CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

CONSTITUTIONAL ALTERATIONS

(1) PROPOSED NEWTOWN SPORTS CLUB

Motion received that the Committee of the N. & C.F.C. take the necessary action so that a body to be known as the Newtown Sports Club can be formed at the Annual Meeting. This body to have Jurisdiction over all sporting activities centered on Elserslie Reserve.

(2) TO BE INCLUDED IN CONSTITUTION OF NEWTOWN & CHILWELL FOOTBALL CLUB AS CLAUSE 25.

The Social Committee shall be formed at a special meeting called by the President and consist of a Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and Financial Members of the Club.

(25a) Any Member can vote on Committee Matters from the 2nd Meeting except for the Formation Meeting.

(25b) Any Member absent from 3 consecutive Meetings without written apology and acceptance of same by the Committee shall lose voting privelege.

- (3) Add to Clause 2 after "Club Committees" and Committeemen as elected.
- (4) NEW CLAUSE, AS (2b) -

"All Committeemen to be acceptable to a majority of those Members present at the Annual Meeting or a 2/3 majority at a General Meeting."

TREASURER REPORT

SENIOR COACHES REPORT

Pre-Season training started officially with a beach day at Anglesea. Training prior to the commencement of the practice games was varied in as much that we trained against the clock rather than ourselves. Because of the extra games only three practice matches were played amongstourselves, Geelong U/19 and Morwell Football Club.

The Season commenced the same as in other years with both sides recording good wins and playing excellent football. Early wins embedded us in the four, although we had our slump and were beaten by teams who were lower on the ladder. Of the last twelve games we recorded only two losses against Thomson and St. Peters.

Undoubtdedly the best performances were those against East Geelong, Barwon and St. Mary's, on each occasion we were under a tremendous amount of pressure realizing that a loss could put us out of the four and a win would put us nearer second position.

On the completion of the home and home games the Senior side finished fourth and the Reserves finished on top of the ladder.
