



2009 Champion Basketball School of Qld Wrap Up

Congratulations to all teams who participated in the 2009 Champion Basketball School of Queensland Tournament. This year we saw a record number of 82 teams representing 56 schools compete in the tournament, which was held at Insports Cornubia Park, Beenleigh Arena, Logan Metro Indoor Sports Centre and Sleeman Sports Complex from Thursday the 17th to Sunday the 20th of September.

Many great games were put on show, with some games (including medal playoffs), being pushed into over time. The tournament culminated with extremely close gold medal games in the Women's and Men's Championship Division with the winners being decided in the last minute of play. A special congratulations must go to our State Champions; Brisbane State High School in the Men's Championship Division, who successfully defended their 2008 title, and John Paul College in the Women's Championship Division. These teams will now go on to represent Queensland in Championship Division at the National Schools Basketball Tournament in Newcastle from the 7th to the 11th of December. Congratulations also to our Second Division Winners; Runcorn State High School in the Men's competition and Palm Beach Currumbin High in the Women's competition; and our Third Division Winners Palm Beach Currumbin High 2 in the Men's competition and All Saints Anglican School in the Women's Competition.

2009 CBSQ Grand Final Reviews

From Thursday the 17th to Sunday the 20th of September, the Champion Basketball School of Qld Tournament was held at Insports - Cornubia Park Sports Centre, Shailer Park, Beenleigh Arena, Beenleigh, Logan Metro Indoor Sports Centre, Crestmead and Sleeman Sports Complex, Chandler. After many closely fought out round games and challenging cross over pool or quarter and semi finals games, the Championships culminated with some exciting finals games on the last day of action.

Women's Third Division Final – All Saints Anglican 49 def Varsity College Vipers 34

Top Scorers – All Saints (Grace Varcoe 23, Hayley Thomson 12, Varsity College (Anna Merlano 13, Tegan Eastburn 12)

At the Sleeman Sports Complex the Third Division Women's got the finals underway with a matchup between the two undefeated teams after the Second/Third Division competition split, All Saints Anglican School and Varsity College Vipers. With both teams coming from Pool FF in Third Division and All Saints experiencing larger winning margins against the same opposition they went into the game as favourites. Both teams started the game strongly but it was Varsity who had a narrow lead 14-12 at quarter time. In the second quarter All Saints took control of the game with Grace Varcoe continuing to dominate scoring 8 of All Saints 16 points in the second quarter, following on from her first quarter total of 10 points. Varsity struggled to keep their momentum up from the first quarter scoring only 5 points in the second with 3 of these points coming from free throws. At the half time break All Saints led 28-19. After regrouping at half time Varsity, who were led strongly by their captain Anna Merlano, were back on track in the 3rd quarter and kept up with All Saints to close the margin to 7 going into the last. With Varsity on the comeback All Saints again put their foot down in the last quarter and in the end proved too strong to take the win by 15 points 49-34 with solid performances from Hayley Thomson and Grace Varcoe.

In the Men's Third Division Final it was a matchup between two original Pool E teams Palm Beach Currumbin High 2 and Southern Cross Catholic College. In their Day 1 game it was Palm Beach Currumbin who took the win with a narrow margin of 60-57. With both teams being undefeated in their Third Division games another close game was to be expected and the teams lived up to the prediction. Both teams were focused at the start of the game and opened strongly with 3 pointers to Mitch Bemet for Palm Beach Currumbin and Thomas Klich for Southern Cross. The first quarter continued to be evenly balanced with Southern Cross leading by 1 point (15-14) going into the first break. In the second quarter neither team showed any signs of weakening and courtesy of two three pointers Palm Beach Currumbin took the lead (31-29) at half time. Continuing on from the second quarter Palm Beach Currumbin made the most of their 3 point shot opportunities and it was Michael Katipa who capitalised landing 3 three pointers for the quarter to extend his team's lead to 7 with a quarter left to play. With memories of their first round loss coming back Southern Cross were out to show that the game was anything but over in the last quarter and fought back strongly, but in the end Palm Beach were able to hang on to win 61-59.

Women's Second Division Final – PBC High 55 def Moreton Bay College 29

The Second Division Women's got the Grand Finals underway at Insports Cornubia Park with a matchup between the two undefeated teams of the tournament, Moreton Bay College and Palm Beach Currumbin High. Early on it was a low scoring affair with both teams perhaps experiencing finals' nerves. With just 3 minutes to go before half-time, PBC led 17-9 with their Captain Jessica Lydiard working hard inside and Donna Catley driving and creating opportunities for her team. Moreton Bay struggled to convert at the offensive end against an active Palm Beach Currumbin zone, but some trips to the free throw line helped them stay in the game at half time, down by 9, 15-24. At the start of the third quarter Palm Beach Currumbin quickly extended their lead to 13, but despite regrouping after a time-out, Moreton Bay struggled to find scoring options. Halfway through the third quarter the lead was 18 with game MVP Palm Beach Currumbin Donna Catley coming up with 5 quick points off successive steals. For Moreton Bay, Laura Brassey and Harriet Ayre worked hard inside to keep them in the game but they went to $\frac{3}{4}$ time down by 14. The final quarter was all Palm Beach Currumbin with Rebecca Whitehead coming up with big plays at both ends of the court to extend the lead to 20 with 2 minutes to play. In the end, Palm Beach Currumbin was just too strong, running out winners 55 to 29.

