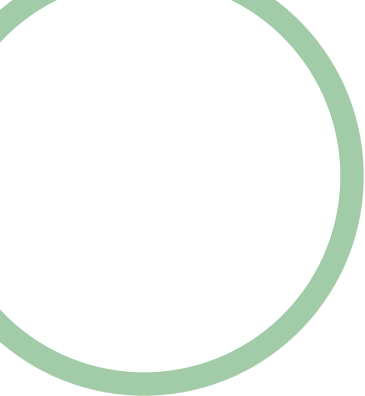

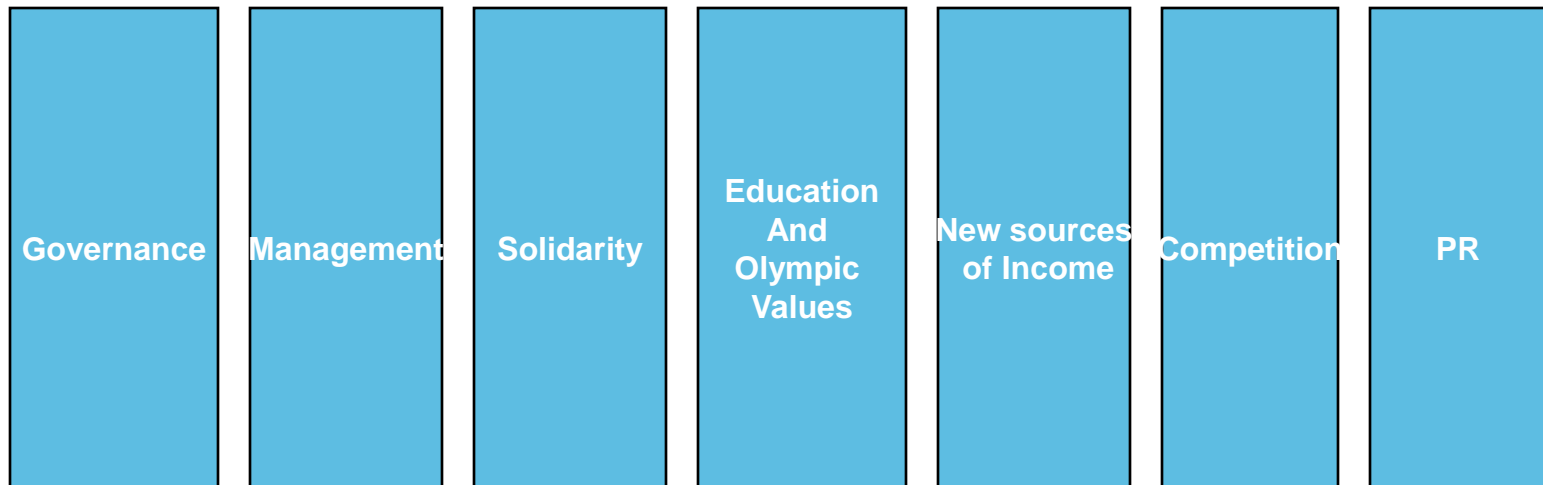

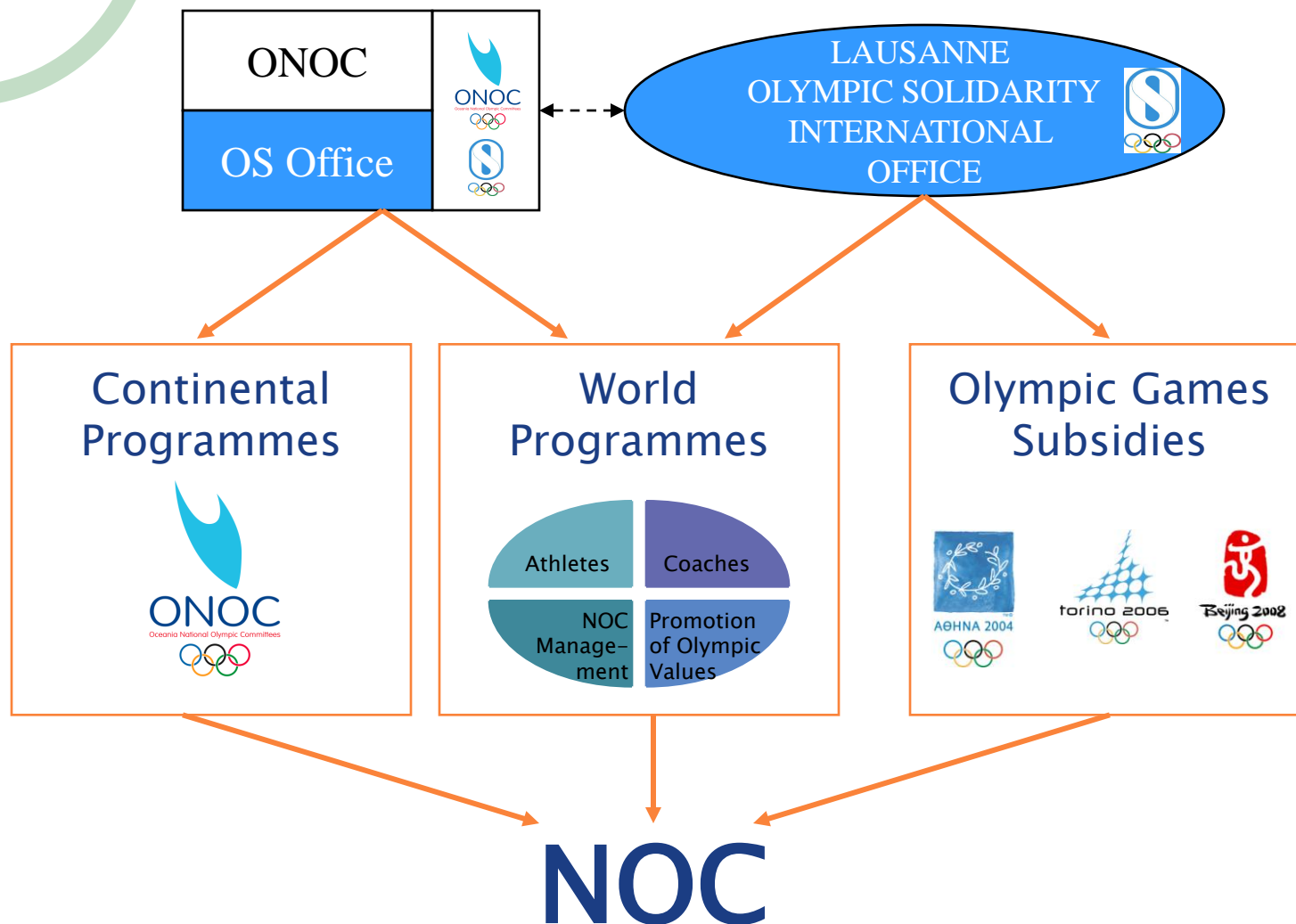




ONOC Infrastructure

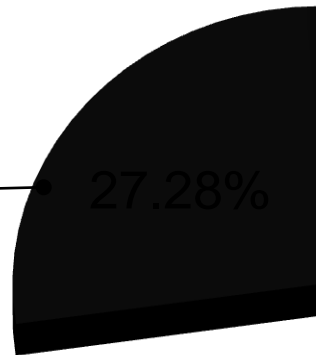
