

SCW GAME PREVIEWS



As we hit R18 every team has something to play for, be it some pride, form heading into finals or the chance to move up a spot on the ladder. Other than Hume City up on top and the top five being totally cemented, there is room for some movement inside the top five, and outside of it.

McKinnon starts the weekend with home game against Southern Peninsula and based now hat we've seen from each team this season it would be a massive upset if the Cougars won. A big does of player turnover has hurt the Cougars this season and no doubt they are going through somewhat of a rebuild, so let's be patient. As for the Sharks, a massive thumbs up for them in their first season at this level. Young, dynamic and a fearless approach to the game. Let's hope they can hold their nerve during finals and bring an x-factor. Sharks to win this one.

Bulleen and Warrandyte clash in what should be a victory for the Boomers, however the Venom has won six of their last seven and could sneak into sixth with a win here, marking a much better season than 2014.

Reed, Dargan and Hederics will all need to produce something special if the Venom do get up, plus they'll need to quell the influence of Taylor Hall. There's a lot to like about the form the Boomers are in and if they are to carry that into finals they need to win games like this one.

Ringwood should prove too strong for Eltham on Sunday. The Hawks are loaded with talent and like a few others around them, they know it's important to be in form come August. Whilst it hasn't been a typically dominant season for Amber Hegge, the Hawks star import knows what finals are all about and she will be keen to get a running start at them with a big game here. As for the Wildcats, they have relied heavily on Olivia Bontempelli this season and will need another massive game from her here if they are any sort of a chance.

Waverley may not be at full strength at the right end of the season, but they are well coached and always go hard, so don't write them off. Heading into the finals they get a plum opportunity to spread the minutes and build some confidence with what will be an easy win against Sherbrooke. Much has been said of the Suns this season, but the reality is they are out of their depth and need to rebuild at a lower level, hopefully using their youth team to help produce stars of the future. A comfortable win for the Falcons coming up.

The season comes to an end for Diamond Valley with a tough encounter at home against Hume City. The Broncos look primed for a red-hot crack at a three-peat, an incredible effort that we can only all sit back and admire. Colleen Planeta and Viv Saad are in ripping form and will need to keep that going now with the news that Samara Gallaher will miss some games due to the good news she has been selected for her native New Zealand. The Eagles are young and will hopefully take away plenty of lessons from this season. With Dee Butler in place for the future, no doubt things will only get better for the Eagles from here.

SCW GAME PREVIEWS—WRAP



aThough the top five has been settled for the last month, the jostling for the double chance and home court finals is on in earnest. Southern Peninsula's form is red-hot right now and another big win, this time an 85-67 victory against Diamond Valley, has them in fine touch at the right end of the season. The Sharks jumped to an early lead against the Eagles and never looked back, with Jamie Pearce (20pts) and Ella Hellessey (11pts, 17rbs, 6ast) doing the hard work. For the Eagles, Katie O'Neill (20pts) and Shannon Dufficy (13pts, 10rbs) led the way.

Waverley looks certain to be on the road in a knock-out final in the opening week of the playoffs after succumbing to Warrandyte by 8pts. The Venom utilised a 35-20 run during the middle quarters to set up the victory with Chastity Reed (22pts) proving the big difference between the two teams, leading her side to a sixth win in seven games. For the Falcons, Carly Mijovic came back in and contributed 22pts and 11rbs, though nine turnovers proved costly.

Bulleen powered on to a seventh straight win, this time cleaning up Melbourne with ease, winning 81-49. The Boomers are looming as a dark horse for the title this season and look to have hit form at the right end. With a 25-6 start against the Tigers, this contest was wrapped up quickly, dominated by Taylor Hall (23pts, 6rbs, 7stl). Best for Melbourne was Emily Suckling (12pts).

Hume City didn't take long to bounce back from a rare loss, heading out to Eltham and taking care of business with a 70-43 victory. Despite the best efforts of Olivia Bontempelli (20pts), who clearly needed some scoring help given the next best scorer was back on 6pts, the Wildcats were never in the contest. Colleen Planeta

dropped 30pts and Viv Saad chimed in with 11pts at the Broncos got back on the winner's list.

The Broncos backed it up on Sunday with a massive 90-20 win against Sherbrooke, marking the lowest ever score in SCW history and pushing the Suns closer to a winless season. The quarterly breakdowns paint a bleak picture for the Suns (19-9, 25-4, 16-5, 30-2) and if not for 8pts from the foul line, believe it not the result could have ben worse. Committing 35 turnovers, shooting at under 13 per cent and beaten on the boards by 31, this was a dark day for Sherbrooke's women's program. Planeta finished with 26pts and Saad added 24pts.

Eltham bounced back on Sunday with a strong win at McKinnon, getting across the line by 18pts courtesy of a strong start (20-9) and finish (17-10). Bontempelli (20pts, 10rbs, 7ast) was up and about again and Ash McBean had 14pts. For the Cougars, who haven't lived up to expectations this season, Rachael Quirk (13pts) and Mel loannidis (12pts) led the team in scoring.

Bulleen pushed Ringwood all the way in the last game for the round, proving that they are right in the race for the title this year and should be respected highly when the August action rolls around. With Lauren Pearce well held, Taylor Hall (16pts, 8rbs) again delivered solid numbers for the Boomers, but it wasn't enough to counter four Ringwood starters hitting double digits, led by Amber Hegge and Lauren Oosdyke with 12pts each. In what proved to be a very even game across all areas, the competitive performance shows we're in for a ripper finals series.