Albany Creek SHS knew a tough task was ahead of them with Runcorn SHS being clear favourites for the Men's Second Division title after winning all bar one of their games by 30+ margins. Whilst Albany Creek put in a good effort early starting the game with 2 three pointers it was evident that Runcorn meant business leading 14-8 at the end of the first quarter. Led by Captain Jonathon Mines, Runcorn continued their dominance in the second quarter with Mines scoring 12 of Runcorn's 18 points for the quarter to extend their lead to 32-18 at half time. The second half followed a similar pattern to the first with the well oiled Runcorn showing why they dominated the Second Division competition with a great team performance with all except one player who entered the court scoring points. Runcorn were the eventual winners 66-33.

Brisbane SHS had defeated John Paul College 61-50 in their round game and were perhaps entitled to favouritism going into the Women's Championship Division final; however, after both teams had struggled more than expected in their semi-finals, neither coach would have been feeling too confident. The first quarter reflected the close nature of the game with the quarter-time score showing John Paul College with a 3 point lead in a low scoring game, 12 to 9. Injuries to Brisbane SHS made their job that much harder in the first and second quarter and to their credit it was all tied up at half-time, 20 all.

The third quarter continued to be a struggle for both teams at the offensive end, but the end of the quarter saw John Paul College take a 6 point lead into the final quarter. After the first 3 minutes of the last quarter, John Paul College's lead was still 4 with good defence from both teams causing a number of shot-clock violations. Much of the John Paul College offence came off the hand of Mikhaela Donnelly whose penetration and pass was creating good options for her team-mates. For Brisbane SHS, Rachael Arthur and Danielle Sturgess were strong and they helped close the margin to 1 with 2 minutes to play. After a John Paul College turnover with 1:39 to play, Brisbane SHS took the lead for the first time 42-41. After taking the lead Brisbane SHS were unable to score again and 5 from 6 from the free-throw line by Mikhaela Donnelly in the last minute of the game help her seal a John Paul College win and the game MVP award.

After some exciting closely fought out semi finals on Saturday evening the same was expected for the Men's Championship Division gold medal game and Brisbane SHS and John Paul College did not disappoint. For the first 3 minutes of this final, no-one could find a basket and the quarter-time score, 8 all, gave no indication of the drama that would follow. The second quarter began with both teams again struggling to get a clear shot inside with smothering defence at both ends of the floor. It was John Paul College who broke the deadlock with a Jim Wallis 3 point shot. This was followed by a couple of Brisbane SHS turnovers resulting in a tip-in and then an open lay-up by John Paul College. Another 3 and a steal meant all the momentum was with John Paul College who went on a 16 to 0 run. Brisbane SHS were unable to score more than 3 points in the quarter while John Paul College had 19. At half-time it looked to be all John Paul College and they led 27 – 11 with the crowd wondering if Brisbane SHS could get back into the game.

Both teams traded baskets to begin the second half before Brisbane SHS went on a mini-run of their own to narrow the margin to 7, forcing John Paul College Coach Henderson to call a Time-out with 3:25 remaining in the quarter. John Paul College's Josh Ogunmokun remained an inside presence, picking up handy offensive boards to steady John Paul College as they struggled to score against the Brisbane SHS zone. Nevertheless, Brisbane SHS won the quarter 19-9 and had got themselves back into it with the crowd now thinking it was anyone's game with JPC up 36 to 30 at $\frac{3}{4}$ time.



The fourth quarter began basket for basket. For John Paul College it was their rebounding which gave them second opportunities and kept them in the lead. For Brisbane SHS Thomas Laycock, Andy Chen and Josef Horomia were working hard to create scoring opportunities but with 2 minutes remaining John Paul College led by 7 and Brisbane SHS must have been wondering what they had to do to get the ball to drop.

Brisbane SHS's Alphonso Horomia narrowed the margin to 5 with 1:23 to play. He then followed up with another basket to reduce the margin to 3 with 46 seconds to play and both teams in the bonus. When John Paul College hit 1 of 2 from the line and Brisbane SHS got a field goal, the margin was 2 points. With 24.8 on the clock Brisbane SHS were in possession and coach Salfi wanted the time-out. A foul off the ball sent BSHS to the line with Chen hitting both to tie it up with 23 seconds still to play. A steal by BSHS's Cade Towers followed by a JPC foul on Chen sent him to the line.

JPC had the time-out and Chen then hit 1 of 2 with JPC getting the last possession. They were unable to get a good shot away and in a loose ball scramble the foul by JPC sent BSHS to the line, up by 1 with less than a second to play. Both shots missed but it didn't matter. BSHS had staged a remarkable comeback to win 46 to 45 in a thriller.
