formed a strong combination with Georgia Vicendese.

Together, the pair has caused major headaches for some of the league's top attackers.

Carroll believes the key to taking the next step is the Burras limiting their unforced errors.

"Those top sides have got a lot of really strong VNL (Victorian Netball League) players whereas our girls probably aren't as experienced," she said.

"When we make those unforced errors, the top teams really capitalise on them and it becomes a two- or three-goal turnaround each time.

"Hopefully, that's where we can improve,"
Carroll said. "It's just the occasional bad pass or
missed goal."

Following back-to-back byes, Diggers Rest will be on court next week against Rockbank.

It will be the perfect opportunity for the Burras to kickstart a charge towards the finals, with the Rams having just one win for the season.

While the young Burras did an outstanding job just to make finals last season, Carroll would like to see her side take another step forward in its development this year.

"We definitely want to make the finals . . . that would be our first goal," she said.

"Then, being a lot more competitive in those finals would be our main goal this year.

"I think we're really building as a team and, hopefully, in the years coming we can be one of those dominating teams."

Meanwhile, in games played in the Western Water RDFNL A Grade netball competition last weekend Macedon and Riddell have set up a top-of-the-table clash for next Saturday in the Riddell District Netball League.

Both have won all their eight matches after Macedon beat Romsey and Riddell rolled Rockbank on Saturday.

The Cats were made to work hard for their 55-47 win over the Redbacks at Romsey Park.

The Cats led at every break and each time it looked as if they would blow the game away, the Redbacks fought back.

Macedon led by five goals at three-quarter time and didn't let the Redbacks get any closer.

Rebecca Colwell scored 48 goals for the Cats, while Hope Evans was just as strong at the other end with 41.

The Bombers continued their winning run, 52–30 against the Rams.

Lancefield had its game won at quarter-time when it led 19-4 against Woodend-Hesket.

The Tigers extended that in each quarter, and with Courtney Annett scoring 40 goals and Savaii Williams chipping in with 30, the final score was 78-15.

Kilmore got its first win of the season in a thriller against Sunbury Kangaroos.

Kilmore had to survive a second half comeback from the Kangaroos to win 29-26.

They led by eight goals at half-time and six after three-quarters as the Kangaroos continued to push for a win.

Samantha George was the best for Kilmore and Toni Fogarty the standout for the Kangaroos.

Romsey put the rest of the competition on notice with a strong 18 point win over Macedon. The Redbacks kicked out of the blocks early before fighting off numerous comebacks from the Cats to record victory. Unfortunately, their fighting spirit against the top teams don't always result in four points and that is the difference between them making and not making the finals. The fought back in the final term with the Sharks with the likes of Matt Bulluss, Peduto and Walsh standing up. Jake Hall was at his slick and silky best and John Baker returned to kick two goals. A late starter to the season, Wight has improved with every round and caused many headaches for opposition forwards this year. Tevita Fonua impressed in the midfield with his great hardness at the ball and winning plenty of the ball. Scott Lambert showed his great strength as a valuable tall while the return of Scott Swindells was a great welcome.

The Centrals will be desperate to get back on the winner's list after a disappointing performance against the Pies. Rexhepi broke the confidence of the backmen with 10 goals and the midfield could

The Sharks took on everything that the Roos threw at them and still held firm. Leigh Brennan impressed in his 200th game with two valuable goals.

Marcus Webb kept up his fine form for the Blues last while Hayden and Bronson Phillips impressed with their Senior call up. The brothers have been instrumental in the Under 18.5s this year, Hayden as the captain of the team. Both will get better with experience and make the most of their opportunities should they get the call up again. Chris Tarrant was a welcome addition to the team and shared plenty of experience with the young Kilmore stars.

Rupertswood will expect to win this game, boost their percentage and make a claim for the top two positions in the coming weeks. However, Kilmore have shown small signs of improvement in their last two weeks against Riddell and Sunbury

The Cats were bold in defeat against the Redbacks. Zac Saad broke their hearts in the final term with four goals and ending the contest. They hit the front at the 16 minute mark of the final term, but that was it. Darren Goodwin impressed at centre half forward and pressed into the middle while James Ferry was handy in his one off appearance. Kenny was well held by a firm Romsey backline but he doesn't have two bad weeks. He kicked 1.4 and could have kicked 4.1 on his day at least. Jason Davies was a monster in the backline and re-affirmed himself as one of the best back pockets in the competition. He took on Phil Lobb and held him for most of the game.

