WIN STANLEY SHIELD

Various senior soccer teams have played the first knockout round for the Win Stanley Shield. Following knockout rounds will occur during late July, early August.

This Shield is held in memory of a talented Toowoomba footballer who died as results of injuries suffered in a motor vehicle accident.

Ian David (Dickie) WinStanley was only twenty when he died. It was expected that the well liked ex-Rockville Primary and Toowoomba State High school student, who was continuously a part of the junior and senior representative teams, would eventually gain recognition through his talent to become part of the Australian national team.

By age 16, Ian was participating in the senior division competition. By 17 he was Captain of the U18 Toowoomba Team and at 18 he was Captain of the U21 Toowoomba team.

Ian WinStanley was also talented enough to gain selection in the state team that played against New South Wales. The highlight of Ian's young promising career was in receiving the Stanley Prasser Memorial Trophy, presented by the Willowburn Soccer Club for being the best and fairest player of 1960.

This recognition of a great player was a sure start towards a professional career that could have easily incorporated a place in the Socceroos Soccer Team.

Unfortunately his life and career was cut drastically short and the loss of such a wonderful person and talented footballer can not be truly relayed in words.

Thus the annual WinStanley Shield is a small way to remember this great player of his time.

Local High School makes Bill Turner Cup regional finals.

Throughout the last couple of months soccer teams from various high schools across the Darling Downs region have been competing in the Australia wide Bill Turner Schools Cup for under 15 boys. The under 15 girls are competing in the Bill Turner Trophy.

This is a very large Australian based competition with official endorsement by the Australian soccer Federations of most states. These organizations recognize and support the importance of this competition towards recognizing the growing skill of our players.

The Bill Turner Cup was started in Northern New South Wales by the then N.S.W. Schools Committee, chaired by Mr. Bill Turner. Bill decided to make a knock-out competition for 15yr olds and under. In the early days of 1979 there were 34 teams participating. It was sponsored by the Commonwealth Bank up until 1999 and was almost scrapped for lack of sponsorship support until the current sponsor LG picked it up in 2000.

In 2001 there were 191 teams in Queensland alone that participated in the Cup competition and last year saw an amazing total of 900 schools compete. In 2008, Illawarra Sports High won over the favoured Westfield Sports High 1-0, while Cavendish Road State High from Qld took out 3rd place.

This year both Harristown State High girls and boys U15 soccer teams have again won through to the finals of their regional area. If both teams win their games this month, they will be one more game away from being in a State Quarter final draw with three other state finalists of which Cairns has already qualified.

The boys will play Brisbane Grammar on 29th July at 1:30pm at Middle Ridge.

The girls will play against Albany Creek on the 28th July at Harristown.

It would be great to see those within the community who can, go along and support our local soccer teams.

With the kids still raving about the experience of playing before the Raiders match and having the opportunity to walk out with the players before their state league match, it is hoped that this event becomes a semiregular event on the SWIN calendar.
