Our ladies of the social committee, although small in number, made a great contribution to the Club once again. Apart from their financial help, their various fund raising activities, players' nights and presentation nights were greatly appreciated by all members. I only hope that their numbers will grow next year, to ease their burden.

Other matters relating to the Clubs' activities will be capably covered by those responsible, but in closing 1976, I believe the Club functioned as efficiently and effectively as possible, and our fund raising achievements greatly improved, and in this regard, thanks go to Ross McKenzie and Stan McIntosh for their tireless work and of course, Andy Weizbowski, our competent treasurer, who held the reins.

I believe the Club is well on the way back and if members give their support to the incoming committee, I have no doubt that we will be even more successful next year.
