Colac – heading in the right direction

The Colac Basketball Association has been working with Basketball Victoria on their three year strategic plan which will have the association heading in the right direction for 2010 and beyond.

The Colac Basketball Association Committee attended a workshop on the 11th of November 2009 facilitated by Karen Pearce, Manager Strategic Operations, Basketball Victoria and Trevor Newcombe, Association Development Officer, Basketball Victoria. The key aim of the workshop was to identify and establish a strategic framework in line with Basketball Victoria's Strategic Plan 2009 – 2012 that will specifically assist the growth of basketball within the city of Colac and its surrounding areas, as well as assist with the key priorities and objectives of Basketball Victoria's Strategic Plan to maximise growth across all participatory areas in Victoria.

Completing the strategic plan has been a real priority for this committee. Colac has over 1000 players in the association and this equates to nearly 9% of the total population of the city, one of the highest ratios in the country. Creating the strategic plan to help guide the development of basketball in Colac is extremely important, particularly for their junior players, referees and coaches. The plan helps by identifying ways which can improve how the association is run and how they can minimise costs to participants.

After continuing consultation, the final Strategic Plan was delivered to the Colac Basketball Committee in mid December and was enthusiastically taken on board. The implementation of this strategic plan over the coming years will see Colac Basketball continue its proud tradition and build to a fantastic future.

2010 Funding

Basketball Victoria has again allocated some funds for local associations to access as part of its Association Development Grants, however to ensure that the funds are allocated in the best possible way, we have not yet decided on which format this allocation will take place.

New court markings

FIBA has advised that new court markings will take effect in international competition after the World Championships in 2010 and FIBA recommends that the new markings come into effect for National competitions after the Olympics in 2012.

There are three changes to court markings:

- Introduction of a rectangular shaped keyway;
- Extending the distance of the 3 point line to 6.75m (it is currently 6.25m);
- Introduction of a "no charge" semi-circle under the basket.

Given that the qualification for the 2012 Olympics will be played with the new court markings, the national leagues will introduce these changes in the 2010/11 seasons, so that players can prepare for the qualification series (to be played in 2011). Similarly, it is envisaged introducing the changes at national junior championships and Australian Club Championships in 2011.

However, it is also intended that the 6.25m 3-point line will be retained, for U14 Australian Club Championships and perhaps the U16 National Championships.
