All-conquering Palm Beach-Currumbin won their second premiership in three years and their fifth in 11 seasons with a hard-fought victory over Noosa in the Pineapple Hotel Cup grand final at Maroochydore.

The Lions took on Noosa at their own trademark take-no-prisoners style and won a fierce contest 14.15 (99) to 10.11 (71).

After three even quarters, PBC blew the game apart in the final term when key forwards Adrian Hill and James Drake emerged as match-clinchers. Hill kicked 4.2 for the match and Drake finished with 2.3 after an inaccurate start.



Noosa led 2.2 to 1.2 at quarter-time, PBC were ahead 6.7 to 5.4 at half-time, then were further ahead by 9.12 to 7.8 at the final break. Despite running to the southern end of the ground for the final term – which had been the main

scoring end all day – PBC were still far from over the line given their habit in recent years of running out of legs late. But the opposite happened and two Drake goals, and Hill's fourth for the game, sealed a wonderful win for the Gold Coast

side.

PBC coach Craig O'Brien, who now has two grand final medals to his name at

the Lions, knew his players were in for a physical start, so wisely placed some stronger bodies in for the first bounce. It worked a treat, especially with rover Mikal Bloom picking up five possessions in as many minutes in the opening stages when used up forward.

He went on to be a unanimous choice for the Ray Poulter Medal for best afield. It was a fitting triumph for 24-year-old Bloom, who missed the Duncanson/Todd Medal by a solitary vote despite missing six games late in the season with a broken thumb.

"Yes, I guess this is some compensation for missing that one (the medal) but, don't worry, I'd rather have this (premiership) medal around my neck," he said. Bloom, a product of the Murray Bush-rangers TAC Cup program and a Port Melbourne VFL player before joining PBC in

2007, said the grand final was predictably tough.

"It doesn't matter if you're playing them (Noosa) in Round 1 or a grand final, it's



always tough," he said.

Coach O'Brien agreed. "They were always going to put it to us," he said. "We've been the best side for three years. Every week is like a final to us. When you're on top they want to keep coming at you."

Noosa coach Wayne Fletcher acknowledged the Lions were the better side and agreed their spread of class players was a difference. "They were too slick for us around the stoppages," he said, giving special credit to the performance of Bloom. "He caused a lot of headaches with his pace and work around the stoppages. "But they used the ball far better than we did, their pressure was good and our skills struggled under that pressure."

out mishap. Having topped the home-and-away season ladder with a 17/1 win/loss record they lost the qualifying final to Noosa by 17 points. This put them into a sudden-death preliminary final against an in-form Surfers Paradise, who had done a wonderful job in getting to the penultimate game of the season, coming from fifth to put out Sandgate in the elimination final and Maroochy/North Shore in the first semi-final. Maroochy were the disappointments of the finals campaign, going out in straight sets to Surfers Paradise and then Noosa after finishing second at the end of the home-and-away season.

## WHAT 2010 HOLDS FOR YOUR CLUB

A NEW Pineapple Hotel Cup season kicks off on Saturday and, as usual, a fresh start brings with it high hopes at all 10 competing clubs.

Changes appear to be at a minimum across the board, with eight of the 2009 coaches returning for another tilt at premiership glory and player movement surprisingly subdued.

The two new coaches are Rob Martin at Surfers Paradise and club stalwart Grant McKenzie at Coolangatta.

The opening round on Saturday (all 2pm starts) is:

Burleigh v Coolangatta at Bill Godfrey Oval; Mayne v Maroochy-Northshore at Everton Park; Wilston-Grange v Surfers Paradise at Hickey Park; Sandgate v Noosa at Lemke Road Oval; Springwood v Palm Beach-Currumbin at Lowe Oval.

Here is a look at the comings and goings at the clubs.

### **PALM BEACH-CURRUMBIN:**



WHISPERS of a pending demise of the 2009 premiers appear to be well off target, listening to returning coach Craig O'Brien.

Heading into his fourth year with the Lions, and chasing a third flag in that time, O'Brien quashed rumours that PBC would be losing a significant number of their key players.

"We'll have a number of personnel who'll be late starters for a variety of seasons, but the backbone of the pre-

miership side is still here," said O'Brien. A significant loss is midfield dynamo Brent Rynehart, who has retired (for the time being). Also gone are Mark Moonney (retired), Tony Pieri (Victoria) and perhaps Zane Templeman (work).

But a big signing, says O'Brien, is midfielder Brad Horne, a best and fairest in the Ovens and Murray League and a former Port Melbourne VFL regular. Jack Munro has also moved over from neighbours Coolangatta to join brother Angus at the Lions.

