

## What is Sport?

The UN Inter-Agency Task Force defines sport as follows: "Incorporated into the definition of 'sport' are all forms of physical activity that contribute to physical fitness, mental well-being and social interaction. These include play, recreation, organized casual or competitive sport, and indigenous sports or games." Play also offers physical activity that is fun, unstructured, and participatory.

## What is Sport for Development?

Sport can cut across barriers that divide societies, making it a powerful tool to support conflict prevention and peacebuilding efforts, both symbolically on the global level and very practically within communities.

Sport for Development can be defined as using the power of sport to build on the values of development, such as equity, inclusion and sustainability, promoting children's development, furthering social inclusion and cohesion, and contributing to health, education and economic development.





 "Just Play" is a partnership with Governments, regional bodies, schools, villages, churches, that provide a sport education (football) program for schools, teachers and coaches



#### What is the "Just Play" Grassroots Program

- "Just Play" is a unique opportunity for 6-13 year old children based around the use of a kit of equipment enabling kids to play football and other games anytime, anywhere
- The program provides new and increased physical activity opportunities for primary school aged children with "Just Play" as the catalyst
- Active and healthier children will acquired social and community friendly skills throughout the program
- "Just Play" will provide a sport education (football) program for schools, teachers and coaches

"Just Play" will increase participation and growth in local football, enhance the level of active children and capacity build coaches and teachers throughout the community





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#### **Project Objectives**

- ✓ Trained local MA personnel in delivering the "Just Play" grassroots program to schools and clubs
- School teacher sport education and training program that provides increased knowledge on fun (football) physical activity and healthy lifestyles for children
- Equipment and resources to schools and clubs for conducting the "Just Play" - Active & Healthy for Life - Oceania Kids Sport Program.
- Key support programs for local clubs to provide playing opportunities for school age children outside the "Just Play" activity in competitions and leagues
- Relationships between Clubs, Education

  Departments, Schools, Partners, FIFA and OFC







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#### Competitions and Leagues

- The introduction of the "Just Play" program and resources will facilitate the beginning of intraschool and inter-school competitions and leagues
- This intern will generate an interest and flow-on effect into club football for both boys and girls
- An increase in participation and club membership registration can be expected throughout the program
- Fun Football Come & Try Football days along with Friendship Youth Football Festival will be facilitated from the "Just Play" schools program







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#### **Targeted Objectives 2008 - 2011**

 Recruitment and Training of OFC Regional Training Instructors (4 + instructors)



 Recruitment and Training of MA Teacher Training Deliverers (TTD) in MAs (42 + deliverers)





 Teacher - Student activity and fun game sessions (250,000 + school children each week)



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#### Conclusion

- There are few opportunities for most Pacific Island children (boys and girls) aged between 6-13 years old to participate in age appropriate games and training sessions at local clubs and school
- This lack of opportunity and late introduction into football as a preferred sport
  has provided other sporting codes with early recruitment advantages and or the
  children not participating in sport until their late teens
- The introduction of the MA driven "Just Play" Community Grassroots Program will provide clubs, schools, villages and the MA's with a resource to organise early football activities in an age and ability appropriate environment that was not previously available



The ultimate goal of the program is to have "Football in Every Village"

OFC signed a Partnership Agreement with AusAID and Football Federation Australia for AUD4 million for 2009-2011 at the Pacific Leaders Forum – August 2010 to implement the OFC Just Play Programme in the Pacific Region





Pilot projects have commenced in Cook Islands, Fiji, Solomon Islands, Vanuatu and Tahiti



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#### Aims of LEARN&play

- Provide integrated secondary schooling and football education for disadvantaged kids in Solomon Islands
- Provide life skills education and mentoring to develop wholesome footballers who are good citizens of Solomon Islands
- Reemphasise the importance of sports in the national curriculum and develop highly skilled and disciplined footballers
- Enable students to expand their horizons and realise their dream through education
- 240 students were selected under the talent identification program for 2009 144 boys and 96 girls



#### What does LEARN&play do?

- ▶ Talent Identification:
  - Select students for scholarships based on special criteria:
    - Underprivileged kids who would not normally go to school
    - Have the talent and the passion for football
- Pilot Project Schools:
  - King George the Sixth Secondary School (Honiara)
  - Aligegeo Secondary School (Malaita)
  - Goldie College Secondary School (Western Province)
- Support Students:
  - School fees, Stationary, uniforms, travel, accommodation, meal
  - Coaching, football equipment, training
  - Mentoring and Role Models/Ambassadors
  - Renovation of facilities and dormitories
  - Government provides additional teachers to cater for Learn and Play Student

#### How does LEARN&play do it?

- Employment of Eleven (11) Staff:
- 1 project manager (Phillip Ohoto'ona), 1 Office Assistant, 3 regional
  - coordinators, 6 coaches
- Football Ambassador: Gideon Omokirio
- Visits students, motivational talks
- Steering Committee:
- Provides expert advice on the management of the project
- Visitations/Assessments:
- Strong assessment and visitation program
- Strong reporting setup internally
- Meetings with stakeholders
- Life skills program:
- Special focus on vegetable farming, gardening, teak planting, chicken farming etc.
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# LEARN&play: More than a scholarship

- LEARN&play also has infrastructure projects in the partner schools:
  - Aligegeo
    - 3 classrooms (already in use)
    - 1 girls dormitory (already completed)
  - Goldie College
    - 1 girls dormitory (just about complete)
    - 1 boys dormitory (work in progress)
    - Charity Match in 2010 raise funds for power generator
  - King George the Sixth
    - New girls dormitory project 2009 (awaiting approval from HCC Planning Board)

#### Conclusions

- Provides opportunities to 240 students who would not have had an opportunity to go to school
- Learn and Play Student are excelling academically as student want to be at school
- FIFA and OFC will continue to assist in infrastruture of the schools – Charity Match 2010 – Generator for Goldie College
- Talent identification will be conducted in 2010 student recruitment program - Total students in 2010 should be 360 - 216 boys & 144 girls (2009 -240students)



#### Academy of Teouma - Vanuatu

Identification of the 'best' players in Vanuatu

- -36 players selected for two years
- -Age: 15-17 years old
- -Recruitment of 4 young coaches
- -Training and accommodation at the Academy
- -Schooling in the Secondary schools of Port Vila or specific programmes for players who are no more going at school (7), linked with Ministry of Education.
- Agreement with Ministries of Education and Health

OFC to partner with Special Olympics Asia Pacific to support Special Olympic development across the pacific region through football.






