SECRETARY'S REPORT

Mr. CHAIRMAN and MEMBERS of NEWTOWN & CHILWELL FOOTBALL CLUB:

Herewith is a brief summary of the activities of your club for the 1964 season and it marks the completion of the 31st season of the Newtown and Chilwell Football Club.

Over the years the Clubs Committees have proven their ambition and goal is to improve and increase facilities, encourage sportsmanship between all, and accommodate and cater for therequirements of all sportsloving citizens, but, I have never before enjoyed the co-operation and satisfaction which was attained by being a member of the Newtown and Chilwell Football Club for season. Although success on the field plays a major part towards successful running of a committee we cannot overlook the importance of a co-operative committee, which proved that itis capable of overcoming all arising adversities as in 1964.

On the field we experienced our most sussessful season ever with the efforts of two teams trying for the honour of being the clubs No. I team. I feel the Evelyn Hurst side takes this honour very narrowly from the Under I5 "A" side with the efforts of repeating the I962-3 success by annexing the I964 Pennant to the Clubs collection. It is impossible to single out any one factor which was solely responsible, above another dozen, in bringing about this Pennant.

As predicted in the I963 report air Under I5 "A" side was the team which, in my opinion landed most pride and satisfaction for the committee and all connected. It is uneticate to individualise any one person in an overall report, but the devotion, leadership, and overall coaching of the sideby Raymond Degoldi cannot be passed without special mention.

Athough defeated in the replay of the Grand final, the draw with this star studded Barwon side must have been the greatest moral booster he has ever enjoyed, because never before has the Committee enjoyed such a triumph.

The two sides which indirectly played an entrieus. part in the success of the above sides are the Bancroft and Under 15 B teams. Although unsuccessful in the search of Pennants in their our sections all connected made Club success their No.I goal thus bringing about the Evelyn Hurst pennant and with one point of the Clubs first Under 15 Pennant.

The Under IS teams competed without gaining the right to participate in the final series and experienced their leanest season for several years, yet although outclassed by more experienced and better equiped teams at no stage did the sides falter as drop the will to win by which the club is renowned.

On the Credit side is much by which the Club must benefit, firstly being the successfull launching of the second team and also the schoolin of several very promising boys. Several of these boys participated in the Bancroft finals and stamped themselves as Evelyn Hurst players of the near future. • •