The season is on the line for the Cats this week. With games against Romsey, Riddell and Rupertswood over a three week stretch, they would hope to win at least one of those games to be a genuine threat in the competition. They've lost two games to the top six teams this year and have the potential to run with the best. Riddell have gained some momentum with wins over Kilmore and Rockbank in the past two weeks after Rupertswood enjoyed a convincing win over them in round seven. These two teams have a great rivalry, expect another explosive chapter to be added this week.







The Senior boys tried hard all game and should be proud of their efforts. Special mentions to Marcus Webb and James Atkinson who both played fantastic games.


The Reserves had a tough day with only 10 players available before the U18.5s players doubled up to help field a side. A big thank you to Wayne and Chris George for helping out and playing.



The RDFNL will again be conducting a Foundation Coaching Course on Sunday 5th July, at the Sunbury Junior Football Club, Mitchells Lane, Sunbury from 9:00–1:00. As part of our commitment to developing all of our coaches throughout the league, all coaches are required to have the minimum coaching accreditation, and we are committed to providing our coaches with these opportunities. We will also apply to conduct a Development course later in the year also.

The cost of the Foundation course is \$75 and you must complete the online component of the course prior to attending the course, which has been accessed through learning.ausport.gov.au

Netball Australia are also adapting the Coach Approach to coaching, and through completing the coaching accreditations the coaching blueprints hope that all coaches will adopt the philosopy.

The Netball Australia Coach Approach (Coach Approach) is a philosophical approach to coaching, promoting player learning and ownership of that learning through creating awareness, responsibility and self-belief. Many of the ideas embedded in the Coach Approach are not new, but simply a reinforcement of contemporary best practice in coaching and how players can learn most effectively. The Coach Approach aims to create resilient and competent players who are motivated to enjoy their participation in netball and able to positively influence their own development, regardless of their level of participation.

The Coach Approach is underpinned by expert input and evidence, utilising research from around the globe into current world leading coaching practice in netball and many other sports. Netball Australia and the Member Organisations want to ensure that coaches

are supported to be the best they can be, in the coaching environments they wish to operate in. The Coach Approach provides coaches with a clear coaching philosophy that will be embedded in coach development programs, products and/or resources that support coaches to continually develop and improve.

How often have you seen or heard the following?

- Coaches mostly telling players what to do, rather than asking players what they think they should do?
- A coach saying to a player, "don't do that, do this"?

- Players trying harder and harder but performances not improving?
- Players who can do it in practice, but can't transfer these skills into competition?
- Two (or more) very different players with different needs being treated the same way?
- Players being bored at training and/or during competition?
- Coaches constantly talking 'at' players?

A coach-centred approach is when the coach plays an autocratic and central role in the learning process and the player makes few or no decisions in the learning process. This method is limited to the imagination, knowledge and delivery skills of the coach.

The Netball Australia Coach Approach encourages far greater use of a player-centred approach to coaching. In a player-centred coaching approach the coach facilitates or guides

the learning however the responsibility for learning shifts towards the player who has an increased input into the decision-making in the planning, execution and evaluation of the learning process.

A player-centred approach is encouraged because:

- Different groups of players and different individuals have different needs
- Simply telling is not effective. Research shows that player enjoyment, development and performances increase when coaches tell less and ask more
- Players learn best when they have input into what they do in practice/ training and during competition; and therefore have ownership of the learning process
- A player-centred approach develops players' awareness, ownership and self-belief.

A great weekend of netball ahead with the highlight being the top and the table match between Riddell and Macedon. Riddell will be without Mikayla Vaughan who is off with ANL commitments with the Vic Furies, but Riddell's depth should be able to cover her. Danni Davidson will have her hands full trying to combat Bec Colwell who is having a wonderful season. Macedon's Kate McLeod has been a wonderful addition to the Cats line up and looking forward to see if she lines up on Christine Harris. Should be a great game.