Last year the Lions blooded several local juniors and O'Brien is hoping most of them will improve with experience. He mentioned Brent Pearson and big Jack Berry as two likely types. PBC start with two away matches – to Springwood and Noosa.

### NOOSA:



LAST season's runners-up, Noosa have plenty to live up to as coach Wayne Fletcher looks to continue his run at a flag after finishes of third (2008) and second (2009).

Noosa is a club touted as a possible inclusion in an expanded QAFL Division 1 competition in a year or so, so expectations of a strong 2010 are not misplaced.

Certainly a below-par 2010 would not be on the Tigers' radar, but they will do well to cover for a significant drain of class.

Gone from the 2009 side are Matt Hicks, reigning Duncanson-Todd Medalist Luke Tyrrell, Ryan Jeffrey, Brad Kearney, Nick Hammonds, Ben Evans, Sam McCosh, Scott Maddern and Jarrod Bates.

But it is not all doom and gloom up at the top end of the Sunny Coast.

The Tigers have pulled off a major off-season coup in luring champion midfielder Lucas Matthews back after he spent 2009 with Aspley in the QAFL Division 1.

He joins a host of new faces who include Nathan Spring (ex-Nambour and GCFC), Todd Panaho (Aspley), Brendan Paige (Peel Thunder), James Brain and Luke Brauer from Victorian country.

The turnover poses a test for Fletcher and his assistants.

"Obviously it presents a big challenge for us to be able to go as far as we did last year, but I'm more than happy with the way they've been training," said Fletcher.

"And obviously when get a large turnover it'll also take a few weeks to gel, but we're basically young and fit."

## **SURFERS PARADISE:**



IN his own words, new Surfers Paradise coach Rob Martin is on a hiding to nothing with a revamped Demons outfit this season.

Martin, a past reserves coach with Beenleigh who steered Beenleigh to a flag in last year's State Association second division, has taken over at Sir Bruce Small Park at a time when the club is undergoing massive change.

Of all the Pineapple Hotel Cup sides, Surfers have been the most savagely depleted with a host of regular seniors either gone or their futures uncertain. This list of departures includes luminaries such as Ben McEntee, Matt McCor-

mack, Brad Scalzo, Jon Stephens and Karl D'Orazio and the club is not sure what Travis Tamburro Scott Lindeblad, Nathan Sullivan and Toby Petrak are up to.

As well, Byron Blackwood and Michael Wise have returned to Southport, where Scalzo has also signed.

According to Martin, the only players of note signed by the Demons are former Labrador pair Troy Armstrong and Shane Burn.

"Yes, we have lost a lot," said Martin.

"But we're promoting youth and those who have been training have been working their backsides off.

"All I can do is go with what I've got."

It is hardly a secret the Demons do not have the finances to splash out on recruits, but you can bet that, at some stage of the season, the club will get several 'walk-ins', a regular occurrence as interstate players are drawn to the famous tourist name.

## **MAROOCHY-NORTHSHORE:**



MEMORIES of an incredible fade-out in the second semi-final last year should be the catalyst to spur the Roos on to better things this year.

The Roos surrendered a seven-goal lead in the fourth quarter to lose the final to Surfers Paradise, so coach Peter Somerville does not need to look far for motivational material.

But he has to plot his 2010 campaign without top pair Ben Weightman and

Paul Medvesky. Weightman has joined first division club Redland and Medvesky's plans are not known at Maroochy.

Tye Morrison (ex-Mayne and Mt Gravatt) is a new recruit, along with Ben King (brother of current player Dan) and Simon Coates, both from Victoria.

It is an interesting time on the Sunshine Coast for both Maroochy and Noosa regarding what lies ahead in terms of a team from the area playing in the state league first division.

Somerville insists 'it has to happen', but in what form is the tricky question.

"Everyone has an opinion on this but the bottom line is whether it is financially viable and whether it be a stand-alone club or a merged one.

"But it has to happen because we're losing too many young players to the Brisbane clubs."

Yet it is the new season that holds Somerville's attention. He has to be hell bent on overturning the Roos' end-of-2010 misery after a season when, most of the time, they looked the team to beat for the flag, yet didn't make it to the big decider.

### SANDGATE:

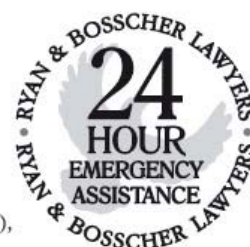

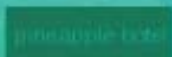
