One of the more challenging positions in any football club is that of the coach of the junior team. The Hamilton Kangaroos are no exception to the rule. Having to combat the calls on your team members from host of different and competing attractions, such as VCE, work



schedules, acquisition of a drivers licence and even Debutant Practice! One other factor has surfaced, particularly this season; that of the age group change in junior football in Hamilton, from Under 16s to Under 17.5. Jason McIntosh explains "Young footballers are happy to stay in the junior ranks for that extra year, rather than test their ability at Hampden League level" And of course there is also the lure of playing in a finals campaign, when it is obvious the local Under 18s will not feature in September". "Also we have to face the simple fact that boys are just not playing or going on with football in the numbers that they did in years past. I guess smaller families could also be factor" "Having to call on so many players from the Junior ranks to play on Match Permit this season was always going to be a critical factor at this time of year, with many of those opting to play in the Junior Finals on Sunday's rather than with the Kangaroos on Saturday". "We had a very slow start to the season with numbers on the training track hard to come by, but the latter part of the year has been much better as the boys start to gel and understand a little better the standards required in Hampden League Football". "When we are playing at our best, we can play some really good footy". "My philosophy like most Junior Coaches is to instil the basics of footy into each player, not only as an individual but importantly learning to be part of a team. "I would like to thank my assistant coaches Hamish Waldron, Bill Feely and Dean Jenkinson also bench 'stats' staff Gary Nield, Michael Kearney and others for all of the great help, advice, and moral support that has been of enormous help this season"
